1. This report pertains to the observation of an unusual
aerial object by one (1) person near the Harris Great Road in Fox
Hill, Virginia. The time of sighting was 10:00 PM on 18 June 1960.

2. On 18 June 1962 at 1130 hours Major JOHN S. SMITH, Air
Force Sergeant, Langley Air Force Base, Virginia, telephonically
advised this office that a local resident, FRANK W. WILSON, had
telephoned him who reported seeing an unusual aerial object, reported
to appear in the Fox Hill, Virginia, area, a distance of approximately
two (2) miles from Langley Air Force Base, Virginia.

3. On 18 June 1962 at 1000 hours, Major W. W. WILSON was
interviewed and gave the following information concerning
the incident: WILSON, a salesman for a local sewing company, first
observed this unusual object while driving his car along Harris Great
Road, a sparsely populated section of Fox Hill, Virginia. He
estimated it was about a mile in the road, he saw the object hovering in the
air at an altitude of approximately 200 feet over a group of pine trees
approximately 400 to 500 feet east of the road.
