




Woman reports 1989 Western Canada close encounter - was it a CE1,2,3, or 4?

Three parts of a 1989 report from the Canadian province of British Columbia make it difficult to categorize in terms of the type of report. We will describe the case in the order in which these components occurred, and leave it to the reader to decide on the type.

Jill Cheesebrough, 28, a sales clerk of Kamloops saw an unusual object near her home at about 11 p.m. on Monday, January 16, 1989, while walking her dog. It was a partly cloudy night with a few stars visible and a dull moon showing. She has good vision and hearing and a grade eleven education. The town is built on two rivers and is semi-desert terrain. There was some snow on the ground at the time. She saw two cars in the area at the time. The area underneath the object was dirt with some dead vegetation which had been that way prior to the sighting. Here, in her own words, is her report:

"It was about 11 p.m. at night. I believe it was a Sunday (it was actually Monday-Ed.) I was taking my dog to the back yard and I looked up to the hill across the street from our yard and saw two intense bright lights on the hill. My first thought was that a four by four truck was on the hill, but as if it was waiting for me to see it, it started to turn and flew off the hill top. It was not a car, plane or helicopter or anything else that I knew of. For one thing, the hill top is barely large

enough for a truck to go up and come down, let alone anything land on it, and it was the way it moved and flew."

"That night I couldn't sleep, aside from the obvious reasons. It was as if my mind was running like a typewriter and for some reason I awoke out of sleep, like someone would from a bad dream and got up and went to the bedroom window and looked out, and for a brief moment I saw someone standing in the shadow of our pine tree in the back yard and then he vanished. I feel like I should remember something, but I don't know what."

Jill described the sighting as lasting two to three minutes. She said that at the time, the weather was unusual for January: "the snow was melting and the ground was thawing; the wind was warm."

She said the object was solid and square made no sound, and had a smooth, dark surface, aside from the lights. She said that, when the object moved, it did so smoothly with no visible propulsion. It had several windows on the side and lights shining from them. Jill is not certain if there was any trace of the object or whether there was any interference with electrical apparatus at the time. She is also uncertain if there was any missing time. She said "Something occurred during the night-not certain if it was a dream." The entity she saw was "above average height and slim."

She also noted that she was not certain if she had any communication with the entity.

She described the light from the object as "intense". The light had "no colour. It seemed to absorb light." When it moved away, it moved in front of trees and some buildings as fast as a plane. It disappeared behind the trees and buildings.

She mentioned that she had been interested in UFOs before her sighting. Her knowledge of the subject came from books and motion pictures.

Her reaction to the observation: "I was excited and had a sense of what I can best describe as almost awe. I felt no threat or fear."

We seem to have a CE1 here, with a remote possibility of this being a CE3 or 4. We are hopeful that the possibility of it being a CE4 will be investigated by our affiliated British Columbia group, UFOFORN. We look forward to any follow-up information from them.

Letter to the Editor

When I was 5 years of age, I had a dream... a dream so real, I remember it as if it happened yesterday. I was in a bright white room lying on a table. I recall 2 beings examining me with a device resembling a large microscope aimed at my forehead. The tip was illuminated and it also emitted a high pitched tone. I really thought nothing of my experience until I reached the end of my teens. I started to dwell on that experience as I began to question the reasoning behind it. I thought I was crazy.

While in my early twenties, I felt compelled to read all material related to U.F.O.'s and abduction cases. I currently have over 80 books which I had purchased within that time period, but I wanted to learn more. I wasn't satisfied with the information I had gathered. This letter was from a person who seemed to be on the same "wavelength" as I was...I knew that I had found what I was looking for. He left his phone number, so I immediately contacted him. I was struck as to how much knowledge he possessed. I contacted him once every month for about a year and a half, talking for about 45 minutes to an hour each time. He gradually told me what was going on. The pieces of the puzzle slipped into place.

You may be asking yourself "Who is the informant?" Through conversations with him, he has revealed to me that there are several types of "alien races" currently visiting and residing on Earth. He belongs to the race which recreate themselves as humans in order to study and to assist mankind...Sound too far fetched? Read on...

During the first few conversations with him, I was naturally very skeptical. He just said that I should accept the fact that I was chosen. Those people are selected because of certain personality traits they possess. I began to question whether this person was putting me on or not...this is when I began to realize that this was no joke. He told me to go outside at 12 midnight on December 23, 1988 and that I should look directly above my house...I was astonished at what I saw. Salter draws large audience with extra-terrestrial class

The UFO's, ET's and Close Encounters class, in its first year at UND, is a "massive" success, according to its instructor, Professor John R. Salter, Jr.

"They are a great group of students and among other things we're having a lot of fun," said Salter who is also chairman of the Indian Studies Department.

The UFO class, offered as Honors 299, is one of the first of its kind in the United States. It is "an orderly and studied sensitization project designed to acquaint humans with the nearby presence of intelligent extra-terrestrial life forms," Salter said.

Official enrollment is 151 students. Seats are also left open for interested people.

The documentation for the Honors 299 course consists of solid evidence, carefully selected films, hypnosis tapes and an abundance of printed literature.

This class also has a mid-term and final exam.

Salter claims to have had four UFO encounters during his lifetime, the most recent of these on March 20, 1988. He has had about 40 interviews since mid-August. There was also a piece in

the *National Enquirer* (Aug. 7, 1990) about his close encounter.

Salter, now 56, and his son, John III, 25, say they were abducted by an alien life form while traveling through Wisconsin on March 20, 1988.

However, neither immediately realized this until they discovered they had lost over an hour's time and had no recollection of what

had happened during that period.

Over the past two years through a series of vivid memories of this encounter, Salter and his son said they have been able to recall what happened during that "lost" time.

"In reference to the 1988 situation, I have a great deal of vivid recall and my son John has a fair amount," Salter said. He added that what they do both remember "meshes" perfectly.

Salter also recalls six or seven smaller humanoids, (four feet to four and one-half feet tall) and a taller humanoid figure almost as

tall as him (six feet). He believes there was telepathic communication between he, his son and the humanoids.

He said he was given several injections and an implant into his right nostril.

Since these "injections" Salter has had several physical alterations including increased growth rate of hair, fingernails and toenails, heightened immunity, immediate clotting of cuts and he was able to quit smoking after 40 years "without a single twinge."

Salter, who considers himself very optimistic, sees a relationship between his social justice organization work, his teaching and his encounters. In reference to everything that has happened to him he sees "all of this as friendly."

Salter said he hopes his UFO

class will "provide basic answers or at least point people toward those answers."

He also believes that the people he and John III met from afar "have good motives, very good ones, and the unfolding results of this are and will be deeply beneficial through the many, many ages to come."

Besides chairing the Indian Studies department, Salter has been active in several organizations. He was elected president of the UND chapter of the North Dakota Higher Education Association (NEA) and voted chairman of the UND Honors Program Committee. He was also presented the Martin Luther King Jr., Award for extensive works in civil rights by North Dakota Governor George Sinner in 1988.

The reason for many abduction cases is that these beings are basically "implanting" individuals who are systematically chosen by them for a "definite" purpose in the near future. The OMEGA Conference: a personal view

Personal observations, OMEGA CONFERENCE:

John White appears to be a thoroughly intelligent, efficient and feeling individual. As such, he organized an OMEGA CONFERENCE befitting his image. In any situation, however, where many individuals congregate, even the most efficiently charismatic [non-dictatorial] personality's entreaties will go unheeded.

Mr. White opened his fourth annual event on Saturday, October 14, 1990, at the North Haven, Connecticut, **Holiday** (formerly, **Ramada**) Inn by pointing out that we would hear the many different views of many different individuals: **Gene Phillips**, **James Harder**, **Paul Devereux**, **Stanton Friedman**, **Ed and Frances Walters**, **Grian O'Leary**, **Howard Blum**, **Ann Druffel**, **Antonio Gumeus**, **Fred Max**, **Betty Andreasson Luca** and her husband, **Robert**, and **Harry Lebelson**. The Friday evening pre-conference meeting with the Press included **Robert Bletchman**, **Mr. Blum**, **Ellen Crystal**, **Mr. Friedman**, **Dr. O'Leary**, **Donald Schmitt**, and **Fred Whiting**. This many individuals would guarantee some sharply contrasting viewpoints. "We can disagree," **Mr. White** several times suggested, "without being disagreeable." What more wonderful tone could be set for any gathering designed to bring together divergent ideas in the supposedly universal hope of learning "The Truth"?

Gene Phillips gave a slide presentation showing the artifacts of antique societies, indicating that they may have had either greater knowledge than we choose to give them credit for having, or that they may have had help for the creation of these artifacts from "outside". I stood at the back of the room, so that I could see the screen over the heads of the audience. Perhaps I was too far away. I could not see the things in the statues and structures that **Mr. Phillips** was so certain were

there (anachronistic gears, machinery, etc.). **Mr. Phillips** has a marvelous sense of humor. He brought new life and energy to this subject that first came to popular light with **Eric von Däniken**.

Dr. Harder's carefully formed words made us understand his disdain for other points of view; most particularly, those currently regarded "most popular" [i.e., those of **Budd Hopkins**']. **Dr. Harder's** disdain was so carefully cloaked, however, that **Mr. White's** tone was not yet broken.

Paul Devereux is an author and researcher from England. Europeans and Asians, he noted, generally ignore the "contact-abduction/biological entities" theories, and North Americans generally ignore all other theories. **Mr. Devereux** made a most effective case for the (various forms of) "earth light" theory. He urged us (most respectfully and sincerely) to give this and other theories more consideration. **Mr. Devereux** presented his thoughts well within the bounds that **Mr. White** had wished to demarcate.

Then came **Stanton Friedman's** turn at podium. **Mr. Friedman**; a man, apparently, thoroughly to be respected and admired. Whatever "truths" to have come out of **Roswell** were most probably due to him. Whatever "truths" yet to come out of **Roswell** will most likely be due to him. — and all that he contemporaneously said in response to **Mr. Devereux's** presentation were 100% right: yes, "earth lights" is a valid theory and certainly explains many sightings. The validity of this theory, however, neither invalidates the "hardware/biological entities" theories, nor impels us to "short-shrift" other choices of study. It's just the way that **Mr. Friedman** said it all . . .

As much as **Mr. Friedman's** manner distresses this (admitted "goody-two-shoes") observer, however, we

shouldn't want to presume to make an effort toward "rehabilitating" Stanton Friedman. If *Vincent Van Gogh* and *Abraham Lincoln* lived in this late 20th century world, medical science would most probably have ameliorated the mental-emotional difficulties from which they reportedly suffered. Chances are, however, we'd never have heard of *Mr. Van Gogh*, and we may never have had the Emancipation Proclamation. If *Frank Capra* had had forty years earlier the medical help he did eventually receive, we may never have had It's A Wonderful Life to shamelessly drag gut-wrenching sobs and eye-reddening tears from our bodies each year during the Christmas season. This is not to say that *Mr. Friedman* is manic-depressive, or suffers from any other form of illness; mental, emotional, social, or otherwise; but to momentarily allow ourselves to make the assumption that it is a "flaw" of some kind that moves him, it is this supposed flaw that is the "quality" that makes him so successful in his endeavors — and so successful in communicating his complex valid observations to an otherwise unknowing world citizenship.

Boy! You should'a seen the restrained bolts of lightning between *Mr. Friedman* (in the audience) and *Mr. Blum* (at the podium)! *Howard Blum* seems to be very sincere, and is a well-respected member of his profession; but let me shoot a bolt of my own in his direction: what logic is there in saying "I am a journalist [or scientist], so it is in my nature to be skeptical. I don't believe in UFOs". Am I mistaken, or isn't this an absolutely absurd statement? My personal opinion on *Mr. Blum's* declaration: he is a "believer"; he just is wise enough to know that if he says so he may be ridiculed, and his basic "message" — thus, hope for a speedier revelation — will become lost. He has one very correct approach toward that revelation: appeal toward the sensibilities of our political bureaucrats, and to the over-

ly income-taxed resentfulness of middle class world citizens.

During a break in the proceedings, I listened in to a portion of a conversation between a member of the audience and Stanton Friedman. She apparently went to *Mr. Friedman* in defense of *Paul Devereux's* "lights" theory. Her argument was that there are no intelligent life forms in our solar system outside Earth, so from where would biological entities have come? *Mr. Friedman* said "perhaps" from other solar systems. She asked, essentially, "Why would they want to come all the way here from there?" *Mr. Friedman* was most tactful and patient. I felt like taking off a shoe and bopping her up topside the head with it (okay; so sometimes I'm only a "goody-one-shoe")! Again, am I the only one who sees the absurdity of such kind of "thinking"? I mean, why did *Ericsson, Columbus, Balboa, De Soto, Armstrong/Aldrin/Collins, the original colonists of Easter Island, etc., etc., etc.*, pack their respective bags? Why do some of our non-bureaucrats and visionaries plan on our going to other solar systems within the next century or so? Because that's the way we're built — and, apparently, that's the way "They" are built.

Brian O'Leary. You know how sometimes you like somebody just by looking at him, and you don't know why you should? That's how I've felt about *Dr. O'Leary*, since the first time I saw him on TV. We almost bumped into each other at the conference. (His fault. He came out the wrong door as I was going in.) What struck me was that we're about the same height. Now I know what it was about him that I found so appealing. There are not a whole lot of people in this world with whom I, at 5'3", can see "eye-to-eye". Anyway, essentially, *Dr. O'Leary* explained his "conversion" from "typical" narrow science, toward openness to other, wider, unbounded avenues of thought.

True Science. True Skepticism. Neither believe nor disbelieve; but be open to all, until you come to certain truth (whatever that turns out to be). A possible "negative" concerning Dr. O'Leary: he seemed awfully impatient and defensive about questions related to NASA secrecy, coverups, intimidations of astronauts, etc. I fidgeted as audience members pressed him on this area of speculation when it was clear that O'Leary was uncomfortable with it. We in the audience, were morally bound to raise the question; but, having done so, we should have been as bound toward realizing the spot in which we placed our guest. After all, this was not the topic about which Dr. O'Leary came to speak, to begin with.

Betty Andreasson Luca gave us what she believes are parts of the "message/mission" of the UFO "Greys" who (that?) she was made to endure. Essentially: we have brought our planet and ourselves to the edge of extinction. These "Greys" are apparently working desperately to "reengineer" us to where earth and its remaining life forms will survive; albeit in altered forms. Unfortunately, I had to leave the conference just at the point where Ms. Andreasson Luca ended her formal presentation, and began the question-answer session; so could not take advantage of the opportunity to refine my interpretation of her talk. Needless to say, my philosophical/ideological ideals appear to parallel hers, exactly: we ARE responsible for each other and for our environment. A society promulgated on lust for wealth and power over and above everything else is doomed to abject extinction.

Fred Max presented the view of our subject from the perspective of the hypnotist. He demonstrated his art and science, with Robert Luca as his subject.

Ann Druffel speculated on means by which "assaults" by Extrater-

restrials might be warded off. The speculations were complex. It was even wondered whether their intrusions into our lives should be resisted. Essentially, it breaks down to this, Ms. Druffel said: be fully aware of the fact that as a living entity, yourself; that you have absolute, inviolable rights over your own body and mind; that no other person or thing may "use" you for any reason without your full knowledge, understanding and consent.

Antonio Guneas gave us a more detailed rundown of UFO matters in the Soviet Union. He put the recent, celebrated reports in proportion; desensationalized the U.S. media "translations".

I, unfortunately, was on my way to the train station when Barry Lebelson's "Broken Silence—The Military Testimony About UFOs" was being presented.

I saved Ed and Francis Walters for last, because I consistently had trouble with aspects of their accounts and photographic evidence. In truth, I was rather "schizophrenic" about their story, because individuals I'd come to respect have clearly given their full "stamp of approval" to the Walters'. In the last few months, I began leaning more and more toward acceptance of their accounts. Why? Because of the blatant, shameless efforts to discredit them. Such efforts are not made against liars, opportunists or crackpots. They are made against people who are cutting too close to the "Establishment" bone. Their photographs, for the most part, looked, to me, too much like double exposures — as though the "anomalous" objects had been photographed under different lighting conditions than the rest of the environment within which they were said to have been seen. I allowed that the objects themselves may have been luminescent or somehow translucent — and I recognized that double expo-

tures of the kind that they appeared to me to be would not likely have fooled Bruce Maccabee; but the doubts were there. At the conference, Mr. Walters explained that most of the reproductions released to the public were light-enhanced versions of the original instant camera photos. Of course! As an artist, I have worked from photo reference which I'd placed on a light box in order to be able to see more of the details in the photos. The photos on my light box, now that I think about them, took on the "look" of the Walters Gulf Breeze photos.

Some twenty years ago, my mother and I were attacked in our own home by two thugs. For a couple of years after that, I found myself walking into traffic, as my head was filled with futile, pointless, self-destructive thoughts of vengeance. I found myself struggling for breath, struggling to raise my voice to an audible level as I recounted the tale to police, friends and relatives. I struggled to keep my thoughts focused on the facts while I was telling them and not blank out in a kind of panic and frustrated rage as I relived the incident. I believe I saw much the same "syndrome" in Ed Walters as he relived for us his encounters. How much worse they must have been for him! Assaults on human beings by other human beings is as old as Homo Sapiens. Assaults on human beings by Other Beings has got to be more difficult than any human can possibly imagine! Of course, it may just have been a case of "stage fright" — or a guilty conscience as he lied before some couple of hundred people. — But then, the *Debunkers* say that Mr. Walters is an egomaniac sociopath. "Those" kind of people (ego-sociopaths) don't sweat lying before groups of people. "Those" kind of people become, under those circumstances, swollen with a sense of self-satisfied power!

One more thing: the Walters' dog was poisoned to death. As they twice recounted that incredibly cruel

aspect of their now topsy-turvy life, Frances Walters had to fight back an open display of grief. She wasn't acting. Could Ed Walters be so psychologically disturbed that he would inflict the most transcendent of all painful human emotions, grief, upon his own wife in order to make it appear that he was being persecuted? Even if Mr. Walters has been perpetrating fraud, (no doubt, sorry to say, that possibility does still exist) the nature of the subject under scrutiny is such that all he need do is sit back and enumerate the crackpot letters, phone calls, negatively slanted news articles, smear campaigns, etc. He wouldn't have needed to "do" his dog. No. For good or evil, it appears more and more that the Walters' (and the hundreds of others surrounding the panhandle section of Florida) are reporting and photographing what they claim: unknown aerial phenomena and other bizarre occurrences.

New Canadian group distributing NRC reports

IUR article by Schmitt and Randle described as "journalistic outrage"

Perhaps you are aware that the March-April 1990 issue of CUFOS' International UFO Reporter (IUR) ran a Roswell Incident-related piece entitled "Fort Worth, July 8, 1947: the Cover-up Begins" by Don Schmitt and Kevin Randle. Because the principal witness cited in this story, J. Bond Johnson, PhD, had also contacted Jaime Shandera and I, and because we have spent considerable time and effort researching this man and the story he tells, we were already familiar with the facts of this matter by the time the IUR piece came out.

Since CUFOS has spent considerable time of late in extolling the virtues of the Schmitt/Randle reinvestigation of The Roswell Incident, we expected the above-mentioned excerpt to be an exemplary piece -- a shining example of the sort of reportage we have been led to believe their new Roswell book will contain.

What we found, however, was nothing short of a journalistic outrage! Misplaced facts, great leaps or absolute absence of logic, second-hand gossip, hearsay and speculation as if it were first-hand testimony, persistent borrowing of background facts from our own previously published material without credit given to source, and outright incompetence disguised as factual reporting--all presented to the unsuspecting reader as if it were gospel truth. Indeed, even Dr. Johnson himself (who was not provided with a copy to review for accuracy ahead of publication) has characterized it as a work of fiction. Based upon the results of our own investigation, we concur! The Schmitt/Randle article is a disgraceful travesty of journalism which cannot go unchallenged.

Consequently, the June 30, 1990 issue of FOCUS which accompanies this letter contains a piece titled "Three Hours that Shook the Press" by Jaime Shandera and I. It sets forth our version of the facts and the

research which substantiates them. In addition, attached to this letter is Jaime's critical commentary on the IUR travesty which he calls "CUFOS Goes to Roswell: the Disaster Begins." Please read both carefully and compare them to the Schmitt/Randle IUR piece (assuming you have a copy).

Editor's Note: We urge Bulletin readers to order a copy of the June 30, 1990 issue of FOCUS and to start a subscription to the publication. Due to space limitations, we are unable to reprint even portions of the two aforementioned articles. They are long. For example, Shandera's is 10 and 1/3 pages long. I have read both and I agree entirely with Moore and Shandera's opinion of the IUR article. For example, Shandera mentions that Schmitt never talked to Johnson. How can anyone co-author an article and mention a key witness without even interviewing him? Yet CUFOS allowed Schmitt's name to appear as co-author of the article. Schmitt, in a December, 1989 meeting with Moore and Shandera, said he was listed as co-author of their forthcoming book about Roswell because the CUFOS board didn't trust Randle to get the facts straight. Put these two facts together and you can see that readers cannot trust either Schmitt or Randle's accuracy. I think that if Dr. J. Allen Hynek were still alive, this book would never appear. He would have at the very least disassociated CUFOS from the book and not allowed the article to appear in IUR.

Curiously, after Schmitt and Randle became aware that our conclusions regarding Dr. Johnson and his experience at Ft. Worth differed markedly from their own, and that Dr. Johnson had enthusiastically endorsed our version while repudiating theirs, they tried to squirm out from under the blot on their image and methods by claiming that

Dr. Johnson had "discredited himself" by changing his story. Based upon three personal interviews with this man (one of which took place in his living room and was taped), plus several phone conversations and a thorough knowledge of his background and reputation, we feel we must state for record that the Schmitt/Randle allegations are nothing short of scurrilous and outrageous, and as such should be rejected out of hand by any thinking individual.

"As you will note, I have been forced reluctantly to the conclusion that the three primary documents are genuine and therefore of great significance and probably the most important US government documents ever leaked to the US public. My research hasn't really stopped and

when more previously requested documents are finally declassified and released I may well issue an addendum."
