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**One Member's Opinion  
of a Recent Book on UFOlogy  
- Book Review -**

There have been many authors in UFOlogy who have written some very impressive works. What impresses me is the amount of information they have included, and how well it fits into this big puzzle we are constantly trying to solve.

Well, if there is one author who has found more pieces to the puzzle, his name is Timothy Good. I've read two of his books, Above Top Secret and Alien Liaison. Above Top Secret is a very long and detailed book, discussing UFOs in relation to the military all over the world, dating back to World War I. He jumps through history with cases that have happened on every continent. Though the book is long, it is worth reading.

However, his latest book is very different. It is shorter, easy reading, and every page has information that fascinated me. One could read it in a day and still go back to it again and be amazed.

It starts off similarly to Above Top Secret, describing encounters between pilots and UFOs. Then the author shifts to cattle mutilations. Timothy Good has done his homework on this topic. He provides a lot of information on the mutilations, some of it old and some of it quite new.

The author talks about what has been going on in the last few years and about the government cover-up. I don't think he has been provided with any disinformation. If there is any, it's very little, because the events in the book are backed up by what I consider some very legitimate people.

We are lucky to read about Robert Lazar, a scientist who is living proof, in my opinion, that the U.S. Government is test flying alien space craft. He describes the mysterious area in Nevada known as S-4 where he claimed to have worked on very advanced propulsion systems. This segment is saved for the last half of the book. The information that comes before it is what keeps you turning those pages.

Another interesting topic in the book is the theory that extra-terrestrials may be co-operating or working with the U.S. Government in some way. He does not suggest that this is an evil joint force, but he does point out that governments have to have some security and secrecy. Good also shows that his contacts in the military and the UFO field have fine investigative abilities. Special projects are discussed, ones that the U.S. Government is supposedly now working on and has been working on for some time.

This book covers all bases in UFOlogy. This is a book your friend should read. You know, the one who thinks you're a little crazy because of your fascination with UFOs. If you haven't read this book, get it and read it. It quenches the thirst for more information, but not for long, as the thirst for knowledge is never-ending in the field of UFOlogy.



**UFO News Snippets From India**

Our member in India recently sent a few short items about UFO reports in that country.

Our member there has a BSc in chemistry. His name is a long one compared to Western names. It is Sabapathy Santhanakrishnan. He is a Tamil who lives in a town called Madurai in the state of Tamil Nadu.

He says there was a UFO reported as strange lights near a village whom he did not

name, but which is 100 kilometres from Madurai. This happened "some years back," he says. Another sighting was in a village in North India, where a flying object took a roof off a house.

On the country's national TV network, they have shown the old series, Project Blue Book. At the time, he says, there were some sightings in New Delhi, but these were years ago and he says there have been no UFO reports since then.

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**Green Beam Seen in Toronto Area by Dozen Observers**

At least a dozen people reported an odd aerial sight in Toronto, Ontario, Canada recently.

On the night of February 5, 1992, near the corner of Dufferin and Steeles at the city limits, a "fluorescent pencil-thin green light shone through the clouds." This beam of light was all that was seen — there was no UFO reported.

The beam was seen in a sky that was partly cloudy. It looked about three inches long at arm's length, i.e. if you held your arm out and put the apparent length of it between your thumb and forefinger. The beam faded out when clouds seemed to cover it, according to one lady. They watched it for 45 minutes, from about 10:50 or 10:55 pm onward. Both ladies called CUFORN on the same night, independently. We told the second caller about the first, after she had given us her report. We are not revealing the names of these two observers at this time.

Then, exactly one month later, we had reports of the same beam from a dozen people in the same general location. This time the sighting lasted from about 9:00 pm to 10:45 pm on March 5, 1992.

Reports were phoned in to CUFORN's

line. Tom and Lise Theofanous and your editor immediately went to the area, observed the beam and met with the people on the residential street below the beam. We were equipped with a 35mm camera, binoculars and a videocamera. We did not have infra-red or high speed film in the 35mm camera, and the lighting on the street was so bright that the videocamera did not pick up the beam at all. Pearson International Airport said the clouds were at 10,000 feet.

The first report came from Dennis Boyle, a resident of Thornhill, Ontario, who was watching, he said, with four of his friends. Then reports came in from Patricia Dawson, Bonnie Smith and Mary X (she did not want her name used). They are residents of the same street.

We contacted Downsview Air Force Base, who said one man had reported the beam. The lone military man on the base was the one who answered the phone. We'll be there April 5th.

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**New Video From Lazar**

Robert Lazar and his friend Gene Huff have produced a 40-minute video-tape which was recently purchased by your editor. It is entitled "The Lazar Tape and Excerpts from the Government Bible".

The tape consists of two sections. First of all, Lazar, who says he has degrees in physics and electronics, gives a lecture purporting to describe how a UFO propulsion system works. He claims to have worked on a full-size real UFO captured or lent to the U.S. Government. The UFO, along with eight other UFOs, is supposedly kept at Area S-4, which is southwest of Area 51 in Nevada. Both areas of the state are off limits to civilians and are guarded by camouflaged Delta Force troops with orders to shoot to kill anyone who tries to enter these areas without proper authorization and clearance.

The second part of the tape includes a very short interview of Dr. Edward Teller, a former member of the Manhattan Project, which developed the atomic bomb. Teller is supposedly a member of Majestic-12, the covert group which has been investigating UFOs for the U.S. Government since 1947.

The Lazar tape opens with him arriving in front of a camera in his sports car. It ends with him getting into the car and driving away along the highway in the Nevada desert.

The video-tape features some good colour graphics to illustrate what Lazar is talking about. Graphics are most welcome for the lecture part of the tape as Lazar is not the best person to lecture on the topic. He tends to vary his text between long sentences which can bore one and even put the viewer to sleep and bits of humour which hardly suit the topic. The humour does tend to keep one awake, however.

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## An Engineering View of Lazar's Anti-Gravity Physics

### Introduction

This author was asked by Larry Fenwick, editor of the CUFORN Bulletin, to review a recent video describing Robert Lazar's theories and purported observations. In this video, Lazar repeats previous claims that he witnessed tests of advanced "flying saucers" of extraterrestrial origin and took part in briefings describing their operation and mode of propulsion in a secret government facility in Nevada.

This paper will analyse some of the so-called "anti-gravitational physics" from a conventional engineering and physics perspective. As in most of these cases, the propounder of the theory tries to give it an air of respectability by invoking well-known and conventional ideas in the physical and engineering sciences as justification for the more speculative ideas. This is acceptable if the conclusions and inferences drawn follow a well-defined and rigorous development. If the development of the ideas is not rigorous, then there is no need to invoke conventional wisdom a priori. It is into this latter category that the anti-gravity theory of Lazar falls (hard).

For clarity, this brief examination will be divided into three sections: Borrowing from Conventional Physics, Problems with Lazar's Physics, and Engineering Problems. The first section will highlight the background ideas from mainstream physics, primarily General Relativity theory, on which Lazar tries to build his case. The second section identifies problems with "Lazar Physics" and points out where pure speculation takes over from conventional knowledge. The third section considers problems with trying to engineer the physical systems Lazar describes.

It is hoped that the level of understanding required to follow these arguments is the same as required to try to follow Lazar's thesis.

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### Borrowing from Conventional Physics

According to General Relativity, the three dimensional space we generally perceive can be coupled to a time dimension and called "Space-Time". This concept can now be given physical properties including viewing it as a 4-dimensional "fabric" which can be bent or warped. Space-time can also be perceived as enveloping all masses in the universe, as raisins in a plum pudding. These

masses, stars, planets, atomic particles, all have the property of causing the space-time fabric to bend, the amount of bend being a function of the mass involved. Since the measurement of distance is a function of the physical dimensions of the spatial portion of the fabric, bending the fabric will cause distance measurements to change. In fact, bending the fabric enough in the vicinity of our sun will cause the real distance to the nearby stars to increase.

Lazar seems to suggest that large masses (e.g. black holes) are the only way to bend the fabric of space-time (apart from his gravity waves). Two other methods are allowed by the theory, namely high charge density and spin, but he avoids mentioning these.

This bending would also cause light rays to follow curved paths around the object or spacecraft doing the bending, thus possibly rendering a craft invisible to outside observers, as Lazar explains.

The strong force which binds positively charged protons together in the nucleus of an atom is well known, although its cause and precise mechanism are not.

Lazar's description of transmutation of elements to more or less stable elements by bombarding these elements with protons is substantially correct. It is known that by doing so, new elements can and have been produced, up to atomic number (# of protons)  $Z=110$ . However, most only last (are stable for) fractions of a second. It is speculated by mainstream physicists that if atoms could be manufactured with  $Z=115$ , they might be stable enough to last days or years before decaying into lighter elements by radioactivity. This is pure speculation, however.

It is also known that in certain high-energy atomic interactions with bombarding particles, a mirror-image of normal matter can be produced in tiny amounts, called anti-matter. Upon colliding with atomic particles of normal matter, both particles annihilate each other with a tremendous release of energy, as Lazar points out.

These are the main points from conventional physics that Lazar uses to give the impression that what is to follow is not only reasonable but realizable.

## Problems with Lazar's Physics

It is hard to conceive of the method whereby Lazar proposes to decrease the distance from our solar system to the nearby stars by bending space-time in the manner described. The simulation involving the fishing net model of space-time Lazar uses to demonstrate decreasing distance is at odds with General Relativity's description of actions near large gravitational fields.

So far there has been no hint that either anti-matter or gravitational waves will emanate from element  $Z=115$  when bombarded by protons. If this were the case, one might expect to have seen some tendency to do this in the higher  $Z$  elements, such as those above  $Z=100$ . Why will this suddenly occur at  $Z=115$  and nowhere else?

Most physicists agree that gravity, like other fields such as electromagnetism, displays complementary aspects of a particle-like and a wave-like nature depending upon the particular situation. Lazar's statement that gravity is only a wave with no particulate aspect is not supported by any evidence as far as conventional physics is concerned. Lazar also fails to mention those physicists who consider gravity to be neither waves or particles but merely special arrangements of electromagnetic fields or manifestations of a much more subtle energy form.

Lazar makes the correspondence between the strong nuclear force and what he calls "Gravity A". There is no evidence for this correspondence. Even if the strong nuclear force could be stimulated to reach outside the boundary of an atom as claimed by Lazar, there is no indication that it would act like normal gravity ("Gravity B") and/or bend the fabric of space-time. Just because a force is attractive doesn't mean it is gravity. The only slight hint that there are different "forms" of gravity is in the discovery of the so-called "5th Force", a slight repulsive force much smaller than normal gravity.

Lazar never clarifies how the same element  $Z=115$ , when bombarded with protons, can simultaneously release anti-matter and gravitational waves. Presumably, the proton energy must be astronomical to perform just one of these feats. There is a terrible energy imbalance between available proton energy and that energy required to bend space-time, if General Relativity is to be believed.

If, as Lazar claims, element  $Z=115$  is only found on certain stars whose density and mass are of a certain critical size, why has it not shown up on spectroscopic images of stars, of which we on Earth have catalogued many thousands?

Lazar gives no indication of why it follows that mechanically directing these hypothetical gravity waves in a certain spatial orientation will therefore bend the space-time fabric in the required direction and thus foreshorten the distance in that direction. There is no evidence from General Relativity that such bendings can be made anisotropically (i.e.: in a preferred direction).



### Engineering Problems

Lazar claims that since gravity waves are produced by  $Z=115$  (Gravity A), they can be amplified and directed. Because cosmological gravity is a function of masses such as stars and planets, the wave-like nature of gravity can have an almost infinite set of frequencies ascribed to it. This is due to the near-infinite variety of speeds and directions of all the masses in the universe relative to one another. For effective "anti-gravity" propulsion of the type described by Lazar, the bandwidth (capacity to amplify many frequencies) of such gravity wave amplifiers would have to be so large that we could not hope to engineer any such amplification scheme.

An amplifier must be able to distinguish what is being amplified from the power required to amplify whatever is being amplified. Since gravity penetrates all matter, the amplifiers must be constructed from non-matter, an unlikely situation. The directing of such waves from an amplifier via some antenna or gravity radiator is even more likely.

Even if such amplifiers and radiators were realizable, why use element  $Z=115$  as the source? Why not design a super-high frequency oscillator to replace the hard-to-get element 115 (since it is only available on or in stars)?

If the scale of the anti-gravity, anti-matter "reactor" shown in the video is any indication, the likelihood of directing a super highly-energetic beam of protons up and around such a tightly-curved tube

without a super magnetic or electrostatic field is negligible. This is assuming there is room in the lower deck of the craft to produce such a beam.

The most probable direction of anti-matter particles (likely anti-protons) emanating from  $Z=115$  upon bombardment by high-energy protons is parallel to the incoming proton beam. By some magic, Lazar's reactor is able to bend the anti-matter beam 90 degrees downward. On Earth, huge magnetic fields are required to keep anti-matter from touching the walls of any (normal-matter) container it is in so as not to annihilate prematurely. These are nowhere in evidence in Lazar's model.

Apparently the anti-matter particles are directed downward through a high vacuum and directly onto a "gaseous target" where they annihilate and heat is created. Lazar fails to inform us how to keep the gaseous target from being sucked up into the high vacuum. The heat so created is fed via the gas to a 100% efficient thermionic heat-to-electricity converter, thus completely skirting Carnot's heat-cycle thermodynamic law. The end-product, electricity, is supposedly used to power the gravity wave amplifiers (see above). Surely beings as advanced as those who designed this system would have found a better way of creating the necessary energy to drive the system.



### Summary

It appears to this author that the anti-gravity physics of Robert Lazar as outlined in his recent video is either an attempt to garner admiration and perhaps a job or else it is part of the larger disinformation campaign which seems to shroud such investigations. The slick delivery and smooth style with which the lecture was presented plus the mixing of conventional physics and wild speculation tends to indicate the latter option. It is another in a long series of deviations thrown at serious researchers to prevent them from arriving at the truth about the phenomenon. As usual, the time and effort wasted trying to find any hidden nuggets of real, novel information are much greater than the potential rewards of such a find, as is typical of disinformation strategies. However, in this case, I cannot find any hidden nuggets no matter how hard I look.

## Four Foreign Reports Sent in by Member

Member Victor Lourenco of Toronto recently sent us four summaries of foreign sightings which appeared in newspapers in his native land of Portugal. The first two were sent to him by the Portuguese Association for UFO Research; the others are from his personal newspaper clipping files.

### STRANGE LIGHT OVER MERTOLA

According to the Lisbon paper, Publico, several people in the city of Mertola saw "a very bright light moving at a very high speed" across the sky on August 21, 1990 at 11:40 pm. The paper stated that the local National Guardsmen who patrol the area were unaware of any reports of the observation. Nor was any report sent to the Portuguese Air Force, according to public relations officer, Silva Coelho.

Miguel Rego, former journalist with the Diario do Alentejo, along with five other witnesses, observed what they described as a "concentrated yellowish light that hovered for a while and exploded later in a multiple light formation."

Izequiel Cabrita, director of the Astronomic Observatory in Lisbon, reported that he had no knowledge of unusual lights in the sky.

Germano Vaz, a professional photographer and film producer, Fernanda Valadas, Rute Colaco and her sister all reported having seen several lights in a pentagon formation making a strange noise.

At 8:30 am on September 14, 1990, another strange aerial object was seen in Portugal, according to the newspaper Jornal de Noticias of the city of Oporto. Several people in Alfena in the province of Valongo saw a strange object which was photographed by Manuel Gomes de Moura.

### SOVIET JET DISAPPEARS

The Diario de Noticias newspaper of Lisbon reported a UFO event which occurred on May 17, 1991 at an unspecified time of night. According to Novosti Press Agency, a Soviet jet fighter was lost during a reconnaissance mission to chase a UFO. The UFO was seen by several guards in the Soviet

Pacific Fleet. No exact location was given. A Soviet Navy spokesman reported that it was not the first time that a jet vanished when tracking a UFO.

### A ROUND ONE IN BELGIUM

Belgium, which has been the site of a major flap of sightings in the past two years, was the location of another report in Diario de Noticias.

On October 19, 1992, according to several radio stations in Brussels, hundreds of people witnessed a circular UFO. The object was detected by two Belgium Air Force F-16's on their radar screens. When the jets tried to chase the object, it took off at a very high speed.

### Potential Visitor in Edmonton

A Russian immigrant to Canada, whom we will call Lavrenti, telephoned CUFORN Bulletin Editor Larry Fenwick on February 14, 1992, to seek answers to some events in his past which he said might be related to the UFO phenomenon.

He said he has done a bit of reading of UFO literature since these events, in order to find out more, but felt that a UFO group might be of further aid to him. So when he saw the business listing for CUFORN in the Toronto phone book, he called. Although his English was a bit accented and his words halting, he was able to make himself understood.

He was particularly interested in finding out the meaning of what he said was a dream. This dream, he said, came to him one night about seven years ago when he was living in Edmonton, Alberta. (Edmonton has a moderate-sized Russian born population). He said he saw odd lights in his bedroom window and some figures beside his bed, so he is not sure if it was a dream or was real. He felt paralysed and found himself on a different part of the bed when he awoke from the dream. It is so vague that he thinks hypnosis might bring out the truth about it. CUFORN hopes to pursue the case and we will keep you informed of any developments, if any occur.

Firstly I would like to mention that it has been a pleasure being a member of CUFORN. It has definitely increased my awareness of the UFO field as well as gaining some notable contacts. Although for the past year I have been quite puzzled about specific aspects of the UFO field; my ongoing contacts with my so-called informant have ceased. Perhaps your vast knowledge in this area can provide the answers to finally relieve me of this push to find out what's going on. Yes, I've been told that the reason behind the abduction is that alien beings are systematically choosing people to have an implant placed in the pineal gland. But that doesn't take away the burden of not having certain answers.

Although unproven, my "given" knowledge of the future has taken its toll on me; waiting patiently for an event that may perhaps change my life. It is reassuring that 1992 has finally arrived. I thought you might be interested in possible publishing this short article. After Louie's August 11th experience, I went over and talked to him. He still feels he is not quite ready to go through regression on this experience, but I feel he is getting closer.

It was in May of 1991 that I first met Louie Turi who subsequently called me and related a UFO experience he had earlier. A month or so later I heard him at a UFO lecture in Escondido, California where he went into more detail. After a long silence he is now beginning to talk about his experiences publicly.

### First Experience

Louie Turi had his first UFO experience in Pont Saint-Espri, France when he was 8 years old. Louie was in bed trying to go to sleep when he felt something touch his foot; at first he thought it might have been the cat, but how wrong he was. He was startled to see six small, hairy, monkey-like dwarfs with black eyes and long hair just a few inches from his face. They had apparently pulled the covers from his head for the purpose of putting him into some kind of trance. Even under hypnosis Louie cannot recall more details of the events that night. What is interesting is that there were reported sightings of hairy dwarfs in France in 1954, in Venezuela in 1964 and in South America at later dates.

Needless to say, since this encounter Louie has been scared of the dark and usually sleeps with the light on. This was a frightening experience for a young lad and it has left a strong impression on him.

### Second Experience

Louie's second experience occurred in 1970 in Florac, France when he was 20 years old while travelling in the Alps. His sister had missed the bus which would have taken her 150 miles to her job. Louie agreed to take her and after driving quite some time became unsure of the way. At about 4:30 pm they came upon an inn that, to their surprise, was open. They seated themselves at the counter and ordered coffee and a coke. Next to them sat a very large

man, about seven feet tall, very muscular, with short light brown hair who engaged in a strange card game in which the man would stare telepathically and guess the card Louie had received. Soon Louie developed a headache and he excused himself to go to the bathroom. On the way he noticed two other men who looked just like the man with whom he was playing cards. He was gone only a couple of minutes and when he came out the men were gone. He looked outside but saw no one or any cars leaving the place. Louie's headache continued for two weeks; his sister refuses to talk about the experience.

These men Louie met could be from an extraterrestrial group called the Tall Blondes or Nordics who are usually about seven feet tall and can have long or short hair. They have been seen all over the world since the 1950's, and most recently in the Soviet Union, where they have been making contacts with some of the inhabitants.

### Third Experience

On November 11th, 1981 about 10:30 pm Louie and his brother left the farm where they were staying to drive into the town where they both worked at a nightclub. While still on a secondary dirt road they saw two lights in the distance which looked very much like car headlights. But as the lights came closer they turned out to be a large disc-shaped object. As the object passed over the car the engine stopped. Ignoring his brother's caution, Louie got out of the car to take a closer look. He started to go under the craft which was now located to the side of the car and about twenty feet overhead. There were coloured lights on the bottom of the craft: red, blue, yellow and green. Louie watched with amazement for several minutes before the craft slowly glided away. He estimated the size of the craft to be about 100 to 125 feet in diameter. The top of the craft was not visible.

Louie and his brother did not seem to have any after-effects from this experience. The same type of experience, a Close Encounter of the First Kind, has been reported a number of times at various places in the world. I personally have met three other people recently who have experienced a similar encounter.

### Fourth Experience

This experience took place recently on August 11th, 1991. Louie and his wife were on their way to a function in Anaheim, California at a Marriott Hotel. They left Oceanside, about an hour's drive away, at about 7:50 am travelling north on Highway 5. Sometime before their arrival they seem to have experienced a period of missing time; the last thing they remember is the exit for Jamboree Road near Tustin. The next thing they recall is some graffiti along the walls of the freeway and then an exit for the Los Angeles Zoo in Glendale where they proceeded to stop. It was then 9:00 am; both were bewildered and confused and they started back to Oceanside.

The total miles from the Los Angeles Zoo to Oceanside is 98 miles which was driven in one hour and ten minutes, excellent time for L.A. traffic. The Jamboree Road exit is just about half way to the L.A. Zoo exit, around 47 to 49 miles. This type of missing time experience while driving is not uncommon among abductees and contactees but a missing time experience of 50 miles is quite unusual. It is interesting to note that this experience occurred three days before his first UFO lecture in Escondido, California.

Hopefully more will emerge out of what I think is a very interesting UFO case. Louie Turi is planning to undergo hypnotic regression in the near future which may reveal more of what occurred in his latest experience.

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
