and address of the individual making the sighting so that a questionnaire could be sent. 6) The visibility of the scene; were there other observers? 7) Local air traffic. 8) A check with blue weather service to determine if weather balloons or any other phenomenon known to them could cause the sighting. 9) Weather conditions, including cloud coverage, light conditions, temperature or dew point inversions.

Most of the above points are contained in the requirements for a TOC as per MEL 200-5 which was not followed in this instance.

A good feature of the report is the fact that wind staff was down. The most essential item left out, however, and that is the length of observation. If this was a matter of seconds, the sighting was probably a bright return.
