

<p>1. The subject of "flying saucers" made the headlines in France for the first time when a bright unidentified object was observed in the Paris sky at high noon on 18 June 1952.</p> <p>2. Enclosed is a newspaper clipping from the 18 June edition of "France Soir". It describes the Paris sighting and three other recent sightings in France not in the Paris area.</p> <p>3. The Paris sighting was made simultaneously by the pilot of an aircraft flying near the Le Bourget airport and another individual in the City of Paris. Both described the object as a "ball of fire".</p>
