STATEMENT OF STAFF SERGEANT MAJOR MARK CONROD CONCERNING FLUKE WESSELL.			
<p>An approximately 2200 LT MAJ. KINGS and I was returning from the washfield going back to work at 781-212 Operations. We were traveling in a jeep on the road going around the west end of the runway when we spotted a strange light about four (4) feet in diameter. We first spotted it at about 8,000 feet in the air coming downward at a terrific rate of speed. There was also smoke and a flame of fire attached to it while it was coming down. It got down to approximately a 1000 feet from the deck and went westward until almost out of sight at a terrific rate of speed, it then made a 180 degree turn and came off the (2) big flashes of light, the flashes were about a mile apart and on the second flash it disappeared and that was the last we saw of it.</p> <p>Bernard KINGS and I stopped the jeep we were in when we first saw it and also turned off the engine to see if we could hear any sound, but we were unable to hear any sound or distinguish if it was an aircraft.</p>
