San Diego, California, March to June 1952.

1. SYNOPSIS: Source of information, an aero-medical engineer, San Diego, California, and associates residing in different localities in the San Diego area, have formed a "Flying Saucer Fighting Club". When an unidentified aerial object is sighted, other members are alerted for further identification, tracking, and triangulation. Source has submitted various sketches and mathematical computations concerning sightings made during four month period, March to June 1952.

2. DETAILS: Mr. DONALD E. GARD, residing at 2400 S. 18th Street, National City, California, employed as an engineer with the Consolidated-Palmer Aircraft Corporation, San Diego, California, advises that he, along with several other engineers, has formed a voluntary "Flying Saucer Fighting Club". The members of this club live in various points in and around San Diego and its suburbs. According to GARD, when one member sights an unidentified object in the sky, he immediately alerts other members of the club by telephone so that a triangulation and additional sighting can be made.

Mr. GARD has submitted to this office reports along with various mathematical computations covering sightings made by this group on 2 March 1952, 9 May 1952, 13 May 1952, 21 May 1952, and 14 June 1952. All these sightings were made at night and concern saucer-like objects.

Included with the above are reports submitted by two of Mr. GARD's colleagues, Mr. RICHARD GARD, 4320 Cassia Avenue, San Diego, California, and Mr. EARL ARNONE, 3700 and 44 Cajon Blvd., San Diego, California. These reports concern the sighting of a green fire ball on 2 March 1952 at the 36th and 44 Cajon address by Mr. GARD and Mr. ARNONE, and a similar sighting on 9 May 1952 by Mr. GARD at the Cassia Avenue address.
