officers of the Day for the period beginning 0830 12 May to 0130 13 May 1962:

216 - Received long distance telephone call as indicated below:

From: W. S. Crags, commercial pilot, license #116670, age 28,
retired-1st Army, Wentham, Ohio.

Reported: He had sighted an unidentified object flying NW,
altitude over 20,000 ft, estimated speed 500-600 MPH.
He stated that he was familiar with jet aircraft and
it was not a jet aircraft. Object was sighted over
Kenton, Ohio at 2116 hours.

Action Taken: Reported to 4810 Duty Officer, telephone #1100.

216 - Same individual called and relayed further information:

- No vapor trail sighted.
- Sky is clear and no overcast.
- He has sighted stationary unidentified object three (3) times since
1047.

0830 - 13 May - A call was received from Lt Paul Fletcher of the WOHFF police
department concerning a broken padlock in stockroom AT120-3, Building 69. Lt E. R.
Rollinger, 2D #2 investigated the report and advised that the padlock has
