Neli told him that on a sleepness night she went outside the house to get water, to take it with sugar against nervousness and since inside the house there is no running water, neither electricity. It was 3 a.m. and outside she met 3 men who invited her to come to the town's square, "to see their FLYING SAUCER (this was their expression)" and "to have no fear". Losing fear she went with the men and in fact met the Saucer 40 cm floating above the ground (see Senhor Sampaio's excellent sketches). The men told her they were coming from Mars and invited her to see a flower garden, but she refused the ride. Fernando heard prof. Carrien's opinion about the report, the President of OIOANI and he was well impressed by it. Not so Colonel Waldemar Schneider, another proeminent member of the Porto Alegre Society and not to take lightly since he himself already, as told to us, has had one of the finest experience in Ufo research, that is, he had taken up contact with two F.S. at night-time, by exchange of intelligent signals, that is, the signals given by the Colonel Schneider, by means of two flashlights, were executed "em grandeur" in the sky by the movement of the two Saucers and this in front of Mr. Schneider's wife and the kids. We hope that a bigger Bulletin than SBEDV is able to get one day the description and sketches for publishing of this sensational event, we just remembered that it is the third exchange of luminous signals with a Saucer in Brasil, who reacted to it, "intelligently". (Please then do mention S.B.E.D.V, as we do it; we are pleased).

NEWS AT THE FLYING SAUCER (F; S;) FRONT (from the Editor's desk)

Old points of view - It's the development of the complicated relationship between earthlings and other planets, we specially are interested in.

This relationship first was focalized for the broad public of our time by Kenneth Arnold in 1947, even so the importance of the event wasn't understood immediately, but later when G. Adamski and Leslie Desmond focused it in their book, showing that the problem had been a biblical one, having turned acute in our times, by the means of the open atomic explosions or radar contact signals sent up to the moon.

Landings and contacts - The curtain of secrecy slapped by governments over the F.S. problem 14 years ago was related by the public at first to sort of a cold war with space by reason of the atomic explosions related to our earthen tensions. The political tensions kept softening, the bomb explosions aren't in the open anymore, even so secrecy still prevails, with the exception to a Washington Agency, Nicap, founded in 1957, well related to USA Congress, Senate and Government, which now timidly admits planetary origine for the Saucers.

In commenting the new book "THE UFO EVIDENCE" of Nicap's Director Major Keyhoe, (INS (\*-1) v.2, n.5) comments that author Keyhoe chose "to with hold chapters on (UFO) landings for no discernible reason.. (so as) scientists will not be convinced by LITTLE MEN stories... "Nicap, (\*-2) commenting a contact with english speaking "little" spacemen (Ufo Investigator Jul.Aug/64) calls it "so sensational that it must be viewed with skepticism... "and evidently referring to contactee G.Adamski (\*-3) when mentioning "certain pseudo-religious cultists" (\*-4) (Ufo Invest. sept/Oct.64), or "tales of trips with spacemen since (by Nicap) unsupported have hurt serious investigation". Also well documented contacts, as the 4 spacemen on board of a F.S. in New Guinea winking to 28 witnesses on the ground, and Socorro policemen Zamora who recently saw two crew members besides a F.S. when one was looking in his direction, are all imperfectly mentioned by Nicap's Major Keyhoe (Fig.-10) or with a very few lines..., if at all.

Our stand - So we find it strange that Major Keyhoe, intelligent and with a high forehead and thin lips that shows controlled emotions, should be so reluctant to contacts, when ourselves feel stricken by the contact truth, also sometimes dissenting from a contactee's philosophical approach, as in the past re G.A. as at the present time C.A. Honey is dissenting from the latter but nevertheless permitting that this should interfere with truth about G. Adamski's contacts, since Mr. Honey (S.P. Newsletter, apr/64)\* 5, writes: "it is an absolute positive fact that Mr. Adamski's original contact in the desert really occurred and that he had at least two rides in spacecrafts. My (C.A.Honey's) proof is from various sources, none of which are related to Mr. Adamski. It is fact that these two rides are known to various intelligence branches of many governments. It is also a fact that 95% or more of its first three books are correct". To explain Nicap's exquisite attitude to contacts we may be permitted to consider it as a political gesture of conservatism in a time of grave racial, social and political and religious upheaval, the World all over, when space and their groups of contacts, seen from Nicap's patriotical point of view, may be felt as an additional point of trouble or as expressed by Keyhoe's Ufo Investigator (Sep/Oct.64) as "any other group to destroy our (Nicap's) free form of life and government".

If we consider the action of a passed "evangelistic cultist", crucified 2000 years ago, we even may agree with Nicap, that those men may produce changes in governments, even changes away from narrow egoistical goals, to a broader understanding of earthen, perhaps cosmic mankind, which may not be interpreted as a loss of liberty, as evidently done by Nicap's Director Major Keyhoe. The Major Let us Know that he is much concerned about communism.

May be he wouldn't need it, if we had obeyed better to that evangelistic cultist and restricted our liberty, so not to sell opium in China and produce it in state factories in ex-french Vietnam. May be if the living standard of the russian masses had been better, and the World and our Major wouldn't need to be concerned now about comunism in those aforementioned countries.

We only wonder when Nicap begins <sup>well</sup> to thunder against the "evangelistic Cultists" in Rome, who are focalizing mankind's yearly death toll by hunger as 50 million people (J. Brasil-Rio Nov /64) and Pope Paul VI even pronounced himself against militarism (Corr. Manhã-Rio, Dec. 23/64), to liberate energies for the poor, to tear down divisions and fear, and a lone USA Senato (Wayne Morse) condemns "military help funds as deshonest so to corrupt governments (Corr. Manhã-Rio, Aug. 4/64).

Personally we understand why Southafrika's patriotic Hertzog doesn't permit TV in his country, since information given by it to the people, could, as we put it, change his "free form of government" or as he puts "could mean the destruction of White South Afrika" (Time Nov. 20/64) so it still shall be seen, by which way Herzog will succeed to achieve faster the distruction of the White, by loyal open information and cooperation between races!, or by seclusion, hate and "projects of grudge and scorn". Even so it seems to us, that big leaders are not more responsible for the mess at the present, than the man of the street, who without thinking, looks up to them in awe. He is also engulfed by its government "geo-political-economical - (\* 6) military" (7) goals, founded on the yearning and earning of the respective Security Council, which happens to shape those policies and may be also the voice of the press, and is in the USA composed by 28 men of commerce and reformed armed force officers. Ufo Ressarch Director Keynee, he himself a retired Force Officer, could have explained to us the reason of "space racism", but, it's done instead, by Nasaa's Dr. Michael, telling us, that "proving the existance of an intelligent space race, would upset the Defense Department, understandably, the biggest threat to them is that of becoming obsolete by the advance of Society" 8 (CBA v.2, nr. 1/64).

Evidently, Dr. Michael leaves it to us, to consider POWERFUL SPACE an "advanced Society" (\*9), with its relative peaceful ("evangelistic" by Nicap standards?) approach versus the Earth, the latter with all the "vacuum hungry powers" (\* 10). If we compare the democratic representation of the masses by their "democratic" government with a treasurer of a big institution, then the missinformation and secrecy of "democratic" governments in regard of the Flying Saucer, may be compared with an embezzlement of the money given to the treaseurer in loyal trust. Certainly for short or long the treasurer will be in for jail, so as the silence policy becomes a loose noose around the neck of an inconsistent democracy. Some people in responsible spots may allready have gotten the message, and this could mean the very good reports of landings and reports of space crews, when seen on the ground, by Dr. Gribble (\* 11), a NICAP AGENCY from Seattle, state of Washington, USA.

In scouting out, other Research Societies opinions - We would like to call attention to LLIP's reknown Editor Mrs. Watson Colcord John, who, with feminine sensibility asked us to print (see fig. nr. 1) the Washington F.S. sighting on March 28, 64, at 3,20 p.m. mentioned by the Washington Daily News (june 6/64), when a "silvery object with a THREE BALL LANDING GEAR" was seen. Evidently, Mrs. John was remembering another notable F.S. tele-photo-snapshot (fig. nr. 3), with a "THREE BALL LANDING GEAR" also, printed in Contactee's (fig. nr. 2) G. Adamski book, "FLYING SAUCER HAVE LANDED", edited in the past by what we heard, with the help of Mrs. John. A "mail bag" reader of F.S.R. (Sept. Oct. /64) London, Mr. Lidsone comments that "... many people have distrusted Adamski because of the Cosmic Philosophy but... it might explain why he has been so eager to proclaim his experience as he sees in it a justification of his allready established beliefs..."

When will come a maior break in Ufology, so that contacts take place on a broader base, was our question put in 1956 to Mr. Adamski on our visit to Mount Palomar. It would take 5 to 20 years, depending of our earthern reaction, this was his reply 8 years ago, and it seems to fullfill slowly, what he then had told. Coimbra's professor Almeida Garret ventured in "WHAT HAPPENED AT FATIMA" (F.S.R. London, March Apr./64) that "Fatima was one of (space crews) last attempts to contact us on a large scale... waiting (now) the time...when we can stand at their side as equals or disciples".

To complete the reasoning of Mr. Garret, we would add that allready Mankind is getting the above mentioned maior shift, to conquer maior "liberty, dignity and... responsability". Leaving the odious old privileges, mankind is allready under way along new paths. Could it be that a friendly 5th and 6th column from Space acts as cautious coordinator? The only way for the governments of East and West, eager to conserve the old orders, would be to silence about the advent of the Saucers, specially about the landings and the presence of crew members. <sup>\*12</sup> We will sit see and report... Wat happens next.

nr. 9 - refers to a phone call at 7 a.m. at Dec. 13, 64 by F. Saucer affiliate and tree warden Frederico Beuttenmueller of Lorena (he himself had a good sighting in the past), rua Cel. José Vicente 462, Lorena, São Paulo, who asked us if we would like to come with him to Silveira, a little town near by, where, as the papers (Noticias Populares, S.P. Dec. 11, 64) had told, "a F.S. had landed at daytime, in the middle of the town". Certainly we accepted and at 12.30 we had a splendid lunch at Mr. Beuttenmueller's house and drove out to Silveira, a sleepy, tinny (cir. 1000), old (perhaps 250 years) town, build along the 1 km long mainstreet Carvalho Pin

to. In short, we got the right connections, and could rectify the newspaper, as to the date was a Saturday Nov. 17, 64, at a sunny windstill, afternoon (approx. 16 p.m.), so informed us 29 old, married Venancio Gonçalves Sobrinho, who 20 m away from his house's window, together with his wife and sister, had seen only an air turbulence, and brilliance like aluminium outside his garden, approx. 4 to 6 m above the ground, since the ground of the street was hidden by the bushes of his garden's hedge and stone wall. The object and the sun were in front of Venancio. When the family stormed outside, to see better, all had allready vanished. A better look at the object had Teresinha Maria do Carmo, a 30 year old housewife with 4 children, but was too shy to talk to us, which was done by her husband, who gave us her crude sketch of the object she made for us also without perspective and properly projections. As told by her it was a cone shaped, lead coloured object, which she saw descend rapidly from the sky, making a low hissing sound when low, landing on the spot, shown by the people on the photograph, and resting on the ground (or very near the ground) for some time. Her house, on the left side in the background of the road (that crosses at this end of the town with Carvalho Pinto as seen in the photo), 80 m away, from her house she also observed the air turbulence, so some "things sticking out on the broader (1,5 to 2 m diameter) base with something revolving, where also a "thin smoke came forward". She agreed about the tallness (telephone post high, aprox. 5 to 7 m) of the object, seen from her window, it was to her right, with the sun in front of her. There was no wind and in short the object elevated fast and.. was gone. The Third witness, 60 y. old Joaquim Alves de Toledo was on horse back, 20 m away from the landing spot and the crossroad, on Teresinha's road with his back to her, when the object descended and the horse panicked. Unfortunately is Joaquim living on a secluded spot, 18 km away so we couldn't reach him. Teresinha's sister bolder as herself, after the object's departure, went outside to the landing spot, which was "like clean swept in a diameter of 1, 5 to 2 m" when the rest of the road, the earth had a puffy appearance since a road leveling caterpillar had passed shortly before. Before long the traces left by the object would disappear, since the road building business hadn't been stopped, and layers of asphalt were poured on the ground. (Editor. Had the F.S. been interested in the Silveira Road building?).

nº 10 - Is the "strange lettering(?)" observed by policeman Zamora and an un-named pilot seen on the object, which landed near Socorro, New Mexico, when also two small people could be seen outside the craft as told by I.N.S. Vol. 2, nr. 5.5.

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F. Saucer movement in 1964 - Brasil

Little was read in the papers but more was told in personal communications and letters, and so we haven't renewed our subscription of paperclippings.

At the night of Jan. 7, 64 (Folha S.P.Man., Jan. 9, 64) at 11 p.m. in Campinas (S.P.) two luminous balls with a "blue ring around each" were seen by the people, when flying first in a right angle to viaduct Miguel Vicente Curri, then in (small) circles, sometimes stationary in space.

The 5 flying "headlights" seen in São Paulo by Da Emilia have been allready rep. in the last Bull. out of Mr. Kiener's archives.

At the early morning hours of Sunday, Apr. 12, 64 (O Globo, Apr. 17, 64) students (mineralogy) in the old capital Ouro Preto observed a cigarformed object, with opening in it "like windows", when under a thunderous noise it made evolutions over the town, sometimes also stopping in mid-air, and changing directions suddenly. It was known at the next day that the strange ob

ject had been seen also at the towns in that region of Cachoeira do Campo, Itabirito, Conselheiro Lafaiete and Santa Bárbara.

Walter Sá Cardoso, an old flying Saucer affectionate from the state of Alagoas (Santa Cruz 291, Farol, Maceió) together with 6 friends and relatives (personal letter of June 19, 64) saw from his house balcony first a "falling star" crossing the sky. Then a star appeared from the direction where from had come the "falling star", but stationary, proximate of constellation of scorpion this "star" would increase in luminosity phantastically and then diminish and disappear in 40 seconds, this on a perfect clear sky at 6.55 p.m. at June 18, 64 (Brazilian "Winter").

C.M. - a Rio newspaper (Nov. 15, 64) quotes that every evening between 19 and 19,30 p.m. a "strange object" has been crossing the sky of Goiás state capital, Goiânia, in a direction North-South, and this during more than a week

In the description to fig. 9 the event of Nov. 17, 64 is tackled with, all ready above.

#### Ufo Societies of the World

Dr. Gribble's Nicap Reporter already mentioned elsewhere, is at the moment the best reporter about Ufo events in Northamerica. In nr. 3 vol. 3, landing of an Ufo in 1922, in Ireland in front of a cavern is mentioned. In vol. 3, nr. 2 the case of a spaceman, "the size of a little boy, had a human-looking face and wore a black suit and black helmet... (with) antenna-like wires on its top... white lettering across its front... the creature was wearing a plastic or glass lens over his eyes and... making a peculiar noise sounding as it it came out of a pipe (child's Kazoo)... they couldn't understand what he said but that it sounded like he needed water". In May number 64 police man Zamora from Socorro N.M. is mentioned. He was "an estimated 450 feet away when he first saw the object. Standing beside the (egg shaped) Ufo with their back to him were, what appeared to be two small persons in white overalls..". In June 64 Bull.: Apolinar (Paul) Villa, 601 Niagara NE., Albuquerque, New Mexico, USA, claims 5 sightings, 2 contacts, the last from 2.30 to 4 p.m., with men and woman, and had a roll of Kodak colour film shots taken. In the Sept. 64 Reporter, the Sentinel, Montana, (7/25/64) is quoted about the contacts with an Ufo crew by 3 and a half years old Kyle, whose parents have direct and indirect proves of the presence of the space craft (top shaped ship, with a row of lights around its circumference.. of a fluorescent type..).

CAS Bull. from Brazil (Elídio Hernandez, Av. Vicente Machado 1355- Curitiba Paraná-Brasil) makes in his excellent Bull. The observation "...if they (the witnesses) had known more about the F.S. .. they would have taken other attitudes... (and kept) trying to communicate through luminous signals... (with) the crew members. (Read above about the third case of successful communication by signalisation with a F.S.).

Antonio Oscar Pérez Alemán from AHC, Deán Funes 1564, Córdoba, Argentina, sends a clipping of "Diario Impulso" (Ag. 27, 64) of San Luis, in reference of a mineralogist, Rafael Denoso, who at June 15, near Arica-Chile, saw land a 3 m large, 1,5 m high machine, where from stepped tall red skinned men, speaking to him in a mixture of English and Spanish, asking for water, which he furnished them

In a letter (May 18, 64) from Antwerp from May Maurice Morlet, we take note that "G. Adamski took a colour motion picture of a small mothership. It was projected for us, M.M. Morlet's. The space ship moves quite low, at a terrific speed, stops, goes up and down, hovers as so often described by witnesses. The film is so clear that the speed and size could be measured... "Editor : we wonder what the enemies of G.A. have to say about those films which

can't be falsified, even by the costliest laborities).

Editor Hinfelar's New Zealand's (P.O.Box 21007 Henderson) "Spaceview" (May-June 64 number) by excellent co-operation of a reporter of a "main daily newspaper" could report about a wave "in the year 1909 (of) cigar-shaped flying objects...all over New Zealand"...in one instance two local residents of Gore..(saw). at night, a boat-shaped object carrying 2 large fans and 3 lights..two other residents in the same locality..swear they could discern TWO FIGURES on board of ..an object shaped like a boat with an open top (which) came down through the mist in the early morning. A similar airship was seen by several school-children at noon... (with) the figure of a man seated in it..".

We just finished reading London's F.S. Review (Nov. Dec. 64) one of the finest Bulletins ("interessantissimo" as we would call it here). As an example we transcribe the contents "Ten Years old ("Review)", Our friend Waveney Girvan, The Socorro (new Mexico) Classic (sighting and visual contact).Ufo's and the Sea, The Mysterious Templeton Photographs (of an unvisible spaceman for the eye, but not so for the camara and the interest of the government): Whydby Island contact; Soil samplers (by Ufo's); A brasilian sighting;a lay man's "Time and Space", What the Soviet Press "is saying" (re Ufos and alien civilisations); the New Zealand "Flap" of 1909; at last but not at least the very good, to the point, "Editor's Note", of F.S. Review.

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
