The preceding officer interviewed S Sgt Harvey E. Bera, S 3816735, 102 Det., 450 Star Ave, Wichita Falls, Texas, on 2 May 1952. The following information was received:

Subject individual states that at 2000 hours, 2 May 1952 he saw, in flight, an object which was circular, darker shaped, approximately eighteen (18) feet to twenty-four (24) feet in diameter, of a dull metal color, which was roughly seven (7) feet thick at the center and tapering to the edges, flying in an arc about one (1) mile distant from him at approximately four thousand (4,000) feet altitude and traveling at between nine hundred (900) and one thousand (1,000) miles per hour. Subject individual observed an exhaust of trails, but he admits not to know how object was propelled.

COMMENT by FWD/AFHQ OFF/DM:

1. Subject individual is unknown to reporting officer. He is presently relieved from the service and resides at 450 Star Ave, Wichita Falls, Texas. Information pertaining to subject individual is as follows:

a. S Sgt Harvey E. Bera, S 3816735, 102 Det., was born 9 March 1906, at Abilene, Texas. His religion is Baptist. He completed about (4) years formal education. While a civilian he was a truck driver for three (3) years and has been relieved from the service for approximately eight (8) years. He served twenty (20) years and seven (7) months with the US Army in various branches. His specific duties were with the Military Police when stationed. While in the service he served in the Zone of Interest, French Camp Zone and the Philippines Islands.

2. Weather and Wind conditions on 2 May 1952 at 0000 hours and 1000 hours were as follows:

a. 0000 hours:
High scattered clouds (30,000 feet)
Visibility fifteen (15) miles plus.
Temperature sixty-two (62) degrees.
Wind from the ENE at two (2) miles per hour.

b. 1000 hours:
Clear
Visibility fifteen (15) miles plus.
Temperature seventy-one (71) degrees.
Wind from the SE at two (2) miles per hour.
