On June 22, 1960, at 1230 hours, while flying in a B-49 at 8000 feet over Kelly Air Force Base, Texas, on a heading of 107 degrees and at an indicated air speed of 190 miles per hour, I observed from my Flight Engineer's window what appeared to me for about one second, an object 600 feet off our right hand wing, moving in a vertical path from above us toward the earth. The main body was of a dark blue color, glowing like a welding flame, and was surrounded by a white flame glow, having an outer glow of orange flame. It was about three feet in diameter and about three and a half feet long. About three feet from its main body, I noticed a trail of sparks and streaks of light. These lights were of the same yellow, blue, white, and orange, and formed a trail about 2 1/2 feet short in length. The object had an arrow shaped nose and an oval shaped trailing edge with all opening in the center that appeared as a black space in the structure. It was somewhat flattened, and was made of an undetectable material, for it did not seem to be retrievable. It was travelling at a speed similar to that of a 22 calibre bullet fired from a low-cost single shot rifle. I didn't hear any sound coming from the object. The weather at the time was clear above us, and a thin layer of cumulus clouds below us at 8000 feet, with a coverage of about 8/10. There was no other aircraft around the area at the time.
