

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Huge cigar-shaped object scorches Israeli beach

feet (over 100 meters), and its width was about 15-20 meters. The general form is elongated.

On the tenth of August, 1989, in the late hours of the evening during a one hour period at the minimum, people from near Shikmona Beach phoned frantically to the Haifa police to report that a glowing, silent cigar-like UFO was hovering over the famous Shikmona area. The object hovered over that area for over an hour because the citizens calls to police lasted for over an hour. The witnesses described the object as a bright cigar-shaped silent object.

What is most striking is the location: exactly where the burning 'pillar of fire' fell on Passover, April 22nd, 1989, but a few meters (maybe 20) closer to the Haifa-Tel Aviv Road. You can see what I mean in the attached drawing (see front cover of this issue-Ed.)

This time the witnesses phoned the police-not me- so I learned about this event from the newspapers on August 13th, 1989. On the morrow, I went to the indicated place-and, indeed, I found a huge-but huge--scorch-the third scorch in that area.

Here are the dates of the three burns or scorches.(our readers are left to discern what these dates signify) and the pillar of fire: September 28, 1987-scorch; May 28, 1988-scorch; April 22, 1989-pillar of fire; and August 11, 1989-scorch.

All the characteristics of this third scorch were identical to the two former ones of September 28, 1987 and May 28, 1988. These were:

I also contacted the fire department in Haifa and asked if there have been any fires lately at the Shikmona area, but the answer of the Deputy Commander was negative.

1. Very sharp countours.
2. No cinder or burn signs on the stones.
3. Baked stones.
4. Melted (on top) plastic debris on the beach.
5. No smell of fire burn.

However, this scorch was so gigantic that it was impossible to discern the total area of the burnt area precisely. Its length was about 300

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Dr. Eric Arthur Walker, President of Penn State University, seen above, is, according to researchers Grant Cameron and T. Scott Crain, Jr. of MUFON, an important member of MJ-12 (Majestic or Majic), the U.S. government's above-top secret UFO investigation organization.

In last month's Bulletin, Larry Fenwick brought out some tantalizing details about the possible involvement of Dr. Eric Walker with the study and analysis of a crashed UFO, with probable alien occupants, during the early 1950's. Since that article was published, more information has come to light, particularly with the long-awaited publication of researchers Grant Cameron and T. Scott Crain, Jr.'s "Preliminary Report On The

Government's Involvement In UFO Crash Retrievals", entitled, "UFOs, MJ-12 And The Government".

This research paper is now in limited circulation amongst a handful of interested parties. I'm grateful that the UFONET BBS Network was also sent a copy. I have read it, and what follows is, in part, both an assessment and a recap of some of the highlights. Soon the paper will be ready for public

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distribution, so it won't be long before you can read and assess it for yourself.

Dr. Eric Walker has an impressive background, and one which would make even Stanton Friedman envious of him. He's listed in certain "Who's who" type compendiums, so a quick visit to the library might be in order for those of you wishing to see a chronological listing of this man's accomplishments. Credit for "discovering" him goes to Bill Steinman, co-author of "UFO Crash At Aztec". It was in a phone conversation with the late Dr. Robert Sarbacher (of Wilbert Smith memo fame), that Steinman got the break he needed in order to crack the identity of another one of those scientists who attended the Research & Development Board meetings in the early '50's, within the time frame of the much hypothesized UFO crash/retrievals which were said to have occurred back then.

Sarbacher, not remembering the name, alluded to a prominent individual from Pennsylvania who, unlike himself, attended all of the Research and Development Board meetings held at Wright Field. Shortly thereafter, in response to an enquiry by Steinman, he received a letter from Fred Darwin, Executive Director of the Guided Missile Committee for the Department of Defense's Research & Development Board from 1949 to 1954.

six names listed in letter

In the letter, six names were listed as possible candidates for a "hypothesized" flying saucer recovery operation. The list was composed in early 1984, before the release of the controversial MJ-12 documents. Five of the names matched names on the yet-to-be-released MJ-12 listing. One name didn't, that of Eric Arthur Walker...the person who most definitely fit the description given by Sarbacher. Later research revealed that Walker was at one time the Executive Secretary for the Research and Development Board during the time in question.

Along with other influential positions held by Walker, one of the most prominent and secretive concerns his relationship with the Institute for Defense Analysis, of which Paul Dickson, author of "Think Tanks" had this to say: "In the hierarchy of military tanks, none ranks higher than the Institute for Defense Analysis (IDA)." Walker joined in 1958, and never looked back. He was elected Chairman of the IDA in 1981, and became Chairman Emeritus in 1986, upon his official retirement. So, what is most problematic when it comes to trying to get Walker to talk, is that not only is this man privy to UFO secrets, but countless military secrets as well, which in this

instance are no doubt viewed as one and the same.

Walker's involvement

However, Walker is most vulnerable when it comes to his involvement in the early '50's, before the "security lid" started to clamp down on this subject. From the Cameron/Crain research paper, we learn little of what Walker's possible UFO related activities were in the period after this, although there is speculation. From their research, it is clear that if Walker were to be involved in the aftermath of a UFO crash, and possible U.S. government study thereof, he was in the right places at the right times. Along with this, there is the body of material, consisting of phone conversations and letter exchanges between Walker and certain UFO researchers, the primary one being, of course, Steinman.

Most damning are Walker's admission to Steinman (in a phone conversation written down ten minutes after the call that he knew of MJ-12. Says Walker, "Yes, I know of MJ-12. I have known of them for 40 years. I believe that you're chasing after and fighting with wind-mills!!".

Along with this, it's become apparent that Walker is engaged in playing a most peculiar "game" of some sort. One letter of Steinman's was returned by Walker with this statement typewritten at the end of his letter: "STOP! DON'T TRY TO FIND ME I CAME ON THAT MACHINE I WILL LEAVE MAY 15 ERGOT QUIET QUIET QUIET". Another letter was returned with numerals inscribed on top of various letters throughout. This is the so-called "code letter".

Another piece of documentary evidence is the typewritten letter by Walker to Steinman, signed by Walker, describing how four alien bodies were recovered alive from a downed UFO. However, this is so sensationally written that researchers Cameron and Crain have labelled this as a poor attempt at disinformation...or perhaps a continuation of Walker's "game" with the researchers.

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However, in the past year or so, Walker seems to have taken a new tack. Over the phone, he now denies ever even knowing who Steinman is. This occurred in a December, 1988 call to Walker by Steinman. Walker had evidently clammed up, and was now even trying to deny ever having dealt with Steinman, let alone the allegations relating to his UFO involvement.

Something indeed strange is going on. Most recently, I learned that a photo-copy of the original "code letter" was mailed to researcher Scott Crain in a SASE Crain provided in a much earlier letter sent to Walker. Evidently, the game has resumed.

phone conversation

Crain received this in late August, after I had spoken with Walker himself in a phone conversation on August 11th. Although cordial throughout, Walker lived up to his billing as both evasive in answering questions, and one who, it seems, experiences convenient memory loss. Witness the following exchange, which took place mid-way through our phone conversation:

(WALKER) "{garbled)...well I did attend a lot of meetings, but I can't remember any substantive conclusions or anything like that".

(MICKUS) "Right, and as far as what was discussed there?"

(WALKER) "As far as the what?"

(MICKUS) "What was discussed, the topic, the subject matter of those meetings?"

(WALKER) "No, I couldn't remember that at all."

(MICKUS) "But, you're saying that it had nothing to do with UFOs or alien bodies, or anything like this?"

(WALKER) "Well, I don't have any alien bodies in my office, I can tell you that."

In his own limited conversations with Walker back in 1984, Stanton Friedman referred to Walker as "cagey and careful", and stated that "My reaction to how he answered the various questions was that he knew a great deal". Five years later, I concur.

Currently under way, researchers Cameron and Crain are trying to enlist the aid of several media outlets, including some within Pennsylvania itself. Sadly, and not surprisingly, in the hands of the media, their report is going nowhere fast. At this point, most promising in this regard, is the involvement of a slick on-campus magazine, who currently are sitting on this story, and, if all goes according to plan, will confront Walker in the next couple of weeks. Both UFONET and CUFORN will be following all the developments as they occur, and will be updating this in the next issue of the CUFORN Bulletin.

So far, I've only touched on a few of the facts made clear in the Cameron/Crain report. However, I would be remiss if I didn't mention that their report covers more than just the story of Eric Walker, which takes up about 80 pages. There are also interesting pieces of information, also related to Walker, describing the U.S. military/intelligence complex.

And along with information on DARPA, the Jason Group, and other such institutions, there are tidbits of information, much of it documented, regarding a whole bevy of UFOlog figures. Included are Wilbert Smith, Bill Moore, Richard Doty, Linda Howe, Stanton Friedman, Todd Zechel, Lee Graham, Bill Cooper, and several others.

If any criticism can be made of the report and there are a few, it's that it was too wide in its scope, and, as a consequence, particular sections didn't get dealt with adequately. Thus, the enormity of the task, coupled with the constant influx of new information, were in large measure responsible for the delay in having this paper published.

As I alluded to earlier, this paper will be made publicly available soon. If you're at all interested in the subject, you'll want to read it for yourself. It's one more contribution to the massive body of evidence that the U.S. government is indeed covering up its knowledge and activities with regard to the subject of UFOs.

Artificially made radioactive element may be present in residue left by 'pillar of fire' in Israel on April 22, 1989

JULY 4, 1989 REPORT on WHITE POWDER ANALYSIS

This brief report updates the report of July 4, 1989 wherein a white powder was supplied to the author by Mr. H. Tokarz of Toronto for compositional analysis.

In that report it was suggested that apparent measurement artifacts in the X-Ray Fluorescence (XRF) method produced spurious results. Additional XRF measurements reported herein have largely cleared up the initial confusion and added several elements to the original list.

The enclosed plots Fig. C-1 and C-2 are taken from a Tracor XRF detector and a PGT detector respectively. They show no elements lower than Chlorine as discussed in the July 4 report. However, they confirm initial measurements and show trace quantities of the following elements:

Fe	Iron	Cu	Copper
Zn	Zinc	As	Arsenic
Nb	Niobium	Mo	Molybdenum
In	Indium	Sb	Antimony

Possible additional elements are Kr (Krypton), Rb (Rubidium), Tc (Technetium), and Ag (Silver).

The additional notations $K\alpha$ and $K\beta$ represent the energy lines associated with the particular element and the numbers represent their energies in KeV.


The plot Fig. C-3 is from a Jeol electron microscope at an independent lab using a Tracor detector and shows the Iron, Copper, Niobium and Molybdenum trace quantities clearly. What is still puzzling is why these do not show up in the U. of Toronto plot in the July 4 report.

Of great significance is the presence of Technetium if it can be confirmed. This element is not present in the crust of the earth!

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is an update on the analysis presented in Vol. 10, No. 3, May-June, 1989. Also, according to George Hathaway, in sum, the elements are not used in any earth-based satellites or rockets, nor, in total, are they found in aircraft or meteorites. Technetium is an artificially produced radioactive element which can make steel or iron alloys...




3 speakers stun audience at 1989 MUFON Symposium

The 1989 MUFON UFO Symposium held at the Aladdin Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada from June 30 through July 2, 1989, was probably the most thought-provoking symposium ever presented by the organization.

Estimates of attendance ranged from 500 to 1,000, depending on who one spoke to. As I was unable to attend, what follows is all second-hand, primarily from the Proceedings, Co-Director Harry Tokarz and CUFORN member Tom Mickus, who were there.

Omitted from the Proceedings publication were several speeches, by William L. (Bill) Moore, John Lear, and Bill Cooper. These were the three most interesting speeches.

Bill Moore's speech, entitled "UFOs and The U.S. Government, Part 1", contained an admission by him that he was a "freelancer" for Richard Doty of the U.S. Air Force's Office of Special Investigations. Moore said he provided "information on" physicist Paul Bennewitz's "current thinking and activities". Bennewitz had theories on what the government was doing in connection with UFOs--largely based on disinformation given by the government. Moore emphasized "I had nothing whatsoever to do with the counterintelligence and the disinformation." His statement caused quite a furor both during and after his speech.

The reaction was most vehement, with some members of the audience booing and calling Moore names. He had to be escorted quickly out of the Symposium to avoid further problems. Many people who had been suspicious of Moore had their suspicions reinforced by what he said. This was despite his denial of any direct role in spreading disinformation. Considering that Moore's speech was the best he had ever given, it was a shame that the audience zeroed in on only one part of it and paid less attention to the rest of it. John Lear made the audience sit up and take notice on Sunday morning, July 2, when he presented a showing of a motion picture of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Although we cannot vouch for its authenticity, it may have been the Benjamin Zapruder film taken at Dealey Plaza in Dallas, Texas.


What makes this special is that there is a segment of the film just at the moment before the shot came from Oswald in which we clearly see the Secret Service agent driving the Kennedy car turn around and fire a shot into Kennedy's forehead with what looks like a blow-gun--the kind that contains poison. This section of film takes only a few seconds and was, if this is the Zapruder film, deliberately taken out of the movie when it was shown on television in the U.S.

The name of the Secret Service agent is William Greer. According to John Lear, Greer and another Secret Service agent visited him before the showing of the film and told him that no one would believe that the film was genuine even if they saw it. They laughed and walked away from Lear's doorstep. Lear says the reason JFK was killed was that he was going to dismantle the MJ-12 group.

Five teens observed UFO – a CE2 in Massachusetts

Five teen-age boys were walking and talking one night on Cook Street in East Douglas, Massachusetts, U.S.A. in the early autumn of 1973 or 1974. The time was 9.15 p.m. when they saw a ~~big UFO almost~~ above them only about 30 feet away.

According to CUFORN member Alan Garner, the only one who filled out a sighting report Form, he and Mark Dautrich, along with three others whose names they cannot recall, suddenly "heard a booming sound. Immediately materializing out of nowhere there was a huge UFO. It had numerous multi-colored lights which faded on and off."

"buzzing sound"

"There was a buzzing sound like millions of bees and an intense heat and smell. I felt very peculiar. We were just standing there looking at it. It was slowly coming straight at us and the water (in the Mumford River) grew more and more troublesome the closer it got. Somewhat shouted 'Let's get the hell out of here!', and we ran to the top of the hill and told the police. Chief Clifford Balov(now Health Inspector) and Deputy John Kislak(now Chief) were outdoors pointing

at the object which we could see even at this distance(800 feet). They acknowledge its presence and radioed to someone. We went on to the school dance and told everyone what we had seen. Plenty of weird phenomena has plagued me ever since, including telepathy, spooks, poltergeist, et

The object was triangular, appeared solid and metallic, and it gave off an odor of hydrogen sulphide. It exuded heat which was noticed although the temperature that night was 70 degrees Fahrenheit. The object hovered for from one to three minutes, then floated down. The boys watched the object continuously on that clear night. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 12**

NEW MUFON FORM DRAFT

Readers interested in improved sighting report forms can obtain the new MUFON UFO Event Spread Sheet from that group. It includes a 22-item list of details. 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It appeared to be solid, with sharp edges. The pulsation of the lights on it seemed to be matched by the buzzing sound. The object looked as though it was as large as a basketball court if you could hold it at arm's length. It was moving at about five miles per hour when it descended and seemed to be "wedged between the river's banks". When it reached its lowest position, "the river was swirling below it".

The UFO had "rods" extending a yard or so out of it, according to Garner. The lights on the object were flashing and intense.

Garner said he "was stunned. My whole body fell asleep (like when the blood flow is cut off in a limb). I felt as though they were watching me, not my comrades."

None of the five observers wore eyeglasses. It was a clear night, with low humidity, said Garner. The UFO was at a 90 degree angle above the horizon, he noted, during the sighting. Garner said that the object had "lights all over it. It had no visible seams".

Garner is now 30 and is a medical technician. He has excellent vision and hearing. He has one year of college education.

He said he had had five sightings in all, with one incident in which he had a "missing time" episode of 24 hours. CUFORN has referred him to Budd Hopkins in regard to this incident. He also said he had been questioned after two of his encounters by men presenting what seemed to be official credentials--by two men once and by three men on another occasion. He said "they were very adamant about the incidents."

He said his knowledge of UFOs came only from other persons discussing the subject with him. He was indifferent about the UFO subject before his observation. He added that, when the boys were looking at the object, it was slightly to the southeast of them. He mentioned that the East Douglas Police had written a report on the incident, but has been unable to get a copy of the police handwritten notes. The notes are now stored in the attic of the police station, he said. He said he would try to get them in the near future.

Dear Editor;

I am a new member so I don't really know what CUFORN has been doing in the way of investigation. However, it sounds quite extensive. I have a few questions.

Does anyone really think there are either alien or joint U.S. Government/alien bases in operation? If so, would it be possible to set up a way to monitor these "bases" and obtain information on them? I've heard of bases located in (under) Dulce, New Mexico and the other one mentioned by "Condor" on that UFO TV special, near Groom Lake on the Nevada Test Site.

Is there any way (don't ask me where the money would come from) that if more investigation proved the time was worth it, that a nearby house could be used to try to pick some more info up--maybe magnetic field disruptions or radio signals. Who knows what kinds of tests could be conducted from a nearby location (50 miles away). I don't think anything permanent could be set up much closer than that to the area.

I have noticed a few things about the test site. Most of this is most likely related to their primary job--testing nukes. The Nevada Test Site is the only one of its kind I know of, so there's really nothing to compare it to. However, in the USOC book "Universal Service Order Codes" for Nevada Bell Telephone, which serves the Test Site, many extremely high speed fiber optic and microwave services are listed for use at the Test Site. For example, DS-6 digital lines and many other services. Of course, these are used at many military installations and most likely have a need at the Test Site. The USOC codes I mentioned is like the menu of services the phone company provides and is how the computers refer to the service for billing & repair. A regular telephone line is a 2MB or 1MB, meaning regular flat or measured business phone line. The Test Site also had 2 telephone prefixes of their own (since discontinued). These communications could be used for an alien base. I'm not expecting answers. I just want to throw the questions out for discussion.
