SUMMARY: (1) On 12 June 1952, A/1 William Healy was talking with a local (2) Signal Corps, South Dakota and as he entered the building opposite Signal Corps he noticed two (3) objects looking and pointing to the southeast. A/1 Healy turned his head to see what they were looking at, seeing five (5) or more objects in the sky. He did not recognize them as airplanes but long and thin, silver colored objects appearing across the sky. The objects were in a sort of line formation with a leader in front. The formation was next to appearance, no sound or exhaust was visible. The objects were traveling at a high rate of speed. A/1 Healy stated that he lost the objects in view for about 10 to 20 seconds they disappeared again. The sky was partly cloudy, approximately four to five tenths broken. A/1 Healy was unable to determine the altitude of the flying objects, other than the remark "they were rather high". The objects were traveling in a southerly direction; elevation from the observer to the objects was approximately fifty (50) degrees. Approximately at the same time, small objects aircraft were noticed at a lower altitude, north and east of the city. After the objects disappeared he wondered the two civilians remark that the objects were possibly "flying saucers". A/1 Healy did not discuss the incident with the two civilians.			
A/1 Healy is a native and native person, who has nine (9) years military service, with six (6) years in the Air Force. His supervisor states that A/1 Healy is reliable, serious, dependable and highly trustworthy person. A/1 Healy stated that he can recognize practically all types of USAF aircraft. He admitted that he was at first reluctant to talk about the incident because he thought people would call him crazy. He is confident in stating that they were not conventional aircraft, aircraft present duty assignment is chief telephone operator at Base Communications Center.			
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
