
## Small Crowd Attended UFO Congress

"Don't worry. I'm well known here in Tucson. I expect we'll get a lot of media publicity here. We could draw as many as 500 people to the Congress." Those were the words of Wendelle C. Stevens, a retired U.S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel, referring to the First World UFO Congress, which he and Pasquale Marcattilio were going to host from May 3 to 7, 1991 in Tucson, Arizona in the U.S.

He was speaking to your editor earlier in 1991 on the telephone and made the prediction not knowing that the media in Tucson would totally ignore the Congress. I called Wendelle as he had asked me to be one of the 30 speakers at the congress. He had asked me to speak about a reported CE2 near Ottawa, Ontario which was reported to CUFORN and other groups as a crash-retrieval with a military encounter. It was an obvious hoax based on a multiple-observer close encounter of the second kind which took place at 8 p.m., on November 4, 1989 in the town of Carp, Ontario.

Wendelle was sure it was a crash-retrieval as he tends to take everything at face value, with a minimum of skepticism. CUFORN was determined that no crash occurred and that there existed no facilities in the area to handle dead alien bodies. Other major discrepancies were pointed out by our Ottawa-area investigators. I decided that I would open up my speech with a five-minute summary of the case and then spend 40 minutes repeating what we had already published in the Bulletin about one California case and eight reports from Israel. These included samples sent to me of residue left after the UFOs came close to Shikmona Beach at Haifa. Lab analysis proved that the residue was extra-terrestrial. I gave an audio-visual presentation in Tucson. More about that later.

The Congress proved to be a combined contactee/abductee event rather than one in which researchers

discuss their work in the form of a speech. A lot of New Age people attended so the tables of items being presented for sale were geared to that sort of person. A few exhibitors made a few dollars while a few speakers actually gave fine speeches.

There were a few disappointing speeches. One which comes to mind is that of Antonio Ribera, one of the pioneers of ufology in Europe. The Spanish researcher spoke about the UMMO contacts with the tone of a politician, saying little but using a lot of high-flown words, generalities and grand gestures with his hands, which some people find distracting. He had a very slight Spanish accent, fortunately, so he was understandable. This did not apply to other speakers, however.

Speaking of speakers, the list of them changed every day while I was there. Stevens sent me the list of speakers before I consented to speak. He did that with all the speakers. This upset some who decided not to accept the invitation to Tucson.

For various other reasons 20 speakers declined or could not travel to Tucson. As I could not attend all the speeches, I am not sure whether two speakers actually made speeches. One speaker was listed who actually introduced another person who was not listed. There were 20 persons who filled in as speakers at the last minute. There was a great deal

of switching of times for speeches, which made it very confusing for both the speakers and those who attended. Audiotapes were made of all speeches, based on the original order of speaking, but when changes were made, the labels on the audiotapes were not changed. Thus people who bought a particular tape, thinking it was of a certain speaker would later find out they had purchased a speech by someone else. Many speakers used slides, so audiotapes would be inadequate.

Some of the speakers were not proficient in English so translators had to stand with them at the microphone and translate what they said into English. This was done in sentence by sentence fashion, making it difficult to follow the train of thought or theme of the speeches. This was evident in the speeches by the three Soviets.

There were approximately 30 tables of wares for sale which had to be moved on the Monday morning when the Congress had to move from the Hilton Hotel to the Holiday Inn Palo Verde Plaza. This was due to a prior commitment made by the Hilton to another convention which started on Monday afternoon. The inconvenience of the move was most evident when a bit of material got lost in the move. The hotels are about five miles apart. Some attendees and speakers were booked into rooms at the Hilton and others at the Holiday Inn. A shuttle van service was run between the hotels. It was free, frequent and on time. Drivers of the vans included December Storm, a young man who is Stevens' grandson, and speaker A.J. Gevaerd, a young Brazilian high school teacher. It was a pleasure to meet both of them.

It was during the trip from the Hilton to the Holiday Inn that I met Madeleine C. Rodeffer, a former close acquaintance of the late George Adamski. Madeleine was exactly as I thought she would be. I could have tried to sell her the Brooklyn Bridge and she would have believed that I owned it. It is no wonder that she was taken in by Adamski.

Among the tables with goods for sale including books were ones manned by people such as Don Ecker and Vickie Cooper, Editor of UFO magazine; Al Bialik, who claims to be a survivor of the Philadelphia Experiment; William Cooper, a jovial sort of person whose table was placed in a rather a propos location -- next to the men's lavatory; Aileen Edwards, Director of UFO Contact Center International; and John A. Price, Owner and General Manager of "Outa Limits", a store in Roswell, New Mexico which specializes in Roswell Incident books and souvenirs.

Since this was Wendelle Stevens' first try at organizing a convention, one should try to overlook the mistakes. Nevertheless, by listing the problems, one can learn what to watch for in the future when attempting such a venture. As an example, each speaker and all the people attending the Congress were given pin-on cards inside clear plastic holders. The cards had the person's name and status, such as speaker or organizing committee member. However, the colour of the card was silver, with the lettering in black. This made it look good, but very hard to read. People had to squint to see the names, which were in script and very hard to read for that reason, too.

Stevens had asked a local company to videotape all the speeches, which was done. What he did not do was have someone tell the speakers that their allotted 45 minutes was reached. As a result, most of the speakers went overtime, a few by as much as two hours. This, in turn, meant that not all of the individual speeches were videotaped due to lack of tape. Your editor managed to finish his audio-visual presentation in 46 minutes. The young boy who was delegated to operate the slide projector for me was not familiar with slide projectors, so I had to insert the slides and operate it myself, while I spoke. I was not expecting this situation, but managed to get it done properly.

Stevens had promised to publish all of the speeches a month in advance in a "Proceedings" format book, which would be sold. All he did was publish a short pamphlet with very short summaries of the speeches. He handed it out at the Congress, rather than selling them there.

Getting back to the audiotapes made of the speeches, a firm called The UFO Library, based in Studio City, California, sent out an advertisement to me recently. In it were 25 tapes for sale at \$7.95 each. Of the 25, 21 were speakers. Non-speakers' tapes included William Cooper, Moreno/Pereira MD, Yolanda Razzito and Linda Howe. Some were the lectures only, others were the lectures along with the question and answer section. The advertisement for the tapes mentioned that there were "thousands in attendance".

### MASS ABDUCTION

One of the highlights of the Congress was the speech by clinical hypnotherapist Robin Quail. In it, she told of the abduction of about 150 people from an office building in Georgia. Without a copy of the speech, it is difficult to recall all of the details, but here is what I can remember. A man was late for an appointment with someone who worked in the building the hours at the building are from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. He arrived at 5:30 p.m. and found the entire office staff wandering around in a daze, completely disoriented. When he went to his car afterwards, he saw that there were 18 burned circles on the grass adjoining the parking lot. These were approximately 8 feet in diameter. It appears as though 18 UFOs had landed and taken the employees from the building, then returned them to the building. Is this just circumstantial evidence? Would hypnosis reveal what actually occurred? This is something that has not been resolved yet. If I have time, I will contact Robin Quail to see if any hypnosis has been done in this instance. If any data can be revealed, I will publish it if Robin agrees to this.

Another important speech was that of U.S.A.F. Colonel Robert O. Dean. The retired Colonel said that he was based in Paris, France in 1947 at SHAPE headquarters and had a high clearance level at the time. He said he saw one NATO document on a desk at the time that stated that UFOs were extraterrestrial in origin. He also revealed the names of the levels of security above the Top Secret category. The next level up is called Cosmic. The highest level is called Dharma Blue or Dharma Blue. I am not sure which spelling is correct. The name is similar to DARPA, which is an acronym for Defence Advanced Research Projects Agency, possibly, the "M" refers to management or some such name.

When someone asks why abductees or contactees don't bring back souvenirs from the UFOs or the creatures in them, you can now point to what seems to be just such an item which was shown to the audience for the speech by Shirlé Klein-Carsh of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The Montreal-born Klein-Carsh had with her two square gold plates with very unusual writing etched into them. It does not resemble anything I have seen before. According to her, one person on each continent received similar plates from the creatures. It is part of a "mission" and each of these people has been given a "purpose". We will publish photos of the

plates in the next issue of the Bulletin. Shirlé claims to be a hybrid -- a mixture of an ET and a human. She says her brothers and sisters are not hybrids - just her.

I heard what could be a rather interesting coincidence or something that confirms a Canadian story. Speaker Christa Tilton described her abduction to an alien-U.S.A.F. joint underground base near Dulce, New Mexico (inside Mount Archuleta). She said she saw a room full of gray creatures and a large room with huge switchboards and telephone facilities. In front of each phone was a man or woman wearing full military uniform calling abductees and/or researchers, warning them to desist from the investigation of their cases. In the background, Christa said, she heard telephone numbers being recited.

In a 1971 case of three people being abducted near St. Catharines, Ontario, Canada, which CUFORN investigated, CUFORN Co-Director Harry Tokarz' girl friend was answering calls for Harry's talent agency business while Harry and CUFORN President Joe Muskat were out on the case. When they arrived back at Harry's Toronto apartment they discovered Harry's girl friend waiting for them holding the telephone in her hand with a quizzical look on her face. She told them she had just hung up from a threatening phone call from a man who said they were not going to be allowed to continue the investigation. She said that when the man was talking, numbers were being recited in the

background. Does this confirm that the Dulce base exists? Or is it just a coincidence? You be the judge.

One of the most interesting speeches was that of Jorgé Martin of Puerto Rico. In it, he described, with the aid of videotape, a series of abductions, genetic experimentation, cattle mutilations and a military jet captured by a UFO in Puerto Rico. He said it was a major flap, with many cases occurring in broad daylight. As proof of the genetic work, he showed colour photographs of a hybrid snake and bird combination. The snake fangs are prominent with the wings shown clearly.

Several speakers demonstrated their lack of accurate and up-to-date information on UFOs. This is partly attributable to lack of exchange of information with researchers in North America. One of the main examples was that of Vladimir Terziski, a Russian who represented Bulgaria at the Congress.


Terziski spent some time talking about the experimental saucer developed by three German scientists during World War Two. These were Miethe, Habermohl and Schriever, mentioned in the Renato Vesco book, *Intercept, But Don't Shoot*. This extremely badly written book was used by the speaker as evidence for saucers being based at the South Pole and being developed and flown by the U.S. If they are being flown by the U.S., they are alien-made,

captured UFOs, not a result of German experiments.

The Terziski speech was of the sensational variety so the local people who attended were interested. One of them reacted with enthusiasm to Terziski's question as to whether he should add to his speech beyond the 45 minutes allotted. He went over by two hours. Since the speeches each day started at 8:00 a.m., it was noon before he finished. The person who urged Terziski to continue stood and applauded and acted like a rabble-rouser at a political rally. Terziski managed to work in a bit about the fictional story "Alternative 3" and he asked his audience if they would come back later that night to watch a videotape of the film of the "Alternative 3" TV show although he said only the last few minutes of it were important. He didn't say what was so important. In this way, he made people curious and whetted their appetites for more.

Linda Howe introduced Judy Doraty, who was abducted together with her son, and witnessed a cow being mutilated aboard the UFO. She did not say anything in her speech that had not already been mentioned in articles about her case which have appeared in UFO journals for several years. Still, it was nice to see Ms. Doraty in person.

Britain was represented by former police officer

Anthony Dodd, who spoke about the report of a UFO crash-retrieval in South Africa. He was a fine and most convincing speaker. He did mention that the case was muddled and was the subject of debunking because one of the key persons involved was a con artist who used the name Von Gruenen. Two other people whom he did not mention and who were trying to make money out of it were Henry Azadehdel and former CUFORN member Mark James. He said he was certain that there was a crash-retrieval in South Africa recently, and that Von Gruenen was capitalizing on it to get publicity so as to whet the public's appetite for the forthcoming book.

Pat Weissleader spoke about her experience of being abducted and of producing a hybrid alien/human child at the age of 18 during a pregnancy in which the child disappeared from her womb a few months later -- a fact which totally astonished her doctor. She had also acquired a rare dog, an Aztec Xolo, and had awoken one night in bed to find what she at first thought was the dog, and then realized was a man who had a dog's hair on his head and floppy ears. She lost consciousness and when she awoke he was gone.

She was prompted in 1989 to go to Colorado where, in a place she did not mention, she saw 12

floppy-eared children and met a doctor who discussed dog genetics with her. Other subjects were discussed and she was given an amber fluid to drink.

Pat said she believes that genetic work is being done by the aliens with animals, plants, fungus, molds, and bacteria to aid in the survival of Earth and its people.

One of the speakers actually managed to bind his speech in a loose-leaf folder and sell copies of it. Cory Wade of Los Angeles had as his topic The UFO ET/UT Timeline Enigma (UT meaning ultraterrestrial). He copyrighted it although it contained nothing that had not already been in print and written by others.

Wade is a Rosicrucian, former singer and record producer who had a supposed CE4 in 1950 or 1951 in a rural area of Manitoba, when he was 11 years of age.

There were other speakers who had nothing new to say. For example, Michael Hesseman of Germany and Enrique Castillo-Roncon of Venezuela.

The final speaker was a woman who was listed on the program as Omnec Onec from Venus. She was no more from Venus than I am. She was just a

cute blonde with the limpest handshake I've ever felt. A man was guiding her in the question and answer period after her speech. He stood at the back of the room and nodded and shook his head according to whether he wanted her to answer or not to answer questions from the audience. I did not see this, but was told by a young woman who was there and saw the man signalling to the blonde. Onec was selling a badly written book about her supposed Venusian origin. Shirlé Klein-Carsh also noticed the man. When told of the hoax by her, Wendelle Stevens turned red in the face with embarrassment.

## How Murphy's Law Ruined Speaker's Stay in Tucson

It seemed like an honour at first when Wendelle Stevens invited me to be one of the speakers at the First World UFO Congress. What transpired thereafter was that I literally lived Murphy's Law until after I arrived back from the Congress site, Tucson, Arizona.

For those of you who are not familiar with Murphy's Law, it means "Everything that could go wrong, will go wrong". That's what happened. Here, in some sort of sequence, is the list of mishaps, mistakes and disturbing incidents that occurred to me. You will have to bear with me while I indulge in a long litany of self-pity. Here goes!

I was determined to attend not only as a speaker, but as a reporter for the Bulletin. That meant that photographs would have to be taken. I assumed that the written part would be easy if Stevens published the proceedings in advance. That way I could read the speeches and be prepared for the actual delivery of them.

I decided to take my 35mm camera, and happened to mention it at my place of employment to one of my fellow employees. He said he would lend me his 35mm camera, saying I should not take a chance on losing my good camera which was worth almost ten times what his was worth. I agreed. He forgot to tell me that loading his camera is not easy and that the film doesn't catch on the spool inside without some tricky manipulation. So I took his camera along and one small 110 camera for my own colour photos which would not be for publication.

I spent money on two rolls of black and white film -- necessary for Bulletin photos. Then the 110 camera was loaded with film. I was now ready but I decided to buy another roll of colour film. I loaded a roll of black and white film into my friend's camera, and two nights in advance was packed and ready to go.

After the first black and white roll was used up and another was inserted I assumed everything was

going well. I did not notice that the roll I took out was not wound up, as I was suffering from jet lag after my five hour plane flight.

In order to save money, Stevens had booked me on a direct flight, which means I had to fly from Toronto to Detroit, then to Phoenix and then to Tucson.

I had packed one large suitcase and took a cheap small bag as carry-on luggage. Well, the small bag split down the seam as I carried it into the airport in Detroit. Luckily I noticed this happen and lost nothing except a little time.

On my return flight, via TWA and Northwest Airlines, TWA managed to lose my large suitcase temporarily. They sent it in error to San Francisco and then to Minneapolis, Minnesota, and finally to Toronto. It took an extra day to arrive and was delivered to my apartment door free after I had filed a claim for it at the airport.

Upon arrival at Tucson, I was expecting a Congress desk set up opposite the baggage claim area. Stevens had said it would be there, but it was not. So I waited a half-hour along with another Congress attendee, Gary Mann of New Jersey, who was also expecting to find the Congress desk. A van which was to take us to the hotel arrived and we were taken

by Stevens to the Holiday Inn. This was our introduction to Tucson's suburbs where the hotels were situated. The city is rather oddly planned. There are large stretches of lovely little houses with little or no commercial districts, a plethora of small factories and drive-in restaurants -- even ones that sold German and Vietnamese food. It turned out that there were a few tiny shopping malls and one large one, the latter situated a half-city block from the Hilton Hotel.

On day three of my stay there I left my small 110 camera on a table and when I went to retrieve it, it was gone. So Gary and I walked to the shopping mall in the heat -- 35 Celcius in the day which is around 100 degrees Fahrenheit. I bought a cheap 110 camera there and decided to get more money with my credit card at the nearby Bank of America. Little did I know what a problem that would be. It turned out that the strip on my card was worn out. So the bank had to do the transaction through my bank in Toronto by hand marking the card number. They sent it to my bank in Toronto who, it turned out, had its first new Manager in 20 years. He rejected my request for funds, even though I had money in my account. I even tried using my Interbank card and they said I could not use it as I was at my credit limit on my card, which was true. So I walked out of the bank and went back to the hotel and borrowed money from two people whom I repaid when I got back to Toronto. It was very embarrassing, to say the least.

What made it more difficult was that I had left my cheque book in Toronto and ran out of traveller's cheques in Tucson.

So, there I was with borrowed money back at the hotel with a new camera. As I walked into the lobby, I was told they had found my old camera. I figured I would take back the camera I had just bought, but I had lost the receipt for it so that meant I could not get my money back.

I had planned to interview a few people at the Congress and to tape at least one speech with my microcassette recorder. I had not used it for several years and forgot which of the unmarked buttons to push to record. I spent much time doing, I thought, interviews. Later on, I decided to play back one of the tapes and found I had not taped anything. Meanwhile, I managed to drop the recorder and break the lead on the audiotape inside which meant I could not use it again. I'd another audiotape which I bought at a store on a shopping excursion with a young lady and A.J. Gevaerd, so I inserted the new tape. By the time this was done, it was the last day of the Congress.

It gets more exciting as we go along, doesn't it?

Let's look at what happened in terms of my speech next. It was set for mid-afternoon of the second day, just after the one by Tony Dodd. I was all set to deliver it, when I chanced to come across Antonio Huneus and Roberto Pinotti in the midst of discussing UFOs with Salvador Freixedo in the restaurant area of the Holiday Inn. After listening to a history of ufology in Italy from Pinotti, I thought I would not have a chance to talk to him again as he said he would be very busy. It was now Friday night.

Pinotti suddenly asked me if I would mind exchanging my day and time of speaking with his as he wanted to spend the 7th travelling to Dulce and Roswell, New Mexico to interview a few people there. I agreed. He would speak on May 4 and I on May 7.

On the 6th at 9:00 p.m., Stevens spread the word amongst the speakers that there would be a meeting of speakers at 11:00 pm. that night, the night before I was to speak. He gave us an agenda for the meeting. It was so extensive that it appeared it would last some time into the morning, which it did -- 1:30 to be exact. He did not tell us that three video cameras would be trained on us during the meeting. The day before, I had accidentally cut my nose and I tried to stifle the bleeding. It didn't quite cover up the red mark which made it look as though I had been drinking. I was really not ready to be on TV. I could not cover the mark on my nose as there was no drugstore where I could buy anything which would do the job. We were in the wilds of Arizona and, unlike Toronto's hotels, there were no drugstores in the hotel.

Only half of the speakers came to the meeting. During the meeting, we had to think of a question of major importance about UFOs, write it out and give it to Stevens who, in turn, would give it to the person to whom the question was addressed. Each participant had to introduce him or herself and make a statement of his/her beliefs about UFOs. Since there were 15 people there, this took some time. Several people had to use translators. We were gathered around a long table in a room with no air conditioning for 2 1/2 hours. This was not conducive to clear thinking, much less profound statements on the subject. So, there I was, with the video cameras focussed on me during my statement with my red-dened nose. Instead of talking about my ufological background, I talked too much about my journalism and family business background.

Speaking of backgrounds, each speaker had to

send Stevens a 1,000 word biography for publication. They were not published, nor were our speeches which had to be mailed in well in advance of the Congress.

What angered me most was that the speech by Terziski, which, it turned out, preceded mine on the final day, went two hours overtime. That meant that I ended up speaking at noon, when most people were eating lunch. When my speech began there were about 60 people present. By the time I had finished, there were only 20 left. The room held 500.

I nearly did not make the speech. I was so upset at the timing, that I actually said to one person in the hallway that I would not speak at lunch hour, but I changed my mind.

The noon-hour speech lacked something that all the other speakers had -- an introduction. I had to introduce myself.

The speakers were urged at the last hour meeting to have another meeting in 1992 -- this one in Moscow. I not only would not attend such a meeting if Stevens ran it, but I would not attend any Congress if he ran it.

One of the main benefits of the Congress, and

there were a few, was meeting some of the people in the UFO field and mingling with the audience at the speeches. The persons who had tables where they sold goods were also interesting.

I personally became friends with a few people there, although the friendship would have to continue by letter from that point onward. Among the really fine people I met was Gary Mann of Clifton, New Jersey, a methods engineer who is also involved with paraphysical or psychic research. I lent him my new 110 camera for a short time. He wrote back to me asking me to send him the negatives and the glossy prints of the pictures he took with it. Since I did not follow him around to see what he took pictures of, I do not know what to send him. Many of the photos did not come out on one roll of film, which is probably the one he used. I hope I can manage to find the few that did come out all right.

Several people including Gary bought me dinner there. (Wendelle Stevens promised to pay for all my meals there, but has not reimbursed me yet for them.) Jack Malin, Colonel Robert O. Dean and Karoly Hargitai, the latter two speakers there, were among those who paid for my dinners. Paul Davids, a Bulletin subscriber from Los Angeles, was most generous, buying me two meals.

The food at the two hotels was excellent. However, I did manage to eat out at one very fine steak restaurant with Paul Davids and with Gary Mann at a Mexican restaurant, Pancho's. It was across from the Hilton, and was a modern cafeteria-style place, brightly lit, with an enormous menu, authentic Mexican food and music, all of high quality and with large portions.

I spent a lot of time wandering around the various displays on the tables. Many of these were booksellers, such as co-host Pat Marcattilio, Bob Girard of Arcturus Book Service, William Hamilton III and the people of Genesis III Publications who seemed to have a different person manning the table every day.

It was also an opportunity to meet some of the ladies involved in the UFO and contactee field. Among these was Shirlé Klein-Carsh of Surrey, British Columbia, Canada, who brought along a gold tablet with odd lettering on it. We'll have more about here in another issue of the Bulletin. She was a speaker there.

Others I met were the beautiful wife of Lee Elders, Brit, who lives in Monds Park, Arizona; the extremely intelligent and good-looking Linda Moulton Howe of Huntingdon Valley, Pennsylvania; one Israeli-American lady who shall remain anonymous; Gail, an abductee with whom I had instant rapport; and Jan Goldenberg of Warren, New Jersey, U.S.A., who owns New Eyes Studios, a recording company.

There were all sorts of souvenirs on sale -- yo-yo's with photos of UFOs and researchers on the sides, sculptures and paintings of aliens and UFOs -- in fact, one whole room of paintings for sale, pins, buttons, T-shirts, caps, audiotapes, videotapes, miniature gold pyramids, a vibrating message table which moved to music, and through it all moved a small but enthusiastic crowd of people eager to take with them something to remind them of the reality of UFOs.
