This report is forwarded in compliance with AFM 100-3 dated 20 April 1952.

- Two glider-like objects, dark blue with grey centers, appearing in formation in diameter, at estimated 6000 feet, were observed in heavy smoke without visible trail or sound. Objects passed in trail from Southwest to Northeast at estimated 300 miles per hour. Number two assumed dead after seeing number one to left before disappearing.
- Date and time of sighting: 0644 GMT (1144Z) 13 June 1952. Sighting lasted for 30 to 45 seconds.
- Observation was visual from surface.
- Observation was made from out-of-doors in North-west (Ohio) - airport miles west of O'Hare International Airport. Objects were overhead and passed from Southwest to Northeast just in or below broken clouds at 6000 feet.
- Observer, Mr. Bernard Campese, 912 North Wayne, Chicago, Illinois delayed his report until newspaper article on "Flying saucers" prompted him to telephone. His description of weather tallied exactly with newspaper report for period of sighting. He appeared to have had experience in judging altitudes and speeds of aircraft.
- Weather at time of sighting: Partly cloudy at 6000 feet, broken ceiling at 10000 feet, overcast at 20000 feet with visibility 15 miles. The wind aloft were: 0 140/20, 30 240/12, 10 240/20 15 240/20, 30 240/20, 50 240/20.
- There is no haze condition or activity which would account for the sighting.
- No photographs were known to have been taken.
- No interception action was taken.
- Air traffic is unknown.
