A group of unidentified aerial objects was sighted at 2000 hours MST on 16 Jun 52 about 1 mile south of Walker AFB, Roswell, New Mexico. The objects were of a grayish hue in color and their WACHTUNG (WARNING) lights were blue. The terrain was about 1,000 feet. The objects traveled in a half wave formation in a general Southwest to Northeast line from a point about a mile south of Walker AFB until they disappeared from sight several miles north of the base. The rate of speed was estimated to be between 500 and 600 miles per hour.

This sighting is similar to those reported in the press and other publications. Although the objects were viewed for only a short period of time, the reliability to the observer is felt to warrant the probability of the sighting.
