UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT  
JUNE 15, 1962~~Droner-brown sightings~~

Introduction: This incident and the related observations involve two persons, three objects, and three points of sighting. Chester Brown reported 1) a sighting made by a colleague in the Spokane police department from the City Hall (chart ref. No.1), and 2) his own sighting made from a hill in south Spokane (chart ref. No.2). George Draner saw the same object from his home in the extreme south of Spokane (chart ref. No.3), and it was his call to his friend, Chester Brown that led to the above mentioned two sightings. The collaboration between the two persons and the fact that the balloon-like object was visible for a long period of time offers reasonable certainty that the two reports concern the same object insofar as the "balloon" is concerned. Draner's report raises the possibility of two additional objects.

Narrative: (The following narrative was special hearing on this report.) George Draner's attention was drawn to the sky by what he thought was a weather balloon, at what he believed was 0940 PDT. The balloon was to the Northwest and at first observation was so small that he was not sure of its identity. He assumed binoculars and satisfied himself that the object was a balloon. However, upon closer examination of the balloon
