SUBJECT: "Flying Saucer" Sighted at Port Ancon, PMA		

As of possible interest, the Deane press now carries a story to the effect that on June 25, 1952, the Personnel of a merchant vessel anchored at Port Ancon, French Guiana, reported sighting a large "saucer" (sailing) coming from the direction of the land. After about a couple of days, proceeding toward the shore at a very rapid speed. This phenomenon was supposed to have occurred at 8:00 a.m. This incident object, was described as the flight only as, approximately, of an orange color and very bright. The object appeared to be about in diameter the different from any celestial phenomenon such as a flying saucer or object of any kind, because of conventional type that is known. The object was seen at 8:00 a.m. at Port Ancon. It was said no noise could be heard and estimated the object's altitude as about 3000 or 4000 meters. Its diameter appeared about the size of a planet.

The press account states that on the 26th in a matter of airplanes was scheduled to arrive at Port Ancon.
