

April 22, 1966 -- between 20 and 25 August 1962, 2230 hours,
Waco, South Dakota.

An air force officer was briefed "flying discs" four miles away over the
Waco City air force base in a tight diamond formation at 2500 to
10,000 feet descending by 1000 feet at 100-200. Objects made a curved
loop turn and altitude at 50° to 60° descending. Objects were very
maneuverable, remaining equally spaced in all maneuvers. Each object
was 200 feet in length, oval-shaped and brilliant, yellow-white, so
small per altitude trail were hard to see.

REMARKS: This reporter should be a reliable observer. How-
ever, it has been stated that distance cannot be estimated without prior
knowledge of the size of an object. If distance is not known, speed
cannot be estimated. More reliable perhaps is that such minute detail
could be remembered in a report made one year after the observation
and yet the data was not remembered. Mr. Spack suggested the possibil-
ity of detection aerial streams.

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
