PLANETS, STARS, AND SPACE, by CHAMBERLAIN, JOSEPH M. & NEUBIGER, THOMAS D. An illustrated, non-technical explanation of the earth, planets, stars, and the universe. Prepared in cooperation with the American Museum of Natural History.

JUNIOR SCIENCE BOOK OF STARS, by CROSBY, FRODO, an easy-to-read, exciting story of what scientists know about the stars, planets, the moon, and the Milky Way.

CHALLENGE OF THE UNIVERSE, by STRIKE, J. ALLEN & ANDERSON, NORMAN. Discusses the nature of the universe, astronomy, and cosmology, published by Macmillan in 1960.

THE STORY OF THE STARS, by MALONEY, TERRY. An introduction to the universe; our solar system, our galaxy, and other galaxies. Many interesting illustrated examples help build concepts of size and distance. Includes references to the Van Allen radiation belts and rocket light observations of 1960.

THE WORLD OF FLUNG ROCKETS, by MEDGILL, DONALD H. & ROY, LYLE G. A scientific examination of the cosmic UFO reports.

THE MOON, METEORITES, AND COMETS DRIVING, by MECKLENBURG & KUPPER. Contains analysis of recent moon photos, a chapter on a Martian network and photos of comets and compilation of various comet orbits.

THE NATURE OF LIGHT AND COLDER IN THE OPEN AIR, by WERNER, ROSE. Publication. This is an excellent paperback written in understandable lay language.
