4. A recent report from the U. S. Military Air Attache, Moscow, dated 9 June 1947, indicates that 1,000 aircraft, already or indistinctly based on the Horton VIII design (six engine bomber, having a wing spread of 175 feet and a gross weight of approximately thirty-three thousand pounds) are being built for bomber squadron use. The Russian version, however, is jet propelled, reference report shows identification No. is Y-30000-8.
