In regard to aircraft or astronomy. SA [redacted] stated the object was originally noticed by a neighbor, Mr. [redacted], 127 [redacted] Avenue, [redacted], Mass., who in turn, called [redacted] to observe the object. [redacted] was notified of the object for approximately forty [redacted] minutes, and during that time, [redacted] notified Base Operations, [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] of their observation. The object was still in the sky at the time they both discontinued observation.
