CONTENT OF R/T: It is quite possible that an aircraft of the USAF, a B-47, may have been observed, emitting or testing the aircraft in various maneuvers. The close tight formation of lights referred to could very easily be exhaust of the jet pods when the attitude of a B-47 was in just the right angle position. However, from the foregoing interrogations it is evident that a definite weakness exists in the civil defense program in regard to unconventional aircraft. Law enforcement agencies do not have either the initiative or the know how to contact the concerned military activities when unconventional aircraft are sighted.
