I. Description of Incident

AN OOLD EBT an AF captain and his wife observed some type of light they could not identify. Their attention was called to the object by its loud noise, described as similar to a flight of "six or more jets at low altitude". The light was white or pale blue and passed slightly to the east of the observer's zenith on a southerly heading. No wing tip lights were noted. After about seven or eight seconds the light made a left turn then started a steep climb. The light went out shortly after the climb was started.

II. Discussion of Incident

No follow-up was made on this incident, however, the description could well be that of an F-4, aircraft with its afterburner on and flying "blacked out".

III. Conclusion

Possibly aircraft.
