4. Description observed to be six or eight large or four red stars, three or four yellow stars, and one like a small white star. Spurred in shape, observed to be the same as the stars observed from earth. A band was noted. Bright line in star, 2 degrees and made no star at all in turn on the side. Red line at the one object streaked area and black streak from the side.
