In reference to a recent article in Life Magazine, citizens are requested to report their sightings of non-celestial bodies in the sky. Last evening, April 16, at three o'clock past 10:30 P. M. my boys, ages 11 and 12, and the neighbor boy, age 10, had just settled themselves for the night on their cot in our back yard, when they began to scream "Mother! Come quick! Here comes one of the 'fireballs' described in Life Magazine."

When my wife had become accustomed to the darkness I saw it approaching from the West. It was the same size and the same color of the planet which was shining in the Western sky. It came slowly and when it was close with us it turned at a sharp angle to the left and continued towards the South. I ran shivering back to bed, but they called again before I could get in bed, saying "Here comes another one". This one was smaller and looked like a small white star instead of the red planet. It followed the identical route that the first one had followed. Ten minutes later they called me again. It was the red ball planet-type this time and it came high overhead, proceeding West until it nearly reached the horizon and then turned abruptly to the left and followed a Southward exit. Then I went to bed. The children are right in all. One of the red ones, they believe, circled the whole circumference of the heavens and disappeared in the East as all the others had done.
