NO. ITS SPEED WAS COMPARABLE TO THAT OF A JET PLANE, ALTHOUGH
 LATER WHEN SIGHTED AGAIN IT APPEARED TO HAVE REDUCED ITS PACE.
 MOVEMENT OF THE OBJECT WAS ACCOMPLISHED WHILE FLIPPING END OVER END.
 NO OTHER OBJECTS DESCRIBED AS BEING LIKE THAT ONE MENTIONED IN THE
 FIRST OBSERVATION APPEARED LATER IN THE PATH OF THE FLIPPING
 "UNDER PLATE". ONE WAS NOT CONTINUALLY VISIBLE BECAUSE IT HAD
 NO SUN WAS REFLECTED ON IT AS IT TURNED. THE OTHER OBJECT WAS
 VISIBLE CONSTANTLY. TWO SMALL OBJECTS FLEW IN WIDE FORMATION
 "NOTICIOUSLY". LARGE OBJECTS MADE 90 DEGREE TURN OVER BASE. FIRST
 OBJECT SIGHTED AT 1200 HOURS, 9 MAY 1952, FOR ABOUT 20 SECONDS.
 SECOND OBJECT SIGHTED ON THE SAME DAY AT 1225 HOURS FOR ABOUT
 15 SECONDS. THIRD OBJECT SIGHTED AT 1228 HOURS ON 11 MAY 1952. FIRST
 ONE OBSERVED FOR APPROX 3 MINUTES. SOME MINUTES LATER SAME OBJECT
 WAS SIGHTED ALONG WITH THE TWO OTHERS. OBSERVED WITH NAKED EYE FROM
 THE SURFACE. FIRST OBJECT WAS SIGHTED BY THE WESSHALLIA (SW)
 NORTH-EAST SECTION, GEORGE AIR FORCE BASE. ALTITUDE 30,000 FEET.
 NO VAPOR TRAILS OR NOISE. SECOND OBJECT WAS SIGHTED BY THE
 BAKE BALL FIELD ABOUT 3 BLOCKS AWAY FROM WHERE THE FIRST ONE WAS
 SIGHTED. GOING SOUTH, ALTITUDE 30,000 - 40,000 FEET. NO VAPOR
 TRAILS OR NOISE. THIRD OBJECT SIGHTED AT BAKERY, ABOUT 3 BLOCKS
