<p>1. With no estimation of size, the estimate of speed and altitude is considered to be inaccurate. The cloud layer into which the object disappeared was probably the 7/10 layer, which would indicate the most probable altitude as between 8000 and 9000 feet. This would, in turn lower the estimated speed to a reasonable figure for normal aircraft types.</p> <p>2. Although no aircraft were reported in this area by Komaki Base, Air Defense alert aircraft such as the F-4's on Tactical alertness, which although controlled by TMOG, could be in the area without the knowledge of personnel at Komaki Air Base.</p>
