Statement of George W.

1. Milton A. Walker, A/30, AF 3000004, Base Flight, 144th Fighter-Bomber Wing, do make this statement concerning a certain unidentified object observed by me on 17 May 1952:

1. The object that I saw was toward odd height and alloyed, like a light. I heard no sounds coming from it and saw no wake trails. The object seemed to fade away as it moved.

2. My observation was made at 1425 HRS, on the down indicated in attached photograph 3 attached.

3. I sighted the object with the naked eye from the ground.

4. I made the sighting on the flight line, George W. It was reported to be the same size as when I observed the same type of object previously from an altitude of approximately 12,000 feet (previous report dated 17 May 52).

5. I am 32 years old with two years of college. I worked 13 months at Hughes Aircraft, Culver City, California. Before the last six months of employment there, I was a flight instructor in the Flight Test Department. I have completed the 6 month aircraft and engine probation course at Westwood AB, Rome. I have flown 44 aircraft since the age of 18.
