

CE1, 6.15 a.m., one day in May, 1976, on Kaskwakamak Lake, Frontenac County, near Northbrook, 30 miles northeast of Madoc, position-45 deg.N.Latitude, 77 deg.W.Longitude, eastern Ontario, Canada. Duration Estimate-10 minutes in total. Three observers: Mr. D.J.of Thornhill, Ontario, 52, mail service courier, good hearing and vision, grade 12 education; others-Mr.W.C. of Thornhill and Mr. L.W. of Willowdale, Ontario. Clear sunny morning. Object appeared grey, 40-60 ft.long, 10-12 ft.high, blunt at both ends, solid, moved at 10 mph and hovered at one point, moved against the wind, appeared to be 50-60 ft. in air and 200-300 ft. from observers, who thought it was, at first, an aeroplane about to land on the water. Observers were in 14 ft.boat doing 5 mph; said object looked like size of Goodyear blimp. Observers used binoculars when object first appeared in the distance. Frame of reference-island 60-70 ft. long and 10-15 ft. wide. Observers were running a 50 hp motor at troll, so were unable to hear any sound made by object. Report first made to R.Hesketh of CFRB Radio, Toronto in 1976, then to CUFORN in 1981.

## THE BIBLICAL UFO CONNECTION

As I have studied the UFO phenomenon over the years, I have come to realize that there is a very pronounced theological aspect to it. There are many biblical references to "angelic" beings and airborne vehicles called "fiery chariots".

It is a relatively well-known hypothesis that the biblical angels may have been extraterrestrial beings visiting the Earth and acting as "agents of God". It appears that there was also another group of adversary angels which became associated with the symbol of the dragon. The Bible speaks of a war which took place between the angels of light and the angels of darkness. Following this theoretical train of thought, I managed to uncover some evidence which may be of significant value in verifying these claims.

## The War in Heaven-Revelation 12:7-9

"And there was war in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon; and the dragon fought and his angels, and prevailed not, neither was their place found any more in heaven. And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world, he was cast out into the Earth and his angels were cast out with him."--If we view these angels as space visitors, then it seems that "Star Wars" may not have been too far off.

There are other parallel accounts of this battle in which the names vary, but the content appears consistent stemming from the areas which surround the island of Patmos (the place where John was exiled when he wrote the Book of Revelation). Similar accounts of the battle took place between Isis and Seth, Ormuzd and Ahriman, Krishna and a serpent, Marduk and Tiamat (a dragon) and Zeus and Typhon who was also a dragon from whom the word 'typhoon' was derived.

In the Zeus/Typhon version, Typhon is described as brushing the stars and out-topping mountains, and possessing hands which reached out, one to the west and one to the east, from which a hundred dragons' heads projected, having viper-like coils which emitted a hissing sound. He had a winged body and fire flashed from his eyes and from his mouth. Does this not resemble a primitive description of a spacecraft armed with guns or perhaps lasers and occupied by a hundred men?

On the other side, there was Zeus arriving over the Egyptian sky and riding what the ancients referred to as a chariot drawn by winged horses. From a distance, he pelted Typhon with thunderbolts. Then he pursued Typhon as far as Thrace (Bulgaria) where he heaved entire mountains on

the dragon and drove him to seek refuge underground.

#### Possible Ancient Astronauts Depicted in Drawings

In the park-cum-museum of Villa Hermosa, Tabasco, Mexico, stands a neatly carved monolith in which a large dragon is depicted. Inside the animal sits a man with back bent and raised extended legs. His feet are working what appear to be pedals, his left hand rests on a gear-type lever, and his right hand is holding a small box. He wears a close fitting helmet covering his brow, ears and chin, leaving his face exposed. In front of his lips is an object which greatly resembles a microphone. The helmet and clothing fit tightly together. This monolith provides a valuable piece of evidence to suggest that the dragon spoken of in the Zeus/Typhon account may well have been a spacecraft which was piloted by a man.

In southern Yugoslavia, at a place called Dessani, there exists a temple containing some frescoes which picture two oval-shaped spacecraft, one in pursuit of the other with pilots aboard each craft, their hands working levers. The people on the ground are shown covering their faces and running in a panic.

Why would the ancients paint such a scene on the walls of a holy temple unless there was a subtle theological connection. It is interesting to note that these accounts all fall into the same area. Some stories even indicate that the dragon fled beneath Mount Etna in Sicily and near Egypt, Greece, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia and the Greek island of Patmos.

What relationship does all this have to our times? Let's take a look at the Herbert Schirmer case.

#### Herbert Schirmer-Dragon meeting

On December 3, 1967, at about 2.30 a.m., Herbert Schirmer was on patrol as part of his duties as a police officer in Ashland, Nebraska. He saw ahead of him an object with a row of flickering lights. He thought it was a truck until it took off into the sky. When he returned to the police station, he entered in his logbook, "Saw a flying saucer at the junction of highways 6 and 63, believe it or not." Later, the Condon Committee discovered about 20 minutes missing in his police report and had him put through time regression hypnosis. It was then that they discovered that he had been taken aboard the UFO and met some strange men wearing close-fitting, silvery-gray uniforms, boots and gloves. On the right-hand part of the chest, the beings wore an insignia of a serpent with wings--a dragon. They informed Mr. Schirmer that they had bases on the Earth which are located underground.

In retrospect, the Zeus/Typhon battle also states that the dragons fled underground. Could the beings that Herbert Schirmer encountered perhaps be descendants of the dragons that battled against Zeus and Michael in Biblical times? If so, this particular race could be extremely dangerous. Keep in mind that it was a dragon or serpent which caused the downfall of man back in the Garden of Eden.

#### Food For Thought

In the book, "The Andreasson Affair", by Ray Fowler, I was able to find another piece of information which closely resembles a Biblical angelic encounter.

At one point during Betty Andreasson Luca's CE4, she attempted to cook the aliens some meat. The aliens were appalled at this action and

stated that their food was "tried by fire." They asked her if she had any food like that. She then gave them a Bible and, in return, they gave her a little blue book(Editor's note-coincidence with U.S. Air Force's Project Blue Book should be filed under synchronicity)

In the Book of Revelation 10:8-11, there is another reference to a little book which an angel passed to John for his oral consumption. See also the Book of Ezekiel 2:8-10 and 3:1-3 for yet another account of a little scroll or book which was given to Exekiel by an angel, also with the instruction to "eat" the book. More than likely, what is meant by "eating" it, is merely to read and digest its meaning.

There is far more information which I have compiled to support the theological angle to the UFO phenomenon. Unfortunately, I am not able to reveal any more here, as this was only intended as a short article. However, I am presently putting together a book which I hope will be ready for publication soon. Hopefully, it will bring us a little closer to solving the UFO mystery. In the meantime, let us all continue the research.

UFOS AND THE MEDIA

A SHORT STATISTICAL ANALYSIS OF NEWS COVERAGE  
\*\*\*\*\*

When it comes to **stories** concerning unidentified flying objects, there have been a few in the past which have dealt with the way in which the media cover the topic. I have done a short, though rather superficial, analysis of the numbers of articles which have entered CUFORN's files over the years 1966 through 1982.

In terms of total numbers of articles, the newspaper which has the most is the Toronto Star, with 193. Next is the 191 of the National Enquirer. The first is a surprise, the second is not unexpected. The Globe and Mail's 85 is a surprise, while the Toronto Sun is living up its reputation with 77 pieces.

As would be expected the weekly tabloids, the Examiner (formerly the National Examiner) and the Globe (formerly Midnight and Midnight-Globe) are near the top with 66 and 60 respectively (although many people show no respect for these tabloids, with some justification). Other supermarket tabloids such as the Star (formerly the National Star) and the Florida-based Weekly World News are no slouches either. Their totals are 48 and 43.

Western and Northern areas of Canada are well represented. The Calgary Herald's 18 and the Sudbury Star's 15 are among the middle group, ranking even higher than the tabloid Modern People. We find the world's best newspaper, the New York Times in this group. It had seven articles about UFOs.

In the second-to-last category, we have the Winnipeg Tribune (five), the National Informer (six), the Ottawa Journal (five), the Pickerings Bay, (Ontario) News (five), the Kitchener-Waterloo Record (four), the National Insider (three), and the Peterborough Examiner (three).

Papers with two articles were the National Spotlight, the Hamilton (Ontario) Spectator, the Western Producer, the Green Bay (Wisconsin) Press-Gazette, the National News Extra, and the Slave Lake (Alberta) newspaper, which we do not know the full name of since we only got a clipping which does not give its name.

Forty-one other newspapers had one article each. In a future issue, I will analyze the headlines and editorial slant or bias within the articles. In this way, we will see whether numbers of articles really reflect a desire on the part of the newspapers to sell papers or to deal in a fair way with the subject. Readers are urged to be aware of catchphrases in articles such as "UFO buff", "cult", "far out", "kooks" and others which are obviously intended to denigrate ufology and its researchers, persons who report UFOs and authors of books about UFOs. There are subtler methods and words used which will be less noticeable but which have an effect on the reader's perception of the phenomenon.

# UFO 'battlewagon' sighted

New Scandia Township in northeast Washington County is abuzz over the sighting of an unidentified flying object "as big as a battleship."

"I talked to more than a dozen people who claim to have seen it," said Town Constable Mary Lou Simonson. "They all say the same thing — that they have never seen anything like it before."

Simonson said that based on eyewitness descriptions, the object was "about 30 feet wide and three stories high."

She added, "It hovered in the sky near Goose Lake and Bone Lake from about 9:15 to 9:45 p.m. Wednesday. People could see clearly around it because of the light from a full moon."

"But the object also had red lights, at the top and at the bottom. The lights were awfully bright at the bottom."

"The bottom was supposed to be dome shaped. But nobody could tell if there were windows, although some people got within 100 yards of the object. It wasn't very far off the ground, maybe a few hundred feet."

Cathy Hawkinson, a housewife, said in an interview she and her husband, David, sighted the object out of the picture window of their home near Goose Lake.

"For awhile, we couldn't believe our eyes," she said. "It made no noise. We went outside to look. It moved slowly to the south. I suppose we watched it for 15 minutes."

Mrs. Hawkinson said she was "more excited than scared. I didn't know what to make of it."

Simonson declined to release the names of other persons who reported sighting the object.

"But I can assure you," she added, "that they are all stable, ordinary citizens."

The constable said a private investigator,

Brad Ayers, arrived in New Scandia Friday to interview witnesses.

Ayers represents Dr. J. Allen Hynek, director of the Center for UFO Studies at Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill., she said.

A sketch of the object drawn by a witness was turned over to Ayers, she added.

Sherm Granberg, the town's fire chief, said the fire department was alerted at the time of the sightings.

"We loaded six firemen into two cars and went out to take a look," Granberg said. "But by the time we arrived, it was gone."

"There were reports of airplanes in the New Scandia area that night. But it couldn't have been an airplane if it stayed in place so long. The people also said it made no noise."

"That's right," Simonson added. "All of the witnesses agree. The object was silent."

Granberg noted, "I know that many people who saw it don't want their names in the paper. Other people may think they are screwy. But I'm sure everybody was sober."
