A group of unidentified aerial objects was sighted at 2050 hours MST on 14 Jun 52 about 1 mile south of Walker AFB, Roswell, New Mexico. The objects were of a grayish hue in color and their estimated altitude above the terrain was about 5,000 feet. These objects traveled in a half moon formation in a general southe-wet to Northwest line from a point about a mile south of Walker AFB until they disappeared from sight several miles north of the base. The rate of speed was estimated to be between 300 and 400 miles per hour.

This sighting is similar to those reported in the press and other publications. Although the objects were viewed for only a short period of time, the reliability to the observer is felt to warrant the probability of the sighting.
