<p>Information required by paragraph 7c, AFM 200-5, dated 29 April 1952 is listed as follows:</p> <p>(1) One dark thin cigar shaped object, approximately 100 feet long and 10 to 15 feet wide. No wings, tail or exhaust was observed. Method of propulsion unknown. Object emitted a high pitched whistle. Object varied altitude in a definite high speed pattern always keeping the same distance below the various cloud levels. Estimated speed five miles per second.</p> <p>(2) 2005 hours 22 June 1952. Time observed approximately five seconds.</p> <p>(3) Visual observation.</p> <p>(4) Number 4 Millers Cirrus, Millers, California. (37° 36' N 122° 30' W) 100 feet above sea level. Object sighted proceeding from the Northwest to the Southwest. Had bank to San Jose or Hunter's Point to over Bay Meadows, California. Distance covered from time first observed until disappearance was approximately 25 miles in approximately five seconds.</p> <p>(5) Reported by: Mr. Harry Sutton Jr. 4 Millers Cirrus Millers, California who has been flying since 1932. (P-4).</p> <p>(6) 2000 hours 22 June 1952 ceiling: 1700 feet - scattered clouds 2700 feet - broken clouds 12000 feet - overcast visibility: 20 miles wind: calm Source: Hamilton AFB Weather Station.</p> <p>(7) None known.</p> <p>(8) None.</p> <p>(9) One (1) routine flight P-49 took off from Hamilton Air Force Base at 1902 hours 22 June 1952 to 37° 42' N 122° E to 38° 15' N 121° 54' W to Hamilton Air Force Base. Landing time 2041 hours 22 June 1952. Visual observation negative. Radar contact negative.</p> <p>(10) None other than number 9. This does not preclude the presence of pilot or other military airplanes aircraft in subject vicinity.</p>
