8. WOLANDELL had been looking for a prospective customer in the Fox Hill area at the time of the sighting. WOLANDELL does not wear glasses and stated that he had not partaken of any intoxicants prior to the sighting.

9. WOLANDELL was a little vague when reporting certain details concerning the sighting, however, in general, he seemed to be intelligent and a level-headed person.

10. On 18 June 1952 three (3) residents of the Harris Creek Road area in the vicinity of the sighting, were interviewed and advised that they had observed no unusual aerial phenomenon and could not recall observing any unusual aircraft in that vicinity on the date of reported sighting. 11. This information was coordinated with the Office of Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Collection Division, Tactical Air Command, Langley Air Force Base, Virginia, on 18 June 1952.

12. Enquiry at the Langley AFB HQ Unit on 18 June 1952 failed to reveal the presence of any unidentified aircraft in the area for the period of 1000 to 1800 hours on 18 June 1952.

13. On 18 June 1952 Capt S H JACKSON, 442nd Helicopter Flight, Langley AFB, Va., advised that at approximately 1000 hours on 18 June 1952, he was returning to Langley AFB piloting an OH-19 type helicopter. His flight path to the base was on a line from Pineson, Virginia, to Langley AFB and he stated that this route took him directly over the Fox Hill area at an altitude of approximately 300 feet.
