In view of the unresponsive nature of the contacts with LAM-412, it was decided to have Rupture Inquiry immediately contact serial subject developments in New Orleans. On 9 August 1961, the situation was discussed with Mr. Galt, Det of the 17th Air Division (AirBase AF), Fort Worth, Texas. The subject had been advised in previous copies of their reports on serial subject "unknowns". Since then, no reports have been received by the New Orleans Research Division. Galt was advised that reports on status serial "unknowns" were still needed by the 17th Air Division, at a rate of once or twice a month, but little emphasis was being given to this matter. One of the reports requested from "unknown" at New Orleans, the 17th Air Division reviewed. (A document covering serial "unknowns" is attached.) It was learned that the 17th Air Division (New Orleans) was also very interested in whatever evidence on serial subject "unknowns".

On 17 August 1961, developments regarding serial "unknowns" were discussed at Bollinger AFB. Lt. John Albert "Burrhead" Galt met with the subject and was transferred from Bollinger. Thereafter, the subject was discussed with Major Charles S. Galt, who had assumed responsibility. Major Galt, who seemed to be thoroughly acquainted with the situation, advised that there have been very few reports of

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
