DETAILS (Cont'd)

Mr. NORRIS might relate. Mr. WOOD advised that he had known Mr. SHULER all his life and that he believed SHULER was of good character and trustworthy, however, he had some doubt about the credibility of information received from SHULER. Mr. WOOD stated that SHULER might be inclined to seek publicity. He based this on the way SHULER would greet him whenever they met, which was quite frequently. SHULER would greet his (WOOD) as if they had not seen each other in months when in fact it may have not been over a day or two since they had spoken to each other. Mr. WOOD further advised that he did not know just how to express what he meant, but that SHULER was peculiar in a way and might exaggerate the truth or supplement it through his imagination.

Mr. WOOD advised that he had known Mrs. WILLIAMS for many years and believed her to be completely reliable, honest, trustworthy, and that any information she related would be credible.

8. On 21 May 1952, Mrs. DELBERT DUNN, Secretary, Chamber of Commerce, Gonzales, Texas, was interviewed and stated substantially the same as Mr. WOOD concerning the honesty, character, and credibility of Mr. SHULER and Mrs. WILLIAMS. Mrs. DUNN further advised that Mr. A. L. NORRIS was honest, trustworthy, and reliable, but that he had changed considerably since he had been injured in a fire and that at present, she was somewhat doubtful about the credibility of information he might relate because he seemed to read and think a great deal and then use his imagination to supplement the facts. Mrs. DUNN further stated that she did not wish to imply that anyone of the three (3) persons would make up a complete falsehood or that they were not basically honest, truthful, dependable, and reliable.
