Comments of preparing Officers: Because of stationary nature of the object sighted an attempt was made to explain the sighting as a beacon light, possibly projected high over the horizon through conditions of atmospheric and refraction phenomena. However, study of NAC charts showed no beacon lights on the reported heading, nor in the vicinity of the heading, even as far as well into Canada. Findings at this station offered no plausible explanation for sighting. There have been no repetitions of this sighting to the knowledge of the preparing officer.

Due to the fact that there is a critical shortage at this Headquarters of AF Form 112 parts 1 and 2, the total number of copies of part 2 in this report is four instead of the usual six. In order to make up the total number of copies required, onion skin paper is being used. Base publications notified us that it will be approximately thirty days before anymore of subject forms are available at this station.
