




Aug 1, noon, August 13, 1976, Gananoque, Ontario, Canada. Duration-5 minutes. 12 observers present, including Mr. V.T., 49, salesman, B.Sc. Degree, good hearing & vision, home town-Port Hope, Ontario. On holiday with wife & 2 children. Wife saw object first through window of restaurant on Highway 401. Weather-heavy rain, high winds. Object said to be "whale-like", sharp edges, dark gray, just below clouds which were at 1,000 ft. Object came from east, turned south. Staff of Voyageur Restaurant also saw object. Location main railroad line between Toronto and Montreal. Object was size of baseball held at arm's length. Report made to CUFORN's Larry Fenwick on October 29, 1979.

NORTH AMERICAN UFO FEDERATION FORMED

A major step was taken in Pasadena, California for the unification of UFO organizations in the United States and Canada with the formation of the North American UFO Federation (NAUFOF) on July 3, 1983. A Steering Committee appointed in Toronto, Ontario on July 3, 1982 ended their work by establishing corporate bylaws and electing a Board of Directors prior to the Pasadena meeting.

Representing various UFO groups, the following people were elected to the Board of Directors: Henry H. McKay (MUFON-Canada), Agincourt, Ontario; Peter Mazzola (Scientific Bureau of Investigation), Staten Island, New York; Walter H. Andrus, Jr. (Mutual UFO Network), Seguin, Texas; Dr. J. Allen Hynek (Center for UFO Studies), Evanston, Illinois; Rick R. Hilberg (Northern Ohio UFO Group) Berea, Ohio; Charles J. Wilhelm (Ohio UFO Investigators League), Fairfield, Ohio; Mrs. Ann Druffel (SKYNET), Pasadena, California; Dr. Richard F. Haines, Los Altos, California; and Richard H. Hall (Fund for UFO Research), Brentwood, Maryland. The Steering Committee was chaired by John F. Schuessler of Houston, Texas. Officers elected in Pasadena were Richard F. Haines, Ph.D., Director; Henry H. McKay, Deputy Director; Peter Mazzola, Secretary; and Mrs. Ann Druffel, Treasurer.

The purposes of NAUFOF are embodied in the bylaws: (1) to unite UFO organizations in North America in a format of understanding, cooperation and harmony of efforts to study and resolve the UFO phenomenon; (2) to share info-

mation on UFO sightings and analyses; (3) to develop and utilize a standard UFO reporting form, which will result in the use of a standard vocabulary of ufology; (4) to produce a standard manual for documenting UFO reports; (5) to provide and maintain a computer file of UFO reports; (6) to establish an effective public relations committee whose sole purpose is to inform the media/public on new UFO reports, provide educational materials, respond to unfavorable propaganda immediately, provide names, addresses and telephone numbers of individuals within various organizations that are available for lectures, public appearances and writing contracts, and to promote the North American UFO Federation and ufology at every opportune time; (7) to establish a committee to represent the Federation at the national level in each country serviced by NAUFOF to promote the basic objectives of the organization; (8) to provide guidance on issues of technical and scientific importance and to resolve problems affecting unity and the goals of NAUFOF through the actions of the Executive Committee; and (9) to provide a forum for universal participation through NAUFOF.

The North American UFO Federation will work directly with the worldwide International Committee on UFO Research that met in High Wycombe, Buckinghamshire, England on August 26, 1983. Dr. J. Allen Hynek, representing the Center for UFO Studies and Michael Sinclair, representing the Mutual UFO Network, attended the meeting.


RETROSPECTIVE ON MUFON'S 1982 UFO SYMPOSIUM IN TORONTO

UFO'S AND THE MEDIA

From this issue onwards, this column will be smaller in its average size. Our new policy is to concentrate on new media shows or movies which are presented rather than rehashing old motion pictures or shows. This means that we will still mention that a movie or show was on, but we will not review it. We will not mention fictional movies at all.

The famous movie made for television, The UFO Incident, appeared on Wingham, Ontario's Channel 8 station CKNX on Sunday, September 11, 1983 at 11.40 p.m. This was a two-hour long semi-documentary dealing with the now famous Betty and Barney Hill CE4 of 1961.

The Toronto Star's TV guide magazine, Starweek, described the plot as follows: "A couple claim to have been taken aboard a spaceship and examined by extraterrestrial beings." A typical Starweek distortion of facts, as the Hills never claimed any such thing. All they knew was that they had seen something odd in the sky and there was a period of time for which they could not account during their drive home from holidays in Montreal. As you know and anyone seeing the movie can tell, only regressive hypnosis by the late Dr. Benjamin Simon brought out their experience on board the UFO.

CBS LIVES UP TO ITS REPUTATION

The Day the Earth Stood Still was presented on Channel 4, the CBS-TV Network affiliate in Buffalo, New York, with the call letters WIBV-TV, on Sunday,

September 25, 1983, at 1.30 p.m.

That, in itself is not unusual. The film is excellent and is purely science fiction, or fact disguised as fiction, some people might say.

What was unusual was that immediately after the film was over, the station presented a series of old newsreels dealing with space and related items. The first one of these was a 1950 newsreel from Fox Movietone. In it, the announcer described what was going on, i.e. a team of scientists inflating a large weather balloon. It looked suspiciously like a Skyhook balloon. A short piece of written dialogue spoken by the announcer went something like this: "Reports of flying saucers in many instances are due to people seeing the sun's rays reflect off this large balloon and it can appear like a saucer shape. When slightly deflated or only partially inflated, it looks like a flying saucer."

GOOD DOCUMENTARY REPEATED

That same day, at 11.45 p.m., London, Ontario's CFPL-TV presented the documentary, Mysteries From Beyond Earth. The Starweek magazine described it as a documentary and rated it good. Made in 1977, it was just that, good. But the magazine went on to link UFOs with the word "paranormal", clearly a misnomer for the phenomenon to anyone acquainted with the government documents on UFO incidents.

FOUR MEMBERS EXPELLED IN 6 YEARS

Only four persons have been expelled from CUFORN in the past six years of its existence. In the light of some inquiries about one of them, we offer readers a list of these persons. They are Michelle Alberti, Ken Baxter, Bill Sanderson and Les Cherni.

Baxter and Alberti's memberships were revoked in 1979, Cherni's in 1981 and Sanderson's in 1983. We were unable to persuade Cherni to return his membership card. It may be that he is still using it and misrepresenting himself as a CUFORN member. We're not sure about that.

We will not go into the reasons for their expulsion. Only Sanderson has been given exposure in the pages of the Bulletin.

Cherni, on the other hand, is the only one who has reacted with any extreme emotion to his expulsion. Cherni has spread false rumours about CUFORN's Co-Directors. He has tried to scare them with mild threats which the Directors have taken note of. We will institute legal proceedings against Cherni, if necessary.

Calling all aliens, turn your radio on

MUSCATINE, Iowa (UPI) — A radio station has begun broadcasting greetings into space with apologies if its transmission tower gets in the way of low-flying UFOs.

Steve Bridges, manager of KFMH radio, said yesterday his station began sending its message Wednesday and plans to broadcast it in 13 languages once a week.

Bridges said he became interested in UFO sightings after the station's tower fell last year. He said there were numerous reports of UFOs in the area at the time.

"Although I believe it was wind damage, I could not dismiss the callers as cranks," he said. "I started an investigation into UFO sightings and found there are more than 300 every year in the area."

"I don't know. But if anything else, this will be our insurance since we're raising our tower another 100 feet and who wants to be responsible for hurting any alien beings?"

CUFORN ENTERS SHUTTLE COMPETITION


CUFORN's Co-Director and Treasurer Harry Tokarz has submitted a proposal for an entry in the Canada in Space Getaway Special Competition. The item which would go aboard a future Shuttle mission is a working electromagnetic radiation detector device.

The entry is in the Public Category. Winning entry in each category gets a free trip to Cape Canaveral to see the launching of the Shuttle which will carry the entry into space.

The contest is sponsored jointly by Canada's National Research Council, Spar Aerospace Ltd. and Telesat Canada. They have asked for an experiment that will examine effects on a given payload of temperature extremes, weightlessness and the near-vacuum of space. Who knows maybe our entry will win?

The copy of the court documents is in the possession of CUFORN's Co-Director, Larry Fenwick.

According to Bill Moore, Stevens has been representing himself as Col. Wendelle Stevens of the U.S.A.F. Actually, Stevens had a low rank and was a ground mechanic in the U.S. Air Force.

- It seems capable of producing various forms of humanoid life.
- A human imprisoned in one saw what may have been scenes in another dimension.
- It can vanish instantly, perhaps having the same mechanism that enables UFOs to avoid detection screens on what must be numerous journeys to and from Earth.
- As an extra bonus, it is collapsible. Maybe that makes it handy luggage for our tourist-minded visitors!

Included with all these points are vivid eyewitness reports, yet remarkably until now this device has been almost a nonexistent item in UFO literature.

In another part that explores the mystery of cattle mutilation, Magor discusses the case of a Canadian farmer who almost ran into a nest of flying discs with mobile projecting arms. Since one of a neighbor's cows had been mysteriously marked, the farmer may have been the first person ever to see some of the mutilators' equipment.

Then we learn of incidents suggesting the mutilators rehearsed their methods over a remote section of western Canada well before moving on to the real business across the border.

Other sections of this surprising book focus on the aliens' search for electrical power and explain how they may have tried to communicate with us by light patterns.

Rarely have we been offered so much insight into our UFO visitors' activities and the enduring nature of their mission, which has now proved itself far more than a passing public fancy. To borrow words from an old song, they are here not for just an hour, not for just a day, not for just a year, but **always!**
