## UNCLASSIFIED

1. The initial observation and identification of an object was made at a high altitude and no direction or speed was given. The only physical observation of the object was that the color was purple.

2. The report of the object was received at 1700 hours PST, 2 June 1954.

3. The object was observed from the ground by an individual without optical or electronic aid.

4. The observation was reported at Bayview, Washington (Latitude 48° - 41' N, Longitude 123° - 45' W).

5. This information was reported by Mr. Larry Kohde of Bayview, Washington, to the Chief of Police, Frank Dick, of Raymond, Washington. The Chief of Police relayed this information to the Controller of this station. The degree of reliability of observation is unknown.

6. Teletype sequence at time of the observation is attached as an enclosure.

7. No activity or conditions, meteorological or otherwise was witnessed which might account for the sighting.

8. No physical evidence of the sighting was observed.

9. No intercept or identification action was taken.

10. Local aircraft were airborne at time of sighting.
