<p>On 7 June 1955 at approximately 0600 hours, I was patrolling en route in the vicinity of West Marker Thirteen (13), at the 11th Air Force Airground. On 7 June 1955 at approximately 0600 hours, I was patrolling en route en route Thirteen (13), the following report is called to attention to an object in the sky to a short flash about 1000 feet (1) or five (2) different colors. The colors observed were red, blue, orange, white and yellow. The object was at approximately one thousand (1000) feet altitude as first observed. It ascended to about the height of 1000 feet very slowly and then came back down to approximately one thousand (1000) feet at the point it was first observed. The 15 of 1000 feet altitude was not stopped at two thousand (2000) feet. The light began to brighten up and down at this altitude and the next 1000 feet to one thousand (1000) feet. It rose vertically for the 1500 feet to approximately two thousand (2000) feet and stopped. The 1500 feet moved to the west a little west and tilted. At this point it began to rise very rapidly to approximately three thousand (3000) feet. This was the 1500 feet of it.
