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The following is a report submitted to the U.S. Office of Air Defense Central Station, 27th Air Division (Inf), on 14 June 1953:

Unconventional aircraft report.
 Reported to authorities with 200, 200-1, 200-2.

1. The shape of this aircraft was abnormal. Yellow in color and was emitting a yellow exhaust from the tail. The object descended from a great height, leveled off at about 2000 feet and descended to the North North West at a tremendous rate of speed.
2. Time of sighting was 2000 hrs.
3. Nature of observation. Visual and the observer on the ground.
4. Location of observer. 127-20 Road, 20-40 North.
5. Object visible altitude. From ground height to 2000 feet. Level 10 to 15 miles to North North West from observer.
6. U.S. Navy, Navy command base, Santa Rosa, California. Former pilot of the Navy.
7. Captain assumed for an object at 1000 ft. altitude. 1000 ft. 1000 ft. 1000 ft.
8. A number of objects was observed to the north of the station in the vicinity of the sighting.

11. There were several small aircraft observed at 1000 ft. altitude.
