Unidentified circular flying object, sighted at 32 29N - 93 45W, 2228 hours, 16 April 1952, by Captain Mathis. Object brilliant white in color, emitted no trail, exhaust, or sound and flew at phenomenal speed. Object executed 180 degree turn and disappeared from sight having covered an estimated distance of approximately 25 miles during the approximately 70 seconds of observation.
