- ON 1 MAY 1952 THE WEATHER IN THIS VICINITY WAS CLEAR AND 30 MILE VISIBILITY. THERE WERE NO CLOUDS AND AT 1800 HRS THE TEMPERATURE WAS 43 DEGREES. THE WINDS ALOFT WERE AS FOLLOWS:
 AT 5000 FT 240 DEGREES 3 KNOTS, AT 6000 FT 320 DEGREES 10 KNOTS, AT 8000 FT 340 DEGREES 10 KNOTS, AT 10,000 FT 300 DEGREES 11 KNOTS, AT 12,000 FT 290 DEGREES 12 KNOTS, AT 14,000 FT 300 DEGREES 10 KNOTS, AT 16,000 FT 220 DEGREES 23 KNOTS, AT 20,000 FT 230 DEGREES 24 KNOTS, AT 25,000 FT 250 DEGREES 21 KNOTS.

- THE ONLY AIRCRAFT AIRBORNE IN VICINITY WAS A NAVION WITH WHITE VERTICAL STRIP ON RUDDER AND WHITE STRIP AROUND TIPS OF WING. THIS AIRCRAFT WAS AT LOW ALTITUDE HEADING NORTH-WEST AND GAVE NO EVIDENCE OF HAVING SIGHTED THE OBJECTS. IT DID NOT LAND AT THIS BASE.
