SUMMARY: (This section contains a synopsis of the information, but no source information. The summary is not to exceed 10 percent of the total report.)					
Subject: FLIGHT In accordance with AFM 200-2, dated 29 April 1975, Subject: Unidentified Flying Objects (hereafter referred to as UFOs), the following report of unidentified flying object is submitted: On 5 May 1978, Robert L. Duncanson and Samuel Langfield, residing at the The American Institute of Florida Trade, Phoenix, Arizona, were interviewed by the National Office P-3, 11248 GCU (Phoenix), Phoenix, Arizona, and stated the substance as follows: At 2500 hours 5 May 1978, while driving with their wives, Valerie D. Duncanson and Jane Langfield, in downtown Phoenix in a convertible with the top down, they observed an object which they believed to be a flying saucer. The object was moving west at approximately 500 miles per hour. Neither the size of the object, nor the distance, nor altitude could be determined. However, it was slightly skewed and about five times as long as it was thick. It appeared to be descending at a slight angle. It gave off a phosphorescent white glow and emitted what appeared to be carbon shavings or possibly jet exhausts. The object was observed for about four seconds when it suddenly disappeared from view. Duncanson is an member of the United States Air Force, and Langfield is an member of the United States Navy who was formerly a naval aviator. Both stated that in their experience with aircraft they had never seen any similar object. Duncanson stated that approximately 200 people attending an outdoor party at Grandview Inn, Phoenix, Arizona, that same night observed the above phenomenon. The reliability of the information is not known and therefore, the truth cannot be judged.
