## AIR INTELLIGENCE INFORMATION REPORT

1. Description: Spherical in shape; size undetermined, appeared to be small like a small star. Five objects were sighted in all; two were red, ball type, two were white star type, and one was green and appeared to be elongated. Observed singly, with aerodynamic features, no trail or exhaust, propulsion system speed, sound, etc. was reported. Objects were flying a straight course. They made one sharp right angle turn. No other maneuver was reported. Objects disappeared out of the horizon.

2. Time Sighted: 22210 - 22410, 24 April 1952.

3. Manner of Observation: Objects were observed from ground with no visual aid.

4. Location of Observer: Long. 96°44', N. Lat. 32°50'. Objects were observed at an undetermined altitude in the eastern sky proceeding west, made sharp 90° turn to the left and proceeded south.

5. Identifying Information on Observers: Observer was Mrs. A. S. Keal. She was previously questioned regarding a similar incident and appeared to be of above average intelligence. Reliability could not be ascertained in that the observer had no other mature witnesses.

6. Weather: 22300 60 D 15 190/58/1 - 12/013.

7. Other Activity: No unusual activity was reported to this headquarters in this area by any other source.

8. Physical Evidence: No physical evidence or photographs were taken.

9. Interception or Identification: No interception or identification action was taken.
