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STATEMENT

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On 16 June 1950, at 2030 hours, I started from the messroom, 590 to the latrine, 7088. About 10 minutes between the two buildings, I noticed a moving object in the southeast which I thought was the shadow of a b-29 at 3000 coming in to land. I stopped to watch the object and as it drew closer, I could see that it was not a conventional aircraft. There was no engine sound whatsoever. After recognizing or not.

As the objects passed overhead, traveling in a northerly direction, I could hear two engines five (5) and seven (7) round objects. They were in a half-moon formation. Color & size could not be seen. They were in a line with a size of a disc with an area 1-2 ft. across (approximate) 500 to 600 ft. distant approximately 3000'.

As the last overhead, the object on the right side, broke formation and veered off to the right at approximately 30 degrees.

The weather that night was fairly calm and very clear. There was no engine sound on the right line at this time.

I sat these objects were observed was approximately 30 seconds.
