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
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

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Nocturnal Lights Reported During Gulf War Within Israel

The following is a verbatim report from Hadassa Arbel, CUFORN's Israel Correspondent. It was received on February 10, 1991.

The data has been delivered to me by a 51-year-old Civil Defence Officer who had been recruited three days before the war broke out (on January 31, 1991). Unfortunately, he insists on remaining anonymous, but I'll give you the data anyway.

On January 19, 1991 at 00.38 a.m. (just after midnight), a "missile" was seen heading towards Lod. Then it was seen silently flying in the direction of Ashdod. No explosion was reported anywhere. No alarm was sounded. The closest alarm to that incident was on January 19, 1991 at 7.20 a.m., about seven hours later. So, if that "missile" was no missile, what was it that flew in the direction of Ashdod?

Further: On January 20, 1991, at 22.35 p.m. (10:35 p.m.), there were reports to the Kerem De Yarne Police Station that people heard a sharp whistle of a flying object that was seen going from north-east to south-west without any explosion being heard or reported. On the same date, at 22.50 p.m. (10:50 p.m.), identical reports were received from Ekron Police Station (near Ashdod) that a large body of light was seen flying towards Tel-Nof (military base).

At 23.24 p.m. (11:24 p.m.), that body of light was reported to have been seen flying over Tel-Nof, heading south-east, changing velocity and direction. This report had been received also in the Ekron Police Station. That mysterious body of light was also reported to have been seen changing not only velocity and direction, but also altitude - heading higher, instead of lower - had it been a missile. No explosion was heard and no alarms were activated.

So what was that body of light flying, changing direction, velocity and altitude? So, it seems that UFOs are still with us. Don't you think so?

Major UFO Conference Ignored by MUFON and CUFOS

The First World UFO Congress set for May 3 to 7, 1991, is being completely ignored by MUFON and CUFOS as far as publicity is concerned. Each of these groups has regular lists of upcoming UFO conferences and has not mentioned the Congress once.

The Tucson conference is being held at two hotels in the Arizona city as one hotel had been booked in advance by another organization not connected to UFOs. The Congress will take place from May 3 to 5 at the Hilton Hotel and from May 6 to 7 at the Holiday Inn.

According to conference organizer Wendelle Stevens, by March 18, 280 people had already booked in advance for the Congress. Stevens said that on the basis of his name alone, he expected at least 500 to attend. He felt that total attendance would be closer to 1,000. If that figure is reached, it would be the largest UFO conference in history. CUFORN will inform you as to attendance in its March-April issue which you will get late May.

Since I will be speaking there, I will also be acting as a reporter on the proceedings. My topic will be "Extra-terrestrial and Artificial Elements Found in Five Reported UFO Landing Sites in Israel and the U.S."

Blondes, MIBs and Reptilian Symbolic Cultural Conditioning

I will briefly cover three separate subjects in this article which may help shed some light on alien activity on our planet. Since we are used to hearing and reading about the "greys", I thought you might find it refreshing to know about an experience I had with a species of blondes. So I will begin by relating to you an encounter which I had with them in October of 1989.

Shortly after a Vancouver newspaper had done a full page spread on my research into abductions and my organization, I was in the main public library newspaper room looking for clues to UFO activity in major Canadian metropolitan centers. It was early in the day and very quiet, with no more than a handful of people in the area. I was sitting at a very large, long, rectangular table, by myself, on the wide side, facing the desk and newspaper stands. At the time, I recall, I was deeply engrossed in study. My concentration was broken by the entrance of a very tall, blond gentleman who I estimated was 50 years of age. His height was approximately 6'3", and clearly Nordic in appearance, with a high forehead and chiseled look. The features were oddly faultless as if intentionally carved to perfection.

I took notice, but did not think more than that, and resumed my investigations. He seated himself at my table, to the right, at the short end. Ten or fifteen minutes later, he went to the front desk and asked for a specific Toronto newspaper, giving a date. When the paper arrived, he walked over to it, glanced at the cover for less than a couple of seconds, and then walked back to his seat. Several minutes later, he stood up and left the room. Shortly after, and to my amazement, a young man around 25 years of age walked into the room. He looked identical in every way to the previous individual

except that he was more youthful. The likeness was so remarkable that it momentarily shocked me.

He sat down to the left of me at the end of the table. For some reason, I began to feel uneasy, and put my head down. I cannot explain this except to say that he may have been probing my mind at the time. He was followed by a young lady, 19 or 20 years old. I thought at the time that she was his sister, because of the likeness between them.

She placed herself directly across from me. Then the older man returned and resumed his former position. What made the whole situation most peculiar is that they did not acknowledge each other's presence. It suddenly occurred to me that they might be clones, and the "blondes" which I had read about. I started looking for clues, as I did not want to rely on my thoughts or imagination. The young lady had a book in front of her on elementary beginner's basic English, so I assumed that she was a foreigner. After 10 minutes of prolonged silence, the older man suddenly looked at the younger female and asked very simply, "Are you ready?". The voice was deep, strong and assured. Still with her head down to the book and not looking at her counterpart, she replied "not yet". At this point, I definitely felt as if I was involved in a rehearsed, theatrical scene, where everyone but me knew their part.

I really began to wonder about all my previous conjectures and assumptions. Then, I had the odd feeling come over me that the three were putting me through some kind of test, and the female was judging me for telepathic abilities.

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So, I concentrated my mind on the statement, "I know who you are - I will not reveal your presence, and I thank you for permitting me to see you at such risk to your personal safety". As soon as I did this, an overwhelmingly warm feeling came over me. The lady looked directly at me with a piercingly deep look of understanding and acknowledgment in her eyes, smiled, then looked at the others, in turn, and said, "I'm ready now". They all stood up at one time, and left the room together.

On another occasion, I was waiting for a bus, when a very short man in shabby clothing walked up to me and said this: "The CIA controls the United States; who is in charge of Canada?". I jokingly responded, "MJ-12" and he replied, "that's what I thought" before rushing off.

As researchers into government mind control, and religious deprogrammers have learned, there is a great deal of audio and visual material that has been introduced into the mainstream society of youth in cultures all over the world, designed to trigger specific subliminal responses, usually for the purpose of social change. The introduction usually begins with fringe elements, which later becomes accepted as norm even to conservative youth, later hitting the adult population.

What if the "greys" and/or the "reptilian" species were attempting to do the same thing? - i.e., structure an allegiance to them, using the symbology of their culture, and infuse it into our cultural imagery system. In order to obtain confirmation of this, we would have to know what some of their symbols looked like. We now have some of this information thanks to various abductees and researchers. We know of the reptilian heritage, descriptions of winged serpents and spiral double helix shapes. Now where can we find these images in our own society? I will give you some examples I have noticed, and you can speculate on the connection yourself:

(1) The apothecary, or the medical profession's symbol which is often seen in pharmacies; (2) The symbology of the "heavy metal" rock band Motley Crue (a winged double helix, with a snake curling around it); (3) Various Metallica paraphernalia; (4) Dungeons and Dragons (the game) symbology.

New Classifications For UFO Investigations

The following classifications for UFO investigation were laid down by J. Allen Hynek in his book **THE UFO EXPERIENCE - A SCIENTIFIC ENQUIRY, 1972.**

1. Nocturnal Lights
 2. Daylight Discs
 3. Radar/Visual
 4. Close Encounter of the 1st Kind.
 5. Close Encounter of the 2nd Kind.
 6. Close Encounter of the 3rd Kind.
(UFO Occupants Involved)
 7. Close Encounter of the 4th Kind.
(Onboard Experiences/Abductions)
- This classification was added later.

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The following additional classifications have been suggested by Shawn Atlanti. They are useful to particular personnel in the military, and to both the military and intelligence fields, and to civilian investigators of the UFO phenomenon. These new suggested classifications are:

1. UFO ACQUISITION/CAPTURE/CRASH RETRIEVAL:

Persons involved in retrieval of damaged or intact extraterrestrial (ET) craft, parts and/or bodies; usually in a military or intelligence capacity.

2. EVIDENCE IN GOVERNMENT FACILITIES:

Persons who have observed, or have indirect evidence of stored ET craft, artifacts, or alien bodies in government or private facilities.

3. EVIDENCE OF GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS:

Personnel who have seen or learned of government documents pertaining to ET craft, crash retrievals, and ET species, races, and cultures.

4. EXTRATERRESTRIAL TECHNOLOGY:

Researchers and technical personnel involved in the duplication of ET, or foreign technologies: specifically ET craft, systems, and component parts.

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Dear Editor,

I was considerably perturbed by Bulletin Editor Lawrence Fenwick's comments concerning crop circles which appeared in the November-December 1990 issue of the Bulletin.

Indeed, I agree that crop circles do not possess the generally attributed characteristics of UFO landing sites and the connection between UFOs and crop circles is unestablished. However, UFOs are aerial phenomena and all indications suggest that crop circles are formed from some unknown aerial source of energy and/or pressure. Also, there have been cases of circumstantial connection between UFOs and circles, such as a UFO being sighted flying in a lineal direction which places it moving in a straight line across two later discovered crop circles. All this suggests that there very well may be a connection between the two phenomena. Not to mention, the late J. Allen Hynek investigated a case which directly connected UFOs with crop circles, namely the mid-70s sighting of a farmer near Langenburg, Saskatchewan in which the farmer saw 3 dome-shaped crafts hovering over a field and then take off, leaving behind 3 crop circles (like those being found now).

Apart from there being a direct connection between the two phenomena, I am of the mind (as I believe was Charles Fort) that there may be a connection between all paranormal phenomena, and as such I feel this area of investigation (crop circles) is definitely as worthwhile as much less concrete areas of investigation such as the so-called "abduction research", which may be doing nothing more than presenting unconscious fantasies as objectively real events; at least crop circles are a definite phenomenon which even paranormal skeptics concede is not explained conclusively.

In the final analysis, I feel for the reasons I have stated (and others) that crop circle investigation should continue, and Lawrence Fenwick is totally unfair in referring to crop circle research as "wasting our time" (Bulletin, Nov.-Dec., 1990).

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Dear Editor,

Thank you very much for the last issues of the "CUFORN Bulletin". I hope you can forgive me the long silence. But here in the eastern part of Germany we have now many problems. I lost my old job in computer technology in July, 1991. Then I went to West Germany and was trained as a manager. Now I am working here in my hometown, Suhl, for the concern RANK XEROX (copy systems). So I have not had much time in the last few months to do much for UFO research.

In August, September, October and November, 1990, we had a UFO wave in East Germany. It began at first in the northern territories (Mecklenburg) and ended in Thüringen. A big UFO was seen here in Suhl on November 5th, 1990 by more than 100 witnesses. The official institutions said that the UFO was a meteorite, but we have good reports from the witnesses who show us that it couldn't be a normal object. You see, we have good cases here also.

Since August, 1990, I have been publishing a bulletin with the title "UFO NEWS SERVICE" with information about the UFO phenomenon (in English and German). I sent you the number 2 (the bulletin will be published with two issues per year). I hope you can find a translator for the German language parts of this publication.

Dear Editor,

I feel after reading "Going around in the wrong circles" in the Nov./Dec. issue of the CUFORN Bulletin, that I must take exception to your view about the corn circles. I feel that some very broad, sweeping statements were made about what does

and does not constitute a "landing site". First, the reader is given the impression of what a known landing site should look like. When absolute proof of the existence of UFOs has yet to be established in many people's minds, we are told that investigators have already established definite landing traces; that these sites have certain characteristics, and none other. The grass must be flattened and dead; no other possibilities can exist, say the "experts". How do you know? Have you 'field-tested' one? Your argument smacks of the same attitude of those who refused to believe in abductions when they were first encountered.

I also believe that the statement that "no UFOs are seen near a circle prior to the circle's appearance" can be contested as well. On a TV programme, an elderly couple reported seeing a flying "ferris wheel" in the vicinity where crop circles had been forming. Another woman driving at night reported seeing a beam of light emanating from an even brighter source, stationary in the clouds above.*

At this point I wish to address the main reason for writing this rebuttal. Ever since I have taken an interest in this phenomenon, I have been made aware of the tug of war between the various partisanships that comprise "UFOlogy". Like politicians or born-again Christians, they each vie for votes, souls, money, the ears, hearts and minds of would-be "believers". Is it not enough to believe that this phenomenon exists and, therefore, lacking absolute proof one way or the other, remain open to all possibilities? In doing so, one remains objective and less likely to overlook any potential information that may be useful.

In an area where proof is sorely missed, there may be no proof that these circles were caused by UFOs, but on the other hand, there is no proof that they were not.

UFOs And Security

I have read many items about UFOs in the press. Do they really exist? If so, are they a direct threat to peace on earth? What has science to say on this score?

Since 1947, when American citizen Kenneth Arnold saw from his plane strange glimmering objects in the mountains, the world has been talking about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). The appearance of UFOs is from time to time reported in newspapers and magazines, radio and television. They are all analyzed by scientists.

On August 25, 1966, a USAF officer working on a Minuteman missile in North Dakota saw that his radio had stopped functioning. He was 18 metres down in the concrete silo. The ground crew reported that they saw a UFO which alternately descended and climbed. Then radio interference disappeared. And then it appeared to land. When a group of soldiers was dispatched to the landing site 16 kilometres from the silo, interference broke its radio contact with command. It was suggested that during the 1966-1967 period of UFO activity, UFOs also visited Titan missile silos. Experts were concerned over their electromagnetic effects, that might influence the electric equipment of combat missiles.

In the autumn of 1974, a metal disk some 100 metres across approached a South Korean anti-aircraft shore battery. The commander launched a Hawk guided missile which was immediately shot down by a "white ray" from the UFO. The second ray was directed at the battery, melting the remain-

ing two Hawk missiles into an unrecognizable mass.

investigation launched

The investigation of the UFO problem was launched in the U.S. by the military. In 1948, on orders from the Air Force commander, they started Project Sign. The Air Technical Intelligence Centre was responsible for research. Back in February 1953, the head of the anti-aircraft committee of the continent, General Benjamin Chidlow, stated: "We have a great mass of reports about flying saucers. We regard this very seriously, because we have lost many people and many aircraft which have attempted to attack UFOs."

Project Sign was subsequently renamed Grudge and then Project Blue Book.

In 1954, the French Ministry of the Armed Forces established a department to collect information about UFOs. In 1977 the French National Space Research Centre created GEPAN, a group of experts to study unidentified aerospace phenomena.

From 1960 to 1970, public organizations studying UFOs mushroomed throughout the world, notably in Bulgaria, Denmark, West Germany and Mexico. Later UFO fever spread to Canada, Britain, Japan, China and other countries.

international research

In the autumn of 1978, the First Committee of the 33rd U.N. General Assembly discussed the question of launching international UFO research. The discussion was based on a memorandum from ICUFON, a public U.S. organization studying UFOs.

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It provided a wealth of information on the military-technical and military-political aspects of the problem. Afterwards, though, information on UFO research in the West dwindled. The press published only distorted and superficial information about UFOs. At that time, the U.S. launched the Strategic Defence Initiative (SDI).

soviet study

The study of UFOs in the Soviet Union was started in 1958 by a group of enthusiasts led by Felix Zigel, assistant professor at the Moscow Aviation Institute and the founder of UFOlogy in the Soviet Union. In the mid-1970s, information about UFOs was collected by the Institute of Earth Magnetism, Ionosphere and Radio Waves, led by Vladimir Migulin, corresponding member of the USSR Academy of Sciences. In 1984, a commission to study anomalous phenomena, led by Vsevolod Troitsky, corresponding member of the USSR Academy of Sciences, was established at the national scientific and technological society of nature protection. In April 1988, Tomsk hosted a conference on sporadic instant phenomena, which attracted more than 300 scientists and experts from major scientific centres of the Soviet Union. The conference recommended that the Siberian branch of the USSR Academy of Sciences draft a comprehensive programme for the study of the problem.

Many Soviet and foreign scientists tried to present the UFO phenomenon as a natural thing, such as optical atmospheric effects, flocks of birds, rare astronomical phenomena, meteorites, luminous insects, frauds, weather balloons, aircraft, missile launches, streams of space particles, clusters of light, ball lightning, luminous pollutants, Polar lights, etc.

plasma formations

According to the USSR Academy of Sciences, some 90-95% of UFO reports are a result of such causes or a combination of them. But the remaining share constitutes tens of thousands of unexplained phenomena.

The main theory has been that UFOs are extra-terrestrial. Despite its great popularity, it has not been unequivocally supported by scientists. The most promising idea today is that UFOs are plasma. In 1984, scientists Aleksei Dmitriyev and Viktor Zhuravlyov from Novosibirsk advanced a theory of the plasma origin of the Tungus phenomenon. As is known, the culmination of that unique event in Siberia in 1980 was a 40-megaton air explosion. There are reasons to believe that the Tungus phenomenon and UFOs have a common origin.

We believe that so far the study of UFOs has not paid due heed to some specific features, as well as the mechanism of human perception of the world around us. Frequency parameters of UFOs and the limited speed of processing information in the eye-brain system breed so-called metaphoric deformities. Eye-witnesses see not the object itself but their own individual or accepted idea of it.

Proof of this is the historical mimicry of UFO's outlook and special photographing. Research by foreign and Soviet experts show that there are, in the atmosphere and at the Earth's surface, certain plasma formations, different in form, size, colour and frequency. Most often, they are registered in the ultraviolet part of the spectrum. These unseen formations, which, however, can be felt, often appear to act systematically and even intelligently.

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Successful study of UFOs is impossible without considerable expansion of our views of the world. The idea of a multi-dimensional and multi-layered universe, parallel or intertwined physical worlds were voiced by major scientists, notably Paul Ehrenfest, Konstantin Tsiolkovski, Aleksandr Friedman, Anatoly Logunov, and Dmitry Blokhintsev.

incorrect identification threat

Using the principles of the new political thinking, the Soviet Union is actively working for universal security and disarmament. Against this background, the world public cannot but be worried by the U.S. carrying on with the SDI programme. This ballistic missile defence is designed to control outer space and destroy near-earth, air and space targets. Any system can be effective only if it is managed by super-quick computer systems. It is most important here to correctly identify targets. So, corresponding computer cells must "know" what signal characteristics of the object it is tracking can make it a potential target.

We believe that lack of information on the characteristics and influence of UFOs increase the threat of incorrect identification. Then mass transition of UFOs along trajectories close to those of combat missiles could be regarded by computers as an attack.

In the autumn of 1960, all bombers at the Travis Air Force base in the United States were put on red alert for an attack against the Soviet Union after the base radars detected "targets" flying via the North Pole to the U.S. territory. Suddenly the "targets" disappeared from the screen, and were later explained as "radar reflections of the Moon".

In SDI conditions, such incidents could provoke immediate reaction from computers to destroy the "targets," say, by an X-ray laser, which means a powerful nuclear explosion. Or SDI computers could order a counter-attack, which might prove unwarranted. It should be remembered that decisions will be taken not by people but by impartial computers which "know nothing of UFOs". There would be no time to determine the cause of the conflict then, but those who are creating SDI should think about it now.

The UFO problem remains unsolved. It is difficult to predict what would have happened if an incident similar to the Tungus one happened in Europe, America or any other region of local conflicts. Back in 1968, Felix Zigel, the main Soviet researcher of the problem said: "The subject and aims of UFO research are sufficiently important to justify any effort. Understandably, international cooperation is vitally needed here".
