

# "Scientist" describes UFO propulsion system; claims "hands-on" experience in Nevada

Robert Lazar, 31, of Los Alamos, New Mexico appeared in a nine-part series of interviews on KLAS-TV, in Las Vegas, Nevada in November, 1989, claiming to have first-hand knowledge of nine alien spacecraft being tested at Area 51 at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada.


We present in this issue a summary of what he had to say. If it is true, it is a breakthrough in UFO research. If not, it shows to what lengths the U.S. Government will go to spread disinformation. We leave it to you to decide whether he is telling the truth.

Lazar says he has degrees in electrical engineering from Pierce College in California and in nuclear physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He worked at Sandia Labs and at the Los Alamos National Laboratories. He presently owns an electrical engineering consulting company. Lazar says that after he first appeared on

KLAS, the Navy destroyed his birth records, his job records, and his college records. When Stanton Friedman asked Lazar to send him his curriculae vitae, Lazar said he would do so, but as of this writing has not done so. Even if his records were destroyed, surely Lazar would have some records at his home of his college degrees.

Lazar reputedly worked at Area S4, south of Area 51 at Groom Lake, Nevada. He told real estate appraiser Gene Huff of Las Vegas

about his initial debriefing and job application and the stiff security requirements employed in his hiring. Stanton Friedman says he checked and found out that there are no records of any Gene Huff being an appraiser of real estate in Las Vegas.

Lazar gave several reasons for going to the media with his story. For some undisclosed reason, he had tried to get a copy of his birth certificate. "As it turned out it wasn't there any more, that I wasn't born at the hospital, and that kind of got me wondering what's going on." He couldn't get other information on his previous jobs as well and "I thought something had to be done before I disappeared."

**"we have these craft"**

He said "look at the magnitude of what was going on". He added that "the overview of what happened just cannot be a secret from anyone--not just the American people, but the rest of the world. Let out the basic fact that we have these craft. At one time aliens did at least visit and drop off something, that there was some contact made." He said "it's just unfair, outright, not to put it in the hands of the overall scientific community. There are people much more capable of dealing with this information, and by this time would have gotten a lot further along than this small select group of people working out in the middle of the desert. They don't


even have the facilities, really, to completely analyze what they're dealing with."

His final reason was that he was worried for his life. "The idea was for me to release the information, essentially to protect myself and take some of the heat off. And I've done that. And that's all that needs to be done, really." He said it is a little "bit of insurance". Huff had said that the Navy's security checks included "random" visits to Lazar's house. "They threaten his life; they'd threaten his wife's life."

**saw nine UFOs**

Lazar said he saw nine UFOs at S4. Three had been dismantled for analysis, one had crashed in August, 1981, one was damaged, and the other four were intact. He said the damaged one "looked like it was hit with some sort of projectile. It had a large hole in the bottom and a large hole in the top with the metal bent out like some sort of large-calibre 4- or 5-inch projectile had gone through it." He said he "gave everything simple names--the "top hat" one and the "Jello mold", and the "sports model" which operated without any hitches at all. I mean, it looked new, if I know what a new flying saucer looks like."

Area 51, north of S4 is not as secret as the television show said it was. It is known by various nicknames--"Dreamland"; and "The Skunk Works", and is written about in the book "Dreamland: A New Age of Flight Testing", by Richard Adams Locke, Aero Books, 1985. It includes photos

Lazar described the "sports model"'s test flight. (see the Nov.-Dec., 1989 CUFORN Bulletin.) He said "there's no action reaction system to it. There's no, like in a jet engine, exhaust gas being thrown out-no propeller, no noise. It's just, for all intents and purposes, magic."

The propulsion system was described by Lazar during the "On the Record" TV show, KLAS-TV on December 12, 1989. The half-hour show was produced by George Knapp, who also hosted it.

The first thing he did was have hands-on experience with the anti-matter reactor, which convinced him that the technology was not from Earth. The reactor consists of a "plate about 18 inches in diameter with a sphere on top." The sphere has a removable cover. The reactor is in the middle portion of the disk. "Inside the reactor" which forms a tower, is a chip of element 11 which they just put in there. "That's a super-heavy element. 11 sets up a gravitational field around the top." The wave guide is placed on top to siphon off the gravity wave. "It's later amplified in the lower portion of the craft." It has no detectable working parts.


### anti-matter reactor

The anti-matter reactor or generator produces "an annihilation reaction. It's an extremely powerful reaction, a 100 percent conversion of matter to energy, unlike a fission or fusion reaction which is somewhere around 8/10 of one percent conversion of matter to energy. Once the 115 is put in, the reaction is initiated. There's no button to push or anything," said Lazar.

He explained further. "Apparently, the 115 under bombardment with protons lets out an anti-matter particle. This anti-matter particle will react with any matter whatsoever, which I imagine there is some target system inside the reactor. This, in turn, releases heat, and somewhere within that system there is a 100 percent efficient thermionic generator, essentially a heat-to-electrical generator."

He pointed out that the "react

serves two purposes; it provides a tremendous amount of electrical power, which is almost a by-product. The gravitational wave gets formed at the sphere, and that's through some action of the 115, and the exact action I don't think anyone really knows."

"The wave guide siphons off that gravity wave, and that's channeled above the top of the disk (and then down) to the lower part where there are three gravity amplifiers which amplify and direct that gravity wave--in effect creating their own gravitational field," he explained.

"When they want to travel to a distant point, the disk turns on its side. The three gravity generators produce a gravitational beam. What (the aliens) do is converge the three gravity generators onto a point and use that as a focal point; and they bring them up to power and pull that point towards the disk. The disk itself will attach onto that point and snap back--as they release space back to that point. All this happens in the distortion of time, so time is not incrementing. So the speed is essentially infinite." (Editor's note: The generators, if focussed on a human being, could cause time to stand still, thus accounting for the "missing time" reported by abductees.)

When he first saw the reactor operate, his friend Barry \_\_\_\_\_ put the fuel in the reactor and put the lid on it. "Immediately, a gravitational field developed, and he said "Feel it!" And it felt like you bring two like poles of a magnet together. It's impossible to do that except on something with great mass. And it was a repulsion field. We threw golf balls off it. And it was a really unique thing.

In another demonstration, they were able to channel the field off to create an intense gravitational area. "And you began to see a little black disk form, and that was the bending of the light."

His fellow scientists there demonstrated the effects on time. "They lit a candle and put it in the distorted gravitational field, and the candle just stood there. It didn't melt or burn. It was really unbelievable," he said. "This is really alien technology."

Lazar explained what is known about gravity. "Gravity is a wave. There are many different theories, wave included. It's been theorized that gravity is also particles, gravitons. The basic wave they can actually tap off of an element; why that is I'm not exactly sure."

Lazar went on to point out that "gravity

distorts time and space. Just like if you had a water bed and put a bowling ball in the middle. It warps it down like that-- that's exactly what happens to space."

The physicist asks us to "imagine that you were in a spacecraft that could exert a tremendous gravitational field by itself. You could sit on any particular place and turn on the gravity generator and actually warp space and time, and fold it. By shutting that off, you'd click back and you'd be a tremendous distance from where you were, but time would not have even moved because you essentially shut it off," he said. Knapp commented that scientists now "regard it as theory only." Lazar said "as stubborn as the scientific community is, they'll never buy it. But this is, in fact, just what happens."

### ***distorting time***

Knapp asked how this technology would affect life on earth. Lazar said that if it was widely available "and mass-producible, you have a completely different mode of travel. What happens when you play with time? That gets into a really deep philosophical question there." Nevertheless, he added, "it would change absolutely everything." Producing your own gravity, said Lazar, would "allow you to do virtually anything. You can distort time and space" and "almost bring your destination to you without moving. And since you're distorting time, all this takes place in between moments of time." Knapp said this effectively would silence UFO skeptics who say that life from other planets could not come here because of the distances involved. This kind of technology makes such considerations irrelevant about distance and time." Lazar said it would not mean that you could go forward or backward in time, however.

The potential of the anti-matter-producing property of 115 in terms of weapons is "absolutely staggering", Lazar said. Aside from being able to produce a lot of power, "2.2 pounds or one kilogram is the energy equivalent of 47 10-megaton hydrogen bombs." It would be about the size of an orange, Lazar noted. "Comparing the energy potential of anti-matter to, say, the Hoover Dam, would be like comparing planets to grains of sand. 115 could also make one heck of a bomb.", said Knapp.

Knapp said the danger associated with 115 and anti-matter may be the reason Lazar was

hired to work at S4. Lazar said there was an accident there in April, 1987, which the media was told was an unannounced nuclear test. Lazar said "Some people got killed. I was told flat out I was one of the people that were to replace these guys."

Knapp said the military potential of alien technology may be the reason the government is keeping the whole matter a secret. Lazar feels that the Soviet Union was once part of the U.S. research on the flying disks, but that the Americans kicked out the Soviets after making some sort of discovery. According to Knapp, Lazar believes the S4 program is operated with money allocated to SDI or Star Wars research, but Lazar cannot prove that.


### ***"115 is impossible"***

In answer to speculation that the American government developed all this technology on its own, Lazar answers that the "115 is impossible. And the fact that the main job of everyone there is to find out how everything's made; I mean that just contradicts everything right off the bat. The materials are completely alien to us and just the overall idea of the project is: Can, we duplicate this with materials that we have here? So, obviously, it was something that was found or given and we're just trying to duplicate it.

Lazar says the U.S. Government has 500 pounds of 115 and it cannot be made on Earth. Element 115 cannot be found on the periodic chart of elements. It can be stored in lead casings. It's a super-heavy element. The periodic chart of elements lists all the elements found on Earth, said Lazar, and all those that can be synthesized. Synthetic elements are only listed up to 106.

"From 103 or anything higher than plutonium, the half-life begins to drop; in other words, the element disintegrate. When you get up to element 106, it's only around for a very small amount of time. Even science today," said Lazar, theorizing that up around elements 113 to 116, they should again become stable. This is in fact true. That's what 115 is. It's stab

To synthesize it would be impossible. The way we synthesize heavy elements is, we take a stable element like bismuth or plutonium, put it in an accelerator, and bombard it with protons. Essentially what you're trying to do is plug in protons into the atoms and increase the atomic number. To do that to the level of element 115 would just take an infinite amount of power and an infinite amount of time," he said.

Knapp asked Lazar where 115 could have come from. Lazar replied that "the only place that 115 could be made would have to be in a natural situation, somewhere maybe on the fringes of a supernova or somewhere around maybe a binary star system, where there was more mass in the primordial mix of that system, where heavier elements would have had a chance to form, when the stars were collapsing and there were huge amounts of energy being released. It's something along these lines; it has to be a naturally-occurring element."

### **strange information**

Lazar saw reports on much of what he was to work on. He said "there was lots of strange information in the reports, but then again it's just printed material and it could be disinformation. I don't know. But certainly the information I did read in the reports about 115, the disks, the grav--I mean, that all had material that related to that. The reports went into aliens and even went along the lines of religious--." Knapp asked him what were the government reports about aliens.

Lazar answered: "There were photographs of aliens.

There were autopsy reports. There was really a wealth of information." He said the aliens looked like "the typical "grey." I hate to say that, like anyone knows what a typical grey is. It's a creature, probably three and a half to four feet tall, a large hairless head, black, slanted eyes, long arms, very thin-looking. I don't know how else I would describe them."

Knapp asked what was included in the autopsy reports he read. Lazar said "the reason I call it an autopsy report is that I saw the carcass--it was obviously a dead alien--carcass cut up and it was all dark inside like it had an iron base. The reason I say iron is because it was very dark blood or whatever. I'm not a doctor, but it seemed to be one large organ in the body, as opposed to identifiable heart and lungs and that sort of thing, but just one gooey mess in it."

"What did the report say?" asked Knapp. It had pictures; it had to have some words: "Here's Exhibit A, an alien." The physicist replied: "Essentially so." They had weights and densities of the organs, said there were no conclusions drawn, but it was just a basic description of what the person who was cutting open the body saw."

Where did they come from? "In one of the reports it said they came from Reticulum 4. I'm told it's a star system in Zeta Reticuli. Reticulum is the constellation. And by Reticulum 4, they meant the fourth planet out from that sun. In the same reports, we were identified--instead of saying Earth, we were identified as "Sol 3," meaning the third planet out from our sun," replied Lazar.

The interviewer asked if Lazar might be mixing up what he'd read about UFOs with what he learned at S4. Lazar said "No. That's why I stay away from the UFO researchers and things like that. I really don't want to be associated with that. I don't research the stuff. It's interesting to read, but, no, I'm not mixing anything that I've read into this stuff."

Why is Lazar reluctant to get involved with the UFO field any further? He said

"I don't know. There are so many stories circulating around. Everyone has their own view. Each UFO researcher says they have the right story. And essentially, I don't want to side with anyone because I don't know where that information's come from, although they do all have the basic story; you know, there are alien crafts here; how they got here is, probably aliens brought them here, unless we really have a neat setup with the UPS (United Parcel Service)."

"There's just so many different factions of them (UFO researchers), and they all kind of war between each other; I really don't want to get associated with them."

(Editor's Note: There just as many debates amongst mainstream scientists and some of them refuse to get involved in controversies.)

### **another reason**

He went on to give another reason why he will not get involved with ufologists. "How many people are you going to open up your background to and let them run rampant through it? I mean, private detectives, every UFO-group in the world wants to do that! The idea was for me to release the information, essentially to protect myself and take some of the heat off. And I've done that. And that's all that needs to be done, really."

Knapp said "certain UFO researchers claim they've been getting information from you all along; you've been leaking stuff to them; and that they've read these reports that verify the information. (Editor's Note: Knapp is most likely referring to John Lear here, although Lear claims he has another source at S4) You have been working with UFO groups while you were in the program at S4?"

Lazar replied: "Not UFO groups. I did mention a couple of things to some people. That's all I'm going to say."

"Before you got into the program at S4, though," said Knapp, "you had an interest in UFOs. It must be hard for people to swallow that here's a guy who has an interest in it and he gets hired into the program."

Lazar replied: "Well, there was a very brief time there I had sent out resumés to several places, and I wanted to get back into the scientific field again. Almost simultaneously, I met John Lear and read some of his material. And initially, I thought he was just absolutely crazy. But, apparently, he did have a good

source of information because, as it turns out, some of the information that he had I actually had hands-on experience with."

Knapp: "But your regard for UFOs in general: As a scientist, did you think there was something to it?"

Lazar: "Absolutely not."

Knapp: "Absolutely nothing?"

lazar: "No. I would have stood on that until the day I died."

CUFORN has had no access to the part of the series on Lazar broadcast on November 14, 1989. In it, he explained more about element 115, time warp and its relation to gravity waves, the production of gravity waves, and the military potential of this alien technology. Knapp deleted this from the two-hour show, entitled "UFOs: The Best Evidence", by dismissing the material as merely "details." Later, Knapp graciously said, "I apologize."

### **death threats**


For those concerned with locations, Area S1, including S4, is 10 to 15 miles south of Groom Lake, about 125 miles north of Las Vegas, Nevada. Lazar was hired to work there as a senior staff physicist. Lazar has an unpublished telephone number. When he was hired, he was told he was to keep his mouth shut about his work. He said this included "everything up to death threats. I mean constant reminders of it, signing away my constitutional rights for fair trial." He believes his telephone is tapped. "I have a tap detector, and occasionally, after I pick up the phone, a little red light goes on," he said.

Knapp asked if anything has happened to him since the reports went on the air. He said: "They let me know they were around by doing stupid, childish little things. But nothing serious, no."

How long have the UFOs been at S4? Lazar said: "It seems like quite a while, but I really don't know."

Lazar summed up the S4 research: "It's the most secret program in the United States."

Before Lazar saw the "sports model" in operation, he said he suspected it came from someplace other than Earth. He had this confirmed the first time he got to look inside the disk.

"I got to look inside and it had really small chairs. That was just a shocking thing because everytime before that I was able to label it: This is just a little advance that a group of scientists had formed and, you know, they're keeping it secret, and, yeah, we could have built a big disk like that, that's no problem, and, you know, we could have adapted it to make it fly, but why does it have little furniture inside? And things just began to click together just all too fast."

He described a test flight of the "sports model". "The bottom of it glowed and began to hiss like any, like high voltage does on a round sphere. It's my impression that the reason they're round and have no sharp edges is to contain the high voltage. If you've seen a high voltage system's insulators-- things are round or else you get a corona discharge. In either case, it began to hiss as in high voltage and it lifted off the ground quietly except for that little hiss in the background, and that stopped as soon as it reached about 20 or 30 feet."

He said the test flight was a short one. It made just a few moves before setting back down. He did not see who was flying it, according to Knapp.

Is Lazar telling the truth? Well, he was


subjected to a series of lie detector tests arranged by Knapp. Polygraph examiners include former Los Angeles Police officer and now owner of a corporate investigative firm Terry Tavernetti. A total of four tests were done, but no conclusive statement has been forthcoming from the examiners as a whole, because Lazar was operating under a cloud of fear which would invalidate test results. He was afraid of the possible consequences of his release of the S4 information initially, and this fear lingered on sufficiently to affect the test results.

Another person Knapp used to try to verify Lazar's claims was hypnotherapist Layne Keck. Licensed and experienced, Keck privately tried to help Lazar recall details of the many briefings papers he said he read on the first day on the job.

Keck said "I had no clue as to what we were getting to. He started saying that there were pictures of what I thought he was saying were "desks" on the wall. Well, it turns out, it was "disks" that he was referring to. And, at that moment, I realized we were into something that was pretty heavy."

Keck is aware that people can lie under hypnosis, but he says the technique can also be of help in uncovering the truth. Keck said the hypnotic sessions told him "that his subconscious mind believes totally all of these things." Keck is convinced that someone did mess with Lazar's head, possibly using mind control techniques and chemicals. Lazar, too, had suspected that his employers had used primitive fear and other techniques on him.

When Lazar had mentioned under hypnosis that he had seen pictures of disks on the walls at S4, he was asked to describe the pictures in more detail. "There were these posters all over the place. They had a drawing of the "sports model" in the air. And underneath were the words "They're here." And they had these posters on the walls everywhere. They were just posters, like the kind you'd buy at the K-Mart stores." He laughed as he said this on camera.

Lazar had gone to Keck on his own when he realized that there were things that he saw or read at S4 that were only vague memories.

There are many applications of the alien technology which we should mention here. First of all, if science and industry could have full access to it, there would be a complete revamping of the world's economy. Such resources as oil, gas and coal would be obsolete as would nuclear power generating plants. They would be replaced by anti-matter generators which could power automobiles and other forms of transportation. This would eliminate a major source of pollution and its resultant illnesses on the planet. Conversion of the world's industry to manufacture of the generators would mean a major overhaul of production facilities.

It would take years, possibly decades to completely change over to the new source of power. In order to avoid massive unemployment all the workers in the resource production segments of industry would have to be retrained to work with the new technology. This, in turn, would mean that educational institutions would teach different trades--fewer trades, in fact.

Travel would be instantaneous throughout the planet. The logistics of designating who could travel where and when would be an enormous task, initially. Space travel would be a reality overnight, and the entire universe would become open for tourists and scientists alike. The military implications are too mind-boggling to contemplate. Whoever had the head start in developing UFOs for the military would rule the planet.

At the moment, it is in the best interests of the military-industrial complex to keep the UFO technology hidden from the general public, until a long-range plan can be formulated to introduce the technological revolution to the Earth. Complete economic collapse could ensue, otherwise. Those nations powerless. The Arab states oil would be useless.

Given the potential changes such technology could engender, it is no wonder there has been a cover-up of the truth about the UFO data.

Providing Lazar is telling the truth, it is

not surprising that UFO witnesses have been discredited and the Government has lied to the public.

George Knapp stated that the TV station knows of others who have knowledge of the goings-on at S4. Knapp said his station "has communicated with several other people who say they know of the saucer program."

"A technician in a highly sensitive position," said Knapp, "told us it is 'common knowledge among those with high security clearances that recovered alien disks are stored at the Nevada test site.' A Las Vegas professional, who once served in the military, and was stationed at the test site, said he saw a flying disk land outside the boundaries of Area 51--that it was quickly surrounded by security personnel and he was taken away and debriefed for several hours."

"A man who once worked at Groom Lake as a technician, at our request, wrote this letter explaining how he inadvertently walked into the wrong hangar and saw what appeared to be a large metallic disk under a tarp. It was being examined by men in lab coats," said Knapp.

"And, an airman who worked at Nellis at a radar installation says he and his fellow servicemen watched over a period of five nights, unusual objects flying over the Groom Mountains. He says the radar images indicated the objects zoomed into range at speeds of 7,000 miles per hour and then would stop on a dime (suddenly), and that nothing we have is capable of doing that. The airman says that when word of his sighting got out, he was ordered to turn off his radar sensors for that area and told to keep quiet about the matter because it did not happen."

Lazar says the people who run this project, "whether it really is the Navy or they just say that, apparently have executive power-- they don't report to anyone."

Lazar was asked if he thought all the data would ever come out in public. He answered, "Personally, no." What did he hope would happen? He replied: "There's been enough thorns put in their toes to where they do try and release something."

## Something "fishy" in Carp

In early March, 1990, your editor received an anonymous two page type-written story and two photographs supposedly recounting a crash-retrieval of a UFO in a swamp in Carp, Ontario, just outside Ottawa, Canada's capital.

The outlandish scenario painted by the author might have been scrapped by some ufologists as a piece of dis-information. CUFORN decided to check into the details of the story. So far we have had corroboration by several eyewitnesses to something strange seen on the date in question, November 4, 1989. Investigators Bob Graham, Arthur Bray and Clive Nadin were assigned to the case. Graham sent us a copy of his five page story which he first sent to Bray. To save space, we'll summarize what's been found out so far.

Graham is a Field Representative for a farmers organization so he used the cover story when interviewing people that he was probing a story of cattle being disturbed in the area.

The event occurred just east of the intersection of Corkery Road and Old Almont Road, according to the aerial map sent anonymously to us. Graham's witnesses confirmed the location. Dianne Labenek said there had been helicopter activity over the swamp on that weekend. Joanna Cogswell recalled as many as six 'copters flying over the swamp on November 4. Mrs. Labenek said that, about dusk, 5 to 5.30 p.m., Sat., Nov 4, several 'copters of different kinds had hovered over the trees in the swamp, moving up and down, using their searchlights. They left about 8 p.m. Shortly after she saw a blinding light, "brighter than lightning", that lit up the interior of her house. It was steady and lasted two minutes. Bob Fallak said local farmer Amer Howie's cattle stampeded and bawled all that night. Ian ar Joanne Cogswell remembered seeing the light. Three people recalled their dogs being disturbed that night.

It is noteworthy that 8 p.m. was the exact time mentioned in the mysterious article when Canadian military radar picked up the UFO's landing. The investigation is continuing.

# Guard at shopping center pies something strange

At 4:30 a.m. Thursday, some "thing" walked through the Colossal Palms Shopping Center. Whatever it was, it was big and ugly enough to scare the daylights out of the night watchman, who ran from the center and alerted police.

## Police help him hunt for 'alien being'

The result was one of the most unusual police reports ever seen, complete with a composite sketch

of the "thing" drawn by the guard, whom police identified as 27-year-old Tony Arias.

Arias described the "thing" as being 7 feet 5 inches tall, weighing 150 pounds, bald, with a "big head and cat eyes."

The sketch he drew for police resembles some sort of alien. On the bottom of the drawing, officer Juan Santana wrote: "This sketch was provided by the reporter. We are not joking, this is what he drew."

"I've been on the force for 18 years and this is one of the weirdest reports I've ever read," said Sgt. Joe Wyche of Metro's Kendall station.

Arias works the midnight shift at the mall, 13601 S. Dixie Highway. He has no phone at home and could not be reached for comment.

The phone number listed for his employer, King Security, was disconnected.

According to police, Arias called at 4:30 a.m. and officer Santana responded. Arias immediately told Santana he had not

been drinking, then tried to explain what he had seen.

Santana wrote: "Upon my rival an extensive search was conducted for the described 'thing' with negative results. Reporter thinks he also saw two other 'things' with the first one."

Wyche said there isn't much police can do about Arias' bizarre sighting.

"My first thought was that was someone in some kind of scary costume," Wyche said. "But I just don't know. Whatever he saw shook him up enough to call us."

There are no plans to open a special hot line for any additional sightings of the thing, police said.
