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Unidentified object cannot be determined as to its size, shape, color, etc. Time of sighting 1310 hours (MST), 7 June 68 for a uncertain length of time. (P-6).

The manner of observation was visual from aircraft without assistance of optical or electronic equipment. Location of source at time of observation, 25 miles east of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Unidentified object's altitude at time of sighting was estimated at approximately 11,000 feet upon crossing the flight path of the B-29. Altitude of aircraft at time of object coming into view was 13,000 feet with obj at estimated 350 to 500 feet from subject B-29. See 13, 0001315 of enroute. (u)

We another phenomena to account for the sighting. Sky-clear, visibility-10 miles, average temperature-77, Wind-SE-10. No existing physical evidence or photographs available. Interception and/or identification action then begun.
