f. Weather was excellent, No ceiling or clouds, Wind from the south, four (4) miles per hour.

g. There were no activities, meteorological or otherwise which might have accounted for the flight.

h. No photographs were taken of the sightings. There were no fragments or physical evidence of the sightings.

i. No interception was made or attempted, nor was identification by the proper authorities possible.

j. There was no local aircraft activity at the time of the siting. Northwest Airlines flight from Minneapolis to Fargo passed through the area and was sighted by the majority of the parties that are mentioned in par e., on an about 2110 hours. This is the normal approach time for that commercial flight.


