

<p>One object was observed from the ground at 1845 on 5 June 1952 by 1st Lt. T.S. Storey of 4802nd Test Group (Atomic), Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico at his home, at 301 South Cedar Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. This address is approximately in the center of the city. The object was round in shape, but of indeterminate size. It had a very sharp luster but neither light noise nor left a trail. Its speed was described by the observer as approximately five or six times that of the P-51. It was first sighted at an angle of 90° to the observer on the north course which involved no apparent maneuvers or change of altitude. The object was observed for approximately six seconds in which time it covered the remaining distance across the horizon. The object crossed above a P-51 or P-52 which was flying on an easterly course at approximately 20,000 feet. It was believed by the observer that the object was at a much greater altitude than the bomber. There were no clouds with 40-mile visibility and easterly winds aloft of 20 MPH. 1st Lt. Storey's duty in the 4802nd Test Group (Atomic) is in the engineering field. His observations from the ground viewpoint should be credited as fairly reliable. He has had experience in judging altitudes and speeds by observing P-51's in flight with knowledge of their speed and altitude.</p>
